1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

AB40 RETIRED PEACE OFFICERS; WEAPONS
Refer to Chief Puschnig.

AB44 AGRICULTURAL LAND; TAXATION
Refer to Chuck Ruud.

AB48 PROPERTY TAX BILLS; MAILING BY CLERK
No position.

AB53 PRISONER REIMBURSEMENT TO A MUNICIPALITY

**AB65/
SB33** ACCESS TO DOT PHOTOGRAPHS; LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES
FAVOR, because the bill would allow access to this information for Police Department use.

AB50 SHERIFF'S FEES; SEIZURE OF PROPERTY, EVICTIONS
FAVOR, because the bill places this authority at the local level where the responsibility is.

AB54 TAX-DELINQUENT REAL PROPERTY; SALE

Refer to Scott Post.

AB35 UNDERAGE DRINKING; FAILURE TO PREVENT

Refer to Scott Post and Chief Puschnig.

AB39 STATE FAIR PARK BOARD; LEGISLATIVE MEMBERSHIP

FAVOR, because the bill will guarantee continuing local and public representation on the board.

2. REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION

SB20 ENHANCED WIRELESS 9-1-1 SERVICE

FAVOR, because the bill would provide funding to implement the expansion and enhancement of 9-1-1 from the current line based system to also cover wireless calls. Two changes to the bill are suggested:

- 1.) Not limit grants to municipalities after 2008 if all local governments in Milwaukee County choose not to participate in a countywide effort.
- 2.) Also provide immunity from civil liability for local governments for operation of emergency 9-1-1 wireless systems.

3. OTHER

- a. Question of representation on Legislative Committee in future with combining of City Administrative Officer and Clerk/Treasurer. Options are:
 - (1) Operate with 4 instead of 5 members.
 - (2) Add one other new representative (Advisory Cmte. Chair, Director of Public Works, Police Chief, etc.).
- b. Referrals Still Outstanding:
AB14 Chief Puschnig (2/11/03)
- c. Mayor Bell's visit to State Capital Building and City's State delegation on various issues.
