STIFEL NICOLAUS AND THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA

The City of West Allis lost 55 million dollars (approximately) in a bad investment, given bad advice by the Stifel Nicolaus investment firm and the Royal Bank of Canada. West Allis sued the above entities and eventually won, but it took many years to reclaim their losses.

This occurred on or about 2007-2008 which is largely the reason the police were writing fraudulent tickets. The corruption also permeated the inspectors of various departments. High positions in offices of Administration, Police Department cashiers (at least one) and the City Attorney's Office. Also, individual employees took it upon themselves to "get" and report citizens real and false claims of wrongdoing and ordinance violations.

The basis of this lawsuit is also about discrimination for the main people that were targeted are those with criminal records or as least arrest records. Also those who are considered "eccentric or unusual" like Dean O'Connor, an Astrologer for thirty-one years.

West Allis even tried to pass a "Fortune Telling" ordinance, which received two yes votes despite objections by the City Attorney's Office who rejected the passing of the ordinance. Two voting members also abstained.

I accidentally met a man who was fined \$450.00 for having a picnic bench in his back yard (James Luell). As this is written there has been a picnic bench five houses to my south (2114 South 75th Street) for at least twenty years! Next to 2114 South 75th Street. The City of West Allis picks and chooses who they enforce ordinances against and who they don't. In this case, I don't think there is an ordinance against picnic benches.

There is another man who I know personally who left work at 6:00 A.M. daily. After he arrived home he went out a few minutes later and there was a parking ticket on his car. He called the police to no avail. He told them he doesn't leave work until 6:00 A.M. Another instance this same man (Roger Haugen) went outside during the overnight park hours (3:00-6:00 A.M.) (this was on a day he was off from work) and a West Allis Police Officer was putting a ticket on his windshield. He had a parking permit and was on the right side of the street; he objected to the Officer who tore the ticket up. Yet six other cars legally parked had tickets on his street. The Officer left those tickets on those cars!

The new accountability hotline issue of this quarterly newsletter is an ironclad admission of the theft, fraud, abuse and wrongdoing being perpetrated by the City of West Allis, especially from 2007 to 2010!

#1 On May 19, 1973, I was detained in an alley on 75th and Becher by a West Allis police officer, and then the police car pulled up, and an Officer Yanke reached in my coat pocket from behind me and pulled out a bag of marijuana.

In September of 1973, the case was dismissed by Judge Max Raskin because of an illegal search and seizure.

Then on November 30, 1973, I was driving west on 71st and Mitchell during a rain and ice storm on easily one of the slipperiest roads I've ever encountered. I was slowing down and driving very slowly (5-6 mph), and my car kept sliding and sliding for nearly one block and very slightly tapped a car stopped at 71st and Mitchell. The dent was about three inches high and two inches wide, about ¼ to 3/8 inches deep.

The owner of the car insisted on calling the police, but I kept insisting there wasn't \$200 damage between the two cars (the law at the time), but he insisted on calling the police.

When the police arrived, the same Officer Yanke bellered, "Do you know how many accidents we have to respond to? You're wasting our time because of insignificant damage." I even told the person I hit to open the trunk and claimed I could pop the dent out with my fingers; he refused.

And then Officer Yanke, when he realized who I was, talked to the other driver for 4-5 minutes and kept looking over at me. Then he asked me to sit in his patrol car. And the first thing he asked, "Was I on something?" He questioned me for about fifteen minutes and proceeded to write me a six-point, \$200 ticket. In today's money, factoring in inflation, that's equivalent to \$700 and half of my license (6 points).

I contested the ticket in court, and when I explained the story to the judge and looked at Officer Yanke, and Yanke shrugged his shoulders and said nothing, the judge dismissed the ticket. The plan to get Dean O'Connor and make his life miserable was now developing.

#2 In 1974, I started doing astrology horoscope readings at a business I co-owned with my mother, The House of Scorpio, 5924 W. Burnham. Then in approximately 1979-1980, the City of West Allis conducted hearings to outlaw "fortune telling."

This was based on an individual who allegedly filed a complaint that initiated the hearings, and unbelievably the person was a resident of Milwaukee, not West Allis. In violation of law, one must be a resident of the city that attempts to pass an ordinance into law.

I never attended the hearings, which were many, and I was told by those who did speak on behalf of astrology that they would never be able to pass the ordinance because it was not enforceable and explained that the City of West Allis would have to ban the *Milwaukee Journal/Sentinel* newspapers which contained horoscopes, and radio stations would not be allowed to broadcast weather predictions "which amounts to fortune telling." Amazingly enough, two West Allis aldermen voted in favor of passing it. The City Attorney's summary was identical to my explanation, that of being unenforceable due to newspaper horoscopes and weather predictions and television and radio weather predictions. Once again, the plan to get Dean O'Connor was continuing.

