Resolution to Transfer \$110,520 from the Contingency Fund to the Police Department Automotive Account for Advance Purchase of New Squad Cars and the Refurbishing of Used Cars.

WHEREAS, the Police Department annually budgets for the purchase of new squad cars; and,

WHEREAS, the Common Council has approved the 2005 Budget, which included four (4) marked and two (2) unmarked new police squad cars; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to do an advance purchase yet this year to order the vehicles now, thus avoiding a long delay in the manufacturing and delivery.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of West Allis that \$110,520 is hereby approved for transfer from the Contingency Fund to the Police Department's Automotive Account (100-2101-521-70-02) for the purchase of the five (5) new police squad cars and to refurbish four (4) used cars to be used as unmarked squad cars.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2005 Police Department's Automotive Budget Account shall reimburse the Contingency Fund next year.



Honorable Mayor Bell and Members of the Common Council West Allis, Wisconsin 53214

Dear Mayor Bell and Members of the Council:

This letter is to request your approval of a \$110,520 transfer from contingency funds into the Police Department automotive account (100-2101-521-70-02) for the purchase of new squad cars. By ordering these vehicles early, we will avoid a long delay in the manufacturing and shipping process. The contingency fund will be reimbursed with funds from the 2005 police budget.

We will be purchasing 5 new marked squad cars at a cost of \$90,000. This includes updating the emergency lights and siren. In an effort to save money we will refurbish 4 older squad cars. These vehicles are 1999 Fords (Crown Victoria's) with approximately 90,000 to 100,000 miles. All the major parts on these vehicles will be replaced with the exception of the engines and transmissions. Each vehicle will be repainted and used in our fleet as an unmarked vehicle. Initially we received an estimate of \$30,000 from an outside company to refurbish these vehicles. Because our mechanics will be doing all of the work our total cost will be \$14,000 as compared to the cost of new vehicles estimated at \$60,000.

These refurbished vehicles should last at least another 4 years. Because of the amount of work involved we request to purchase the necessary parts as soon as possible. Although the cost savings is significant, this is not something that I will be recommending on an annual basis. We will evaluate this initiative and report this information to the Commission during the next budget process. For the time being this will result in a savings of \$46,000.

It should be noted that the Police and Fire Commission approved this request at their November meeting. Thank you for your consideration in this matter. Should you have any questions or concerns, please call me at 302-8017.
