

NARRATIVE

CALL FOR POLICE

On 11/02/14 at approximately 0200 hours, officers responded to Kwik Pantry (6716 W. Lincoln Ave.) regarding the complainant, Jerry S. Vangsness (M/W, DOB 08/03/56), calling to report, a male, later identified as Trent D. Gemoll (M/W, DOB 12/31/73), is refusing to leave the store. The description of the male matched an update 14-049871 regarding a male asking for someone to call the police for a ride home. I arrived on scene and made contact with Jerry whom was inside of the store.

ON-SCENE STATEMENT-JERRY S. VANGSNESS-COMPLAINANT

Jerry stated Trent entered the store and appeared as if he was injured. Trent complained of his face hurting although he appeared intoxicated. He proceeded to lay down on the floor blocking the door and refused to leave. Based on Trent's odd behavior and intoxicated state he called for the police to respond.

ON-SCENE STATEMENT-TRENT D. GEMOLL-VICTIM

Trent stated he was drinking at an unknown location and was going to walk to his girlfriend's residence in Hales Corners. At this point in time Trent was walking in the wrong direction and had no orientation as to what city he was currently in. Trent complained his face hurt although would not specifically inform officers why. As Trent spoke to me I detected the strong odor of ingested

intoxicants, his eyes were blood shot and glassy, and his speech was extremely slurred. I formed the opinion Trent was intoxicated.

Based on the fact Trent continued to explain his face hurt I questioned him further. Trent stated he was walking home from a tavern in the area of 68/National although he did not know for certain. As he was walking in the middle of the roadway a compact silver car pulled up and white males exited. The males proceeded to punch him in the face 'multiple times' and then fled the area. Trent could not describe the vehicle or the males at this point in time. Trent eventually stated he did not know if he was struck or if he fell down while walking due to his intoxicated state. Trent stated even if he was struck in the face he did not want to pursue the matter.

Trent did not have a phone to call his girlfriend although a departmental cell phone was used with no success. Trent had no money for a taxi cab and refused a ride, as he could not remember his girlfriend's address or her name. Trent was run (NCIC) on scene and it was found he had a warrant. Trent was placed under arrest and transported back to the West Allis Police Department for booking.

BOOKING

Trent was booked under Phoenix booking 14-005150. While conducting the booking process Trent could not stand and was told to sit on the floor while a medical unit was summoned as he was very unsteady on his feet. Trent stated he was in an extreme amount of pain and debated whether or not he wanted an ambulance. Based on the fact his behavior was becoming more erratic, his highly intoxicated state, and complaint of extreme pain a medical unit was summoned on scene. Officer Martin rode with Trent to Aurora West Allis Medical Center.

UPDATE FROM HOSPITAL/PHOTOGRAPH LINEUP

Officer Martin updated me at the station Trent was starting to sober up and filled in some further detail about the incident. Officers arrested three males driving a similar vehicle Trent described on a separate case 14-009786 which included similar circumstances. I generated a photograph array based on this new information. The photograph array was generated using Phoenix. I turned over the photograph array to Officer Martin to administer to Trent. This Officer had no prior knowledge of the case.

CASE DISPOSITION

Trent was unable to identify the male he described to officers in the photograph lineup. Trent stated he was 100% certain he could not remember the males as the incident happened to quickly and declined any further attempts to identify anyone.

Trent thanked officers for their assistance and attempts to help him remember who may have potentially been involved.

Based on the fact Trent was unable to remember any further details about the case and could not identify the male he described in the photo lineup this case is considered inactive. Further, due to the fact Trent was now a victim of a crime Lt. Saftig dropped the police hold and updated the Mount Pleasant Police Department.

NARRATIVE

Officer S. Martin reports:

INITIAL RESPONSE

On 11/02/14, I responded to the WAPD Booking Room to assist with this case. I made contact with Trent D. Gemoll, M/W 12/31/73, who had been arrested for valid commitments. Gemoll was the victim of a battery that evening, and requested an ambulance. The WAFD responded and elected to transport Gemoll to the Aurora West Allis Medical Center. I rode along in the ambulance due to Gemoll being in custody for the commitments.

OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

Gemoll appeared to be highly intoxicated (difficulty with his balance, very slurred speech, glassy and bloodshot eyes, and a strong odor of intoxicants coming from his breath and person). Although he appeared to have sustained abrasions and contusions during the battery, the injuries did not appear to be significant while in booking.

After approx. an hour in the emergency room, Gemoll's face began to display more substantial injuries. His jaw, left ear, and the contusion on his left forehead were noticeably swollen. Additionally, Gemoll's left eye bruised to the point he could no longer open it, and it was purple and black in color.

STATEMENT OF TRENT GEMOLL

I asked Gemoll if he had any idea who struck him. Gemoll stated he could not remember much from the incident. He stated he was drinking intoxicants at Dopp's Bar and Grill, located at 1753 S 68 St. The friends he rode with to West Allis had left the tavern. Gemoll left the tavern and walked southbound from the tavern. When he was on the east side of the sidewalk two blocks north of the Quik Pantry that officers located him (possibly in the 2100blk of S 67 Pl), he observed a small silver sedan traveling N/B on S 67 St. He believed the car was occupied by four M/Ws. The car sped up and suddenly stopped multiple times, and he could hear yelling from inside the vehicle.

PHOTO ARRAY

I conducted a photo array with Gemoll. I read him the photo array instructions and Gemoll stated he understood. After showing him the array, Gemoll stated he did not know who battered him due to his level of

intoxication. I turned the array back over to Officer Binter and informed him of the results.

STATEMENT OF DOCTOR NOLAN

Dr Nolan, the emergency room doctor that was overseeing Gemoll's treatment, informed me of the injuries to Gemoll. Gemoll had a fracture along the left side of his lower jaw that would require surgery. Dr Nolan stated he was going to admit Gemoll due to his injuries.