#3 In 1986, I was parked on 54th and Burnham across from the business I owned with my mother. My car was across from my store on Burnham for about an hour.

Then I left my car and returned about an hour later. After about 30 minutes at the store, I left again around 1 ½- 2 hours later. I was talking to my mother on the phone, and she told me the West Allis police called and told her to tell me to move my car, or they would give me a ticket. She asked the officer where he was calling from, and he told her the police station.

#4 In April 1989, I rented a small store at 1904 South 60th Street across the street and around the corner from the business I owned at 5924 W. Burnham (The House of Scorpio).

So I applied for a license and an occupancy permit. Within a week, all of the inspectors came to visit my future business and do their inspections.

About two weeks passed, and I started calling various inspectors and/or their offices and was told my occupancy permit and license was soon forthcoming. Another 2 weeks passed (approximately), and I made more calls, still nothing forthcoming. While talking to one of the fire department inspectors, he informed me that, "I should just open my business anyway; that's what everyone does." I had already now been waiting approximately two months after all of the inspectors did the inspecting duties. This was about the end of June to early July (1989) at this point.

Then on July 12th or 13th, 1989, I received a summons to appear in court on July 26, 1989, for failing to obtain a license prior to opening. Incidentally, I had already paid three months rent by this time, totaling \$450.00.

If I failed to appear in court on July 26, 1989, at 4:00 p.m., a warrant for my arrest would be issued.

The third page of my court summons from the City of West Allis stated, "This complaint is based upon personal knowledge and belief of the undersigned complainant and upon his inspection of the records maintained by the City of West Allis. Dated on July 10, 1989, and signed by Scott Post, Assistant City Attorney."

Then I immediately made calls to all of the departments who do their inspections. An inspector of the fire department told me the ok'd inspection by the department hadn't been turned in by Kurt Driscoll. It was still lying on his desk. Seven to eight weeks after he completed his inspection. Kurt Driscoll was the person who did my inspection from the fire department. Remember because of this negligence, intentional or otherwise, it already cost me \$450.00. And then after an inspector told me to, "Open my store anyway; that's what everybody does," I am sent a summons where I being threatened of being arrested.

#5 In 1990 (might have been 1991), being a coin dealer, I attended a coin show at Mecca where I met a husband and wife from Racine. They had quantities of Buffalo nickels and Mercury dimes (1916-1945). They went to every coin dealer at Mecca and weren't willing to sell because of unsatisfactory offers.

So I approached them asking what their top offer was. I said if I could briefly look through the coins, I most likely could give them 20-30% more money.

So we arranged for them to come back the next day and meet at my coin shop.

As I was looking through the coins, more than 1000 coins, I asked if they went through the coins and took some of the most valuable ones out. They claimed they did not.

I gave them \$1000 for the coins in check form. When going through them after they went home with my check to Racine, I called them after. It appeared they "cherry picked" a lot of the more valuable ones. We disagreed in our opinions of what they took out. All I asked for was for them to return \$100 or 10%. They refused. Then I said okay, just send me \$50 (or 5%) of what I gave them. This was extremely reasonable on my part. They said no, so I stopped payment on the check. (It was Sunday, so obviously their bank was closed on Sunday, but mine wasn't (Tri-City).

They threatened to go to the West Allis City Attorney, so they drove from Racine back to the Milwaukee area for now the third time.

The West Allis City Attorney concluded it was a civil matter, and his office would not be getting involved, not for a \$50 disagreement in a \$1000 business deal. So the Racine couple two days later drove back a fourth time to talk to a different City Attorney; he came to the same conclusion.

Then a couple of days later, they went to the West Allis police and told their story. So the Racine couple went to the City Attorney with the police, and the City Attorney changed his mind, and they sent me a summons to appear in court.

When I called the City Attorney, he told me the Racine couple drove to Milwaukee County five times.

So obviously, the West Allis Police changed the City Attorney's mind based on what? Not what I did, nor the merits of the case, but who I was and what my lifestyle was. The pot dealer who was arrested when I was twenty-one, but not convicted and a practicing astrologer.

Incidentally, the Racine couple drove to the Milwaukee area from Racine five times in their brand new Lincoln Town Car for \$50.00, plus they lied to me about their coin hoard. I wanted the \$50.00 reduction based on principle, not what \$50.00 did for me.

It took over two years to sell the coins for virtually no profit.

