AB159 CHARGE-BACK OF REFUNDED OR RESCINDED PROPERTY TAXES

OPPOSE, because the bill would result in additional manual processing of information and reduce revenue through fewer charge-backs and less interest.

FAVOR, because the bill would enable our Police Dept. to get employment information from private employees that it had not been able to get in the past, thus having more information to evaluate a candidate's employability.

AB79 RELEASE OF PERSONS WHO COMMIT OWI OFFENSES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES

FAVOR, because the bill could possibly reduce offenses and repeat offenders due to the new procedures and higher penalties.

- <u>State Budget Update.</u> Joint Finance Committee eliminated 45 non-fiscal policy items from Governor's proposed budget, including five (5) items of interest to municipalities. Four (4) other non-policy items of interest to municipalities remain in the budget bill.
