2. **REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION**

- AB543 **COLLECTION OF INFORMATION REGARDING MOTOR VEHICLE STOPS, LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING STANDARDS**  
OPPOSE, because the bill would result in increased costs for the City, thus it is another unfunded State mandate. In addition, the bill states that the information collected would not be a matter of public record, but should be.
- AB588 **REPEALING PROVISIONS THAT MAY BE INCONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL LAW OF, AND MODERNIZING, CHAPTERS 189-192 AND 195 AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO RAILROAD REGULATION AND PROVIDING A PENALTY**