At my court date, I retained the imminent Dennis Coffey who told me he would represent me for one dollar. Probably because I sent his law firm twenty-five to thirty clients over the years. (Coffey, Coffey & Gerahty)

And lastly, a City Attorney walked in my coin shop/book store one day before I was told the city had changed their mind and would pursue me legally and criminally, and he asked if I had any Buffalo nickels and Mercury dimes for sale; I said yes. Then he looked at my shoes, my pants, and my shirt and immediately turned to leave. I was wearing sneakers, blue jeans, and a T-shirt with a rock group on it. The next day a summons was drawn up.

The Racine couple came armed with the West Allis police to the City Attorney's office, and he changed his mind to pursue my legally.

The West Allis police convinced the City Attorney to change his decision on the coin matter, and prior to the decision change, the City Attorney turned down the Racine couple in two separate instances on two separate days.

The police did the thinking for the City Attorney to get him to change his decision.

#6 On September 3, 1994, my wife and I returned from a trip to Door County, Wisconsin, when I became convinced there was a gas leak in my business at 5924 W. Burnham, so I called the gas company to notify the West Allis fire department. When the fire department arrived, they said they discovered two leaks.

Also, additional in my trip to Door County, the cottage my wife and I rented had a propane gas leak. We walked into a propane leak.

After about an hour and a half, I had serious breathing problems. Then I spent about an hour on the floor soaking wet from perspiring with tremendous breathing problems.

So again, the day came back as I walked into two gas leaks in my business.

When the fire department came, they parked their huge truck (with its engine running, as per procedure). Since the store had two gas leaks, the doors were open. So this black smoke was rolling into my store. I asked the fire department employee (Dick Bergopher) if he could move the truck across the street, and he said no! I became frustrated and upset and exclaimed in a raised voice, "Just move the damn truck; this exhaust is toxic!" Then firefighter Bergopher said in a nasty voice that he was going to have the police arrest me when this was over. The officer was standing in my store right next to me, and the officer added that he was going to arrest me.

Over the next fifteen minutes or so, I apologized to the officer for something I didn't do. And Bergopher moved the truck across the street. I wasn't arrested.

#7 On September 12, 1998, two West Allis police undercover officers came in my store (The House of Scorpio/Milwaukee Coin Company). My wife was present, but I wasn't there.

They said there was a citizen complaint of marijuana smoking right there in the store when it was open to the public.

They wore their badges around their necks on a chain, had long hair and wore blue jeans.

They claimed they wanted to search the premises. My wife asked them to produce a search warrant. One of them replied, "If we have to wait to get a search warrant, we'll come back and all but destroy this place."

One of them said something like, what are you afraid of? My wife replied, "I guess I'm just a paranoid Pisces." And then one of the cops slammed his clenched fist into the open palm of his other hand, according to my wife. The cops left the store.

Two days later (Monday), I called the police station and expressed my displeasure to the Deputy Chief Dunbar (with whom I had grown up, and was a childhood playmate of mine and a friend over the years).

#8 My mother and I were the co-owners of the House of Scorpio book store. In 1987, my future wife bought my mother's half of the business. The owner of the building where we rented was owned by Peter Agnos.

Mr. Agnos started calling my mother because my wife and I were behind on the rent. Agnos was making threats to my mother that if she didn't pay the rent, he

would evict us. He was incessant in his pursuit of the rent money. He also threatened to take her to court to collect money that her son owed him.

I filed a complaint with the city, claiming he was perpetrating extortion. The definition of extortion in all dictionaries is “threats made in an attempt to collect money.” I talked to Deputy Chief Dunbar, and he said he would send a police investigator to interview me and then Agnos

The police and the City Attorney did nothing. The City of West Allis was not about to side with an astrologer and a person (me) who had a previous drug arrest.

The next time I saw Agnos, he was outside near the building, and he looked visibly upset, so apparently he didn't appreciate being talked to and investigated by the police. Unbelievably so, Mr. Agnos took my mother to circuit court to collect money that I owed her.

Talking to a lawyer, I knew, the judge who presided in this matter of Agnos vs. Muriel O'Connor was brought out of retirement and was very elderly. This lawyer also told me this particular judge was not mentally fit to be on the bench. He described him as “not playing with a full deck.”

Sure enough, he said “My mother gave me birth and brought me into this world, and therefore is legally responsible for my debts.” I was 45 years old at this time. So apparently this lawyer I talked to was correct in his description of the judge.

This is what happens when the City Attorney's office does do their “due diligence.” The City of West Allis was not about to side with a drug

arrested/astrologer and go against a big shot businessman who was probably worth at least 40-50 million dollars.

