The Common Council of the City of West Allis do ordain as follows:

PART I. Subsection 12.20(3) of the Revised Municipal Code of the City of West Allis is hereby amended to read:

12.20 OFF-STREET PARKING REGULATIONS FOR SINGLE AND TWO (2) FAMILY DWELLINGS.

* * *

- (3) Types of vehicles. The following vehicles are permitted:
- (a) Private passenger automobiles and non-commercial motor trucks having a maximum gross weight of not more than six thousand (6,000) pounds.
- (b) One commercial truck or van having a maximum gross weight of six thousand (6,000) pounds, subject to the following:
- 1. Said commercial vehicle is used by an occupant of the dwelling for "on-call" purposes. As used in this section, "on-call" means that the dwelling occupant is required by his or her business or employer to be ready to respond to customer calls for service while off duty.
- 2. An annual permit fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) is paid to the Department of Building Inspection and Zoning.
- 3. Adequate proof that the dwelling occupant is required to have an "on-call" vehicle and that the vehicle to be parked on the residential property is in good working order and appearance so as not to create annoyance or blight in the neighborhood due to noise, odors or unsightly appearance.
- 4. Receipt of an annual permit from the Department of Building Inspection and Zoning, which must be prominently displayed on the vehicle at all times the vehicle is parked at the approved residence.

Re: Commercial Vehicle Parked On/In Front Of Residential Property

Dear Mr. Ziehler,

I am aware the City of West Allis is considering revision of Subsection 12.20 (3) of the revised municipal code relative to allowing certain commercial vehicles to park on residential property.

The City of West Allis should be complimented for prohibiting the parking of commercial vehicles in front of or on driveways of residential properties. Our city leaders are rightly concerned about the appearance of West Allis residential neighborhoods. That some individuals wish or need to drive a commercial vehicle home instead of parking the vehicle at their place of employment or elsewhere is in itself a "poor excuse" to amend the existing ordinance(s).

However, in the spirit of compromise, IF the existing ordinance is revised, it is essential that

- 1. Permissible commercial vehicles should be <u>limited to small vans or trucks</u> (to be defined).
- 2. Only one (1) commercial vehicle permit per property address.
- 3. The vehicle must be <u>used in the course of regular employment by an individual residing at the property address</u>. Vehicle license plate must be affixed or displayed.
- 4. A <u>permit</u> (duration/expiration dates to be determined; semi-annual?) must be obtained and appropriately <u>displayed in windshield or on dashboard</u> of the vehicle, whether parked on the property or on the street.
- 5. Police may ticket vehicles without permit parked in violation of the ordinance.
- 6. <u>Vehicles may be towed</u> from private or public property and stored at owner's expense, if tickets remain unpaid (parameters to be determined)
- 7. <u>Appropriate permit fee</u> should be charged. The permit fee (semi-annual?) should be equivalent to the regular overnight monthly parking permit fees, allowing on property and on street parking.
- 8. A commercial vehicle driven by a property resident and <u>parked two hours or less during any 24 hour period is exempt</u> from permit requirements of the ordinance.
