Re: Closing of Greenfield Avenue

Our 17th Annual Classic Car show will be held Sunday, October 7, 2007.

The Classic Car Show draws hundreds of participants and spectators to our downtown each year. Please review the supporting information regarding our Classic Car Show.

Presently the Classic Car Show is the Downtown's only income producing promotional event. The income produced is used to support other Downtown projects.

As this event grows, we need to make changes to assure the profitability and perpetuity of the Classic Car Show:

- 1. In the past, Greenfield Avenue has been open to traffic. The increased number of pedestrians and motorists along Greenfield Avenue, during the event, has raised concerns about safety. Spectators interested in a specific car generally walk around the car and subsequently step onto Greenfield Avenue. Motorists have a tendency to look at the cars while driving on a busy street.
- Our registered participants are offered an opportunity to display their cars on Greenfield Avenue on a first come first serve basis. Presently, there are no deterrents for non-registered vehicles to also park on Greenfield Avenue. We have had a few tense conversations with non-registered vehicle owners who insist they can park wherever they want. There are no restrictions to prevent these vehicle owners from parking along Greenfield Avenue during the Car Show.
 - We have discussed the use of a prohibitive parking ordinance to be enforced during the Car Show. We feel that a enforcing the ordinance would be time consuming, costly and become a detriment to the ambiance of a friendly Car Show.
- Closing Greenfield Avenue to traffic, during our event, would allow us to:
 - Angle park the vehicles as opposed to parking them parallel to the curb. Parking stalls parallel to the curb along Greenfield Avenue are limited to eight on the North & South sides per city block. Angle parking would increase the amount of cars parked per block substantially. Bus Stops stalls would also become available.
 - Reposition the car clubs and vendors more efficiently. In the past, the cross streets have been utilized for car clubs and vendors. We would be able to include additional vendors and car clubs.
 - Monitor activities such as registration, parking and crowd control.
 - Offer a festival atmosphere that would benefit the image of the entire city.

We are asking you to consider our request of closing Greenfield Avenue from the hours of 6:00am until 6:00pm, Sunday October 7th, 2007. We are happy to discuss any costs or other conditions associated with our request.