Because of the city's inaction on the Agnos matter of extortion, Agnos took her to court again in 2002, six years later. I enclosed a letter in this lawsuit from the Asterlin Law Office describing how it turned out.

#9 November 25, 2000, I was dating woman named Barbara Swieciak. She lived at the Oklahoma Townhomes, 112th and Oklahoma. Everything was going fine between us. One day in a phone conversation, she seemed depressed. I asked her what was going on. She said when she was young, her father molested her. Our conversation ended shortly after. I called her several times later; she didn't answer. I was going to a store five blocks away from her a couple hours later. I drove by her apartment. Her car was there. I called her 15-20 times over the next couple of hours, but no answer. About two hours later, I called maybe fifteen times in an hour or so.

Understandably I was worried. She was in a bad place when we started dating six weeks prior. She was going through a divorce for the second time. She was getting a divorce from the brother of her first husband. She lived with her twelve year old son who was severely emotionally upset. When he woke up late in the evening, he opened his bedroom door, and his mother and I were sitting on the sofa with my arm around her. He started hollering and screaming and kept opening and slamming his bedroom door. He did that perhaps 35 to 40 times and through himself on the floor crying and screaming and pounding the floor with his fists.

I mentioned this to paint a picture of her mental state. She mentioned her son got upset when anybody came over.

I thought perhaps she was sleeping, so I tossed a couple of pebbles off of her bedroom window. Then I went to her front door which was partially glass. There were stairs going up, and I could see her standing at the top of the stairs looking at me with the strangest expression on her face. Then perhaps intuition told me she called the police, so I left, drove out of her parking lot to go home. As I was leaving, two West Allis police cars came speeding into the parking lot as I passed them on the way out.

When I got home, I called her, and one of the police officers answered the phone. He began reaming me out for calling. I said I call every day. I told him she never told me not to call. The officer said my phone number showed up on her caller I.D. 53 times, and he didn't want me to call her anymore. I said why don't you ask her if she doesn't want me to call. Then he said if I call again, "I'm going to drive to your home and write you out a \$600 ticket.

The next day, Barbara came to my apartment knocking loudly on my door. She was in tears and apologetic. She said she does not know why she called the police. When talking to the officer, I expressed my concern for Barbara's well-being. He replied, "I talked to her, and she's OK."

#10 October 2007, two nights, I called overnight parking and received permission to park. I received two tickets. I called the police that same day. She checked the computer and said yes, I have record that you received permission both times, and I will remove the tickets. Weeks later I received late notices for

both tickets, \$30.00 each. I called again, and she said it doesn't show you ever received permission to park.

#II December 2007, I went to pay two tickets at the police station, and the cashier said I have eight unpaid parking tickets. The actual physical parking tickets were not in the file cabinet. She went to the other door to the next room and came back with the white computer printouts of the tickets. The officer never put the tickets on the car. She knew what was happening. She gave me I.D. numbers on the tickets (7digits). She wasn't happy so she only charged me \$20.00 each, totaling \$160.00. On March 30, 2016, I called the police department record's department. The lady refused to give me the I.D. numbers of the six phony tickets. We went round and round on the phone conversation. She probably knew it wouldn't be advantageous for the city if she gave me the information. I have not located the piece of paper she gave me with the six tickets being put on my car. I have it somewhere. This is when I was parking on a dead-end street (So. 80th).

One of the six phony tickets (not put on my car) I witnessed; I was driving behind a patrol heading to my other car, and when the patrolman got to So. 80th, he stopped (as he was heading west). He turned his head and looked to the left. My car was the only car on the block. It was 2:53 a.m. This obviously was prior to when overnight parking started. I was heading to move my car. It was when I was told there were six tickets the cashier could not find in the file cabinet. I then realized the officer in the patrol car was looking to see if my car was on the wrong side. He apparently had my license plate number written down or memorized.

I was driving a block behind him on my way to move my car, and I still had time. The conspiracy to get Dean O'Connor was escalating. The officer's badge number is 1258.

#12 February 6, 2008, there was a huge snowstorm. 15-16 inches of snow fell. I was parked on the wrong side of the street and received a parking ticket marked "wrong side." There were six other cars on this same wrong side, yet I was the only one to receive a ticket, which the word "complaint" was written on.

I thoroughly checked each of the other cars, no tickets. Enter the Goetschs, my next door neighbors who I have written about on a separate document enclosed in this lawsuit, entitled "The Margaret and Floren Goetsch factor." The Goetschs called the police and city inspector at least nine times in their effort to get me anyway they could. Why? Because Margaret Goetsch is an employee of the City of West Allis; she works at city hall.

When my mother was in failing health, Margaret used to come over and visit her on a daily basis for months. My mother once told me that Margaret Goetsch told her that the more tickets the police write out, the more fines the city collects, the better chance she has for getting a raise in pay.

The City of West Allis is legally bound for their employees' conduct when it engages in corrupt and malicious conduct toward the citizens of West Allis.

Event #13

August 15, 1998. A West Allis Police Officer came into my store (The House of Scorpio 59th & Burnham). I had a bookstore combined with a coin shop. There was a Milwaukee Coin Co. sign on the window. The detective asked if he could get the cards that people need to fill out to sell coins, metals, jewelry, etc. He also said that he just noticed my coin shop was here, then he said "you know there's hardly anybody ever comes here!" So obviously I was being watched (under surveillance) by the West Allis Police. This Event #12 precedes Event #7. See Event #7. When I received my precious metal license, I was never told I needed sellers to fill out cards. The lady at City Hall never mentioned this.

Event #14

I was moving from my apartment in Greenfield to an Apartment in Cudahy. My father was helping me move, I was telling my father about how the City of West Allis was out to get me on anything any way they could. He never heard is story before. As we pulled in to get one of the last loads, we just pulled up to the apartment. I just then finished my story and seconds later a West Allis squad car pulled right next to me! In Greenfield! This was at 3160 West American Drive. The Officer said "there had been a report of a stolen U-Haul truck" then as I was looking at the back of the truck he said "sure we should be able to identify the truck from the license plate" (as well as the I.D. number next to the plate) "but could you tell me where you are moving to and the address just to get more information on my investigation!" Up to this point I had not yet spoke. So I calculated the Officer already talked to a man at the U-Haul rental office. He had to. When I returned the truck to U-Haul to get my \$100 deposit back the clerk/owner of the U-Haul office said he didn't have any cash on him or in the register. It was also easy to tell he was visibly upset and mad towards me. I called four times in the next three weeks and he replied "I don't have the \$100!" After telling my father about the City out to get me (the Police, Inspectors and the City Attorney's) my father said "boy, you're sure right about the City of West Allis trying to get you!"

Event #15

February, 2008. My car was towed from 1900 Block of South 80th Street. I called the Police Station asking why they told me there was a snow emergency from 6:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. the next day. I arrived to move my car at 4:30 P.M., one and a half hours before the snow emergency, I found out from the tow yard it was towed at 2:30 P.M., 3 ½ hours before the deadline. The financially impoverished City of West Allis stole another \$150.00 from a citizen.

Event #16

April, 2008. I called for permission to park on South 74th Street. I received permission. I received a ticket. On it, it was written "on complaint sheet." I paid this ticket.

Event #17

I received parking ticket marked "no permit" on May 1, 2008 at 3:38 A.M. Officer B. Moethern(?) Employee #9475. I had a permit for April, 2008 which allows for legal parking on April 30 - May 1. On the ticket was written "Exp. Apr. Flat Tire, Ticketed 4/28." Officer #9475 knows very well that the evening of April 30 to the morning of May 1st is covered by an April parking permit. Why did he write expires April? Even though I was good for the April 30 P.M. to the May 1st A.M. Because the City of West Allis was out 55 million dollars in a bad investment, that's why. Not only couldn't the employees of West Allis ever get a raise in pay, there was considerable talk of West Allis being annexed by the City of Milwaukee. Remember, he not only wrote on the ticket Exp. Apr., but felt he needed to write Flat Tire. And "was ticketed on April 28" to somehow justify his behavior? I still have this ticket.

Event #18

October 9, 2007. I received a ticket for parking within 4 feet of a driveway. I measured the distance, it was 3 feet 10 ½ inches. On the ticket it said complaint. I could drive around West Allis and find perhaps 200 cars that are too close to fire hydrants, alleys or driveways. This is one of the multitude of reasons I'm labeling this lawsuit "discrimination." On virtually every event stated in this suit virtually no one else in West Allis is ticketed and fined for the exact same behavior.

Event #19

I received several parking tickets at the end of October, 2007 through early November, 2007, then November 14, 2007 I purchased parking permits for November and December of 2007. I was parking on a dead end street and didn't think the parking checker would go down that street since I almost always was the only car parked on either side of the street. Even I admit I violated the parking ordinance several times but the Officer didn't put eight tickets on the car (see Event #11). The police engaged in a far more worse conduct "Entrapment." He figured as long as I wasn't getting a parking permit he would give me tickets and not put them on the car and "Entrap Me" into getting more tickets! As after purchasing permits for November 2007, December 2007, and January 2008, he still wrote me tickets on November 25, 2007, December 2, 2007, and January 12, 2008. The January 12, 2008 ticket had complaint written on it! I have the receipts of the purchase of these parking permits. On the last three tickets he wrote said wrong side, the car was not on the wrong side; how stupid can a person be to keep parking on the wrong side? No one is that lazy to not move their car. As long as I kept receiving "bogus" tickets from the dishonest Police Officer, he figured he would keep writing them! Written by employee #1258.

Event #20

July 19, 2007. Received letter from City on cutting lawn. Had five days to do it from date on letter. Forestry crew came on the Fourth day. When one of the City employees approached the house to cut the grass, he said "what are we doing here, this grass isn't that high." Also, I had a vacuum cleaner on my back porch. One of the employees of West Allis emptied the

canister from the vacuum into a bag and put it in his truck. For the media people reading this lawsuit, who probably don't know, if the people working for the Police Department find any scraps of marijuana including seeds, they can get a search warrant and knock my door down. Also, I had a couple of hundred onion plants (chives) that were off of the lawn area not on the grass. They cut all those down too. And there were many flowers along the side of my house where no grass was growing, just flowers, they cut all of those down too. Nasty people exerting discrimination towards me.

Event #21

May, 2008. My car was parked on South 74th Street a block from my house. Where the Police put on a large orange sticker on it to move it in 72 hours or it will be towed. I called a towing business to tow it to Boucher on South 108th Street for repairs. When the tow person arrived, he called me and said there are two Police cars (two Officers) at the car saying the City is going to tow it. This was approximately 48 hours from the date and time written on the sticker. The tow driver said that the police said "we're taking it now." Since the tow truck driver sent by me was already there the police allowed him to tow it. A City deeply in debt with many of its employees cheating and pushing its citizens around.

Event #22

April 5, 2009. My car was towed from my property. It was parked next to my garage. Yes, I received a letter from the City, "Notice of Vehicle Condemnation" ordering me to remove it or it will be towed. On it was an orange sticker that read "This vehicle has been declared a public nuisance and has been condemned." N&S Towing charged me \$250 instead of \$150 because they said they had to use two tow trucks. One was described as a winch, that lifts the car up high in the air. Why the winch? Because there was a car directly across from my garage, a car with no license plates sitting there for over two years, and actually it was finally moved about nine months ago. This car, unregistered with no plates sat there for ten years! Right across from my car that was towed and disposed of (apparently). My car was eighteen feet from a similar car (unregistered with no plates). He (2141 South 74th Street) moved the car after ten years and immediately replaced it with another car. He doesn't drive (plates expired June, 2014). This event is hard, irrefutable evidence to a case of blatant discrimination. Also, there is a blue truck parked five houses north of my house (2114 South 75th Street) its been there about ten years with 2005 license plates. Also, there was a black Grand Prix parked on the block Rogers Park is on (1 1/2 blocks away). There are only two buildings on the south end of the park, an apartment building with two units, and a house at 2002 South 75th Street where a West Allis Police Officer named Randy lives. This black Grand Prix sat between his garage and the neighbors garage for four years (until about a year and a half ago). It had four flat tires and 2008 stickers. Parked two feet from the garage of a West Allis Police Officer (Randy) about 90 feet from his door. This car was right out in the open on Rogers Street about twenty feet off the street. Discrimination. Also, there is another car a block to the south (2237-39 South 75th Street) with no license plates for two years behind the house.

Event #23

(See Event #22). I filed a complaint with the City Clerk, Monica Schultz, on my car being towed and fraudulent tickets I received. I received a letter dated April 20, 2009 which I received April 22, 2009 which stated "It is not anticipated that decision regarding this matter will be made on this date (referring to Common Council meeting on April 21, 2009). Generally, all communications are directed to the City Attorney's Office for investigation. Common Council action regarding your communication will not be taken until the City Attorney's investigation is completed. Any questions you have regarding this matter should be directed to their attention." Signed Monica Schultz, Assistant City Clerk. I also called in May, 2009 and the lady who answers the phone at the City Attorney's Office refused letting me talk to an Attorney (not even asking me if I wanted to leave a message on their voice mail). This lady has been employed for 16 years by the City of West Allis. Evidence the City Attorney's Office is part of the corruption to cheat and steal. The actions of employees trying to offset a 55 million dollar loss in a bad investment. Apparently, the City ordered my car to be pieced out (since its never been retitled). So what did West Allis get \$500 - \$1,000? for a 1998 Grand Prix (eleven years old at this time) with a special engine (supercharger) a deluxe stereo with a graphic equalizer, automatic transmission with a tachometer on the instrument panel, power windows and door locks, electric seat warmer, \$28,000 new, worth \$10,000 when stolen by the City.

Event #24

March 10, 2009. I went to the Police Station to pay a parking ticket that went to \$30.00. The cashier said no, its been forty days its now \$40.00. I said no, received ticket January 31, 2009, she said thirty days in February and now March 10, that's 40 days. I said February is never thirty days, this year it was twenty-eight days, plus the ten in March is thirty-eight. She said I'm going to charge you \$40.00 anyway! With an angry look on her face.

Event #25

June 16, 2009. I received a letter from the Forestry department to cut grass in five days from the date on this letter (dated June 12, 2009). I called on the third day (June 15) and told them I'm cutting the grass later this afternoon or tomorrow morning at the latest (the fourth day). The letter stated "when you cut the grass, let us know its been done." Two hours after my call on the third day of the five day deadline, a crew showed up and mowed the lawn. Lets hurry-up mow the lawn before he does so we can recoup another \$60.00 towards the 55 million dollars we lost.

Event #26

January 22, 2009. One of the many times Margaret Goetsch and/or her husband attempted to cheat me by reporting me for little or no reason. The day before we had about a half inch of snow. It was barely past the 24 hours where one is required to shovel the walk. On my side of the street the only walk shoveled was the Goetsch's right next door at 2144 South 75th Street, with the exception of one house to the north (three houses away). The house next to

the Goetsch's wasn't shoveled. That house at 2148 South 75th Street has the biggest yard of any house within 8-10 blocks in any direction. So for that reason, blowing and drifting occurred giving them probably an inch and a half to two inches on their walk. At least three times what (snow) accumulated on my walk. The 2148 South 75th Street next to Goetsch's and the other five houses all the way south to the corner were not shoveled. And across the street no one shoveled. A complaint was phoned to the Police that the walk at 2140 South 75th Street wasn't shoveled. Before the City "plowed" my walk, I looked out my front door and saw a man sitting on a very tiny tractor across the street. Then I was taking a shower when someone was knocking at my door. When I came out of the shower and looked outside, my walk was cleared, it probably took that tractor 4 or 5 seconds and that was it. The plowing plus the ticket fine totaled \$155.30. I received that letter on May 28, 2009. Of the twenty-nine houses on both sides of the street, only two were shoveled, one of them being the Goetsch's (see Event #12).

Event #27

(Goetsch Event #3) August 22, 2009. The house I mentioned to the immediate south of the Goetsch's had a big party Saturday, August 22, 2009. They had a huge stereo set-up in the back yard. The music was absolutely blasting with noisy people all the way to 5:00 A.M. Sunday morning. I could hear the music eight blocks away. I was surprised the Goetsch's didn't call the Police to break it up. But then it was me playing the music later that morning, I was playing music at 10:00 A.M. (August 23, 2009). It was probably ten percent as loud as the Goetsch's next door neighbors. Sure enough, they called the Police to complain about my music which additionally was also inside the house. Two Police cars arrived at my house.

Event #28

(Goetsch Event #4) Floren Goetsch (in 2012) Margaret's husband called the Police and told them I was throwing coffee on his house. Not only did I not ever throw coffee on his house, I drink only organic coffee at \$9-10 per pound. I always save my coffee after it's brewed to drink again. I never pour it down the drain, let alone against my neighbor's house. The Police called and threatened to write me a ticket!

Event #29

(Goetsch Event #5) I received a letter from the West Allis Health Department about feeding the squirrels. This was in 2011. I spoke to Koralewski who told me in the letter to phone him. Yes it violates a City ordinance, but that's not the point. This is just one more way of proving Margaret Goetsch (a City employee) is out to get me. On at least seven or eight occasions she hollered at me to not feed the squirrels. For at least 12-14 years my parents lived in this house and fed the squirrels. The Goetsch's never called the Health Department nor they never shouted at my parents to not feed them. When my mother was in the back yard once and Floren Goetsch was grilling, he joked to my mother he was grilling squirrel burgers.

Event #30

(Goetsch Event #6) Either Margaret or Floren Goetsch taped a sign on the side of their house "Don't pour water here" with arrows pointing down to the ground. If they thought I was pouring water on the base of their house, they would have called the Police, maybe they did and the Police couldn't or wouldn't respond based on hear-say. I have a dish tub under one of my drains on the house across from their house. I still have the sign they wrote. This was June, 2015.

Event #31

(Goetsch Event #7) August, 2015. Sometimes I also have a bucket under my gutter which needs to be cleaned out and because of that the water floods the gutter and pours out the side to my sidewalk so I try to position a bucket moving it occasionally to catch water. One day last August there was about 2 ½ inches of water in the bucket. I flipped the bucket over my shoulder with my back facing the Goetsch house. Margaret Goetsch was stopped on 75th Street in her car so she saw me. I didn't do anything wrong, maybe 25-30 ounces of water landed on their lawn. Later, her husband Floren, when I was leaving my car to go into my house, read me "The Riot Act" accusing me of pouring water against his house where it meets the ground. I told him I flipped a small amount of water over my shoulder, not against his house, it was about four feet from it. He said his wife saw me pour it against their house. I told him "She's a Liar."

Event #32

(Goetsch Event #8) Often I shake out plastic bags from loaves of bread on the sidewalk in front of my house, just crumbs, no pieces. I received a letter on January 25, 2016 from Peter Feldhusen, Community Health Environmentalist II, saying on January 22, 2016 he "conducted an inspection of the sidewalk and noted birdseed and bread crumbs on the ground." And I was threatened with future violations could result in me being issued a municipal citation. I have never purchased or owned birdseed in my life. It was just bread crumbs. I wonder who phoned him.

Event #33

April 25, 2011. I received a parking ticket, noting "no permit." Well, the regulator (the motor that powers the window up and down) was not operating and it was down. I then noticed someone peeling off my monthly parking permit off of the window. There were only four days left in April for this permit to be used. The parking ticket was inside the car on the front passenger seat! That means the West Allis Police Officer was inside my car! How else could it end up on the seat? When did a Police Officer ever put a ticket inside the car and not on the window? The Officer was in the car, so any good detective would know he also peeled my permit off of the window. I didn't park my car until 1:00-1:30 A.M. on April 25, and received the ticket from 3:00-6:00 A.M., so everything points to the Officer taking the permit off. The odds of a thief stealing my permit to only be used four more days, and even noticing the window was down, and noticing the permit is one in 10,000. The Officer proved he

undoubtedly was inside the car seeing how the ticket was on the passenger side in the front. I still have the work order receipt from Prietzels Automotive to replace the regulator dated April 27, 2011. The ticket was paid on May 4, 2011. The number on the ticket was 1755868, I have the receipt. The corruption on this incident by the West Allis Police Officer is a strong damnation of the West Allis Police.

Event #34

March 31, 2016. I called the Records department at the Police station to obtain the seven digit numbers on the six parking tickets (all together it was ten) that weren't put on my car and therefore not physically on file at the Cashier's office. Whomever I talked to on March 31 wouldn't give me the numbers. This was about 4:40 P.M. (See Event #11).

Event #35

On April 1, 2016 I talked to Monica Schultz, City Clerk, in-person at City Hall. I asked for a copy of the complaint I filed on April 16, 2009 when my \$10,000 valued car was towed and disposed of (See Event #22). She said she would fax it to me. I didn't believe her by her demeanor, she didn't. One last act of corruption and deceit perpetrated by Monica Schultz, City Clerk.

Dear Mr. Agnos:

This is in response to your phone call of today regarding Commissioner Cook's order to dismiss your claim against Mrs. O'Connor and his award to us for attorney's fees, court costs and interest.

You did not appeal his decision and his decision is final. I do not have the written order in my possession that you requested; but you can obtain that from the courthouse yourself. Further, if you dispute the amount you owe me for representing Mrs. O'Connor because of your fraudulent claim, we can return to court and litigate this matter.

To refresh your recollection, you attempted to exhort rent money from Mrs. O'Connor and claimed that she was your tenant, when in fact you knew that it was her son who was renting from you. You could not get the rent from him, because he was destitute, as a result of his wife's illness and eventual death; so, you sued Mrs. O'Connor claiming she was the tenant. It did not matter to you that Mrs. O'Connor, an elderly widow, was also grieving the recent death of her husband. Your actions caused her extreme emotional distress and contributed to her pain and suffering. Further, your claim was dismissed because it lacked merit and you were ordered to pay attorneys fees and court costs. You also owe interest on the amounts due.

I expected that you would have done the right thing and paid the \$100 settlement amount I proposed. You stated in a previous conversation that you accepted the settlement and would leave payment in my mailbox by Monday, June 24, 2002. However, you did not do so. Therefore, you have refused my good faith efforts to resolve this in an amicable manner and have forced me to take legal action against you to collect the money that we are entitled to receive.


