RE: City Attorney's Report of Claim

Dear Council Members:

The enclosed claim has been referred to this office in accordance with Section 3.05 (6)(a) of the Revised Municipal Code. This office has examined the facts of the claim and the applicable law. Our Opinion regarding liability is as follows:

It is the recommendation of this office that the following claim be denied:

# Jim Henry (Jim's Oval Bar) - Amount: \$ 557.62

This is a claim for property damage that occurred at 9141 West National Avenue, known as Jim's Oval Bar, on December 28<sup>th</sup>, 2006, when a water pipe located between the main and the curb stop broke causing water to flood the claimant's basement. When the claimant first noticed an issue with water coming into the basement, he contacted Ihn Plumbing Co. to analyze and repair the problem. An employee of Ihn Plumbing Co. arrived on the scene and chose to excavate in the basement of the property prior to confirming the exact location of the leak. After a period of time of digging without stopping the flow of water, Ihn Plumbing Co. then contacted the City to investigate. A City crew promptly arrived at the scene, shut off the water and determined that the break was located between the main and the curb stop, which is the responsibility of the City to repair by policy. As a result of the incident, the claimant had to pay Ihn Plumbing Co. the amount of \$395.00 for excavation and cement patching of the basement floor, as well as \$162.62 to A-1 Services, Inc. for the repair of an ice machine, which the claimant felt was damaged as a result of the water being turned off to the property. A claim was filed with the City on January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2007, in the amount of \$557.62 for the above-referenced damages.

Brian D. Block, Traffic & Utility Technician for the City of West Allis, investigated this claim. Mr. Block interviewed the claimant, Jim Ihn of Ihn Plumbing Co., and members of the City's Water Division, personally visited the property and the site of the break and reviewed City records pertaining to the history of water main breaks in the current vicinity. Mr. Block's opinion is that the City is not negligent in this claim for the following reasons:

 The City of West Allis had no knowledge of a break at or near the vicinity of 9141 West National Avenue (Jim's Oval Bar) prior to receiving notification by Ihn Plumbing Co. to shut off the water service. Additionally, the City had no information or reason to believe that a problem existed at or near the vicinity of the location of the service prior to the break. Common Council March 22, 2007 Page 2

- Ihn Plumbing Co. decided to excavate in the basement of the property without confirming that the leak was actually located inside the building. Ihn Plumbing Co. chose to blindly dig and try to follow the leak, instead of attempting to isolate the leak by shutting off valves, as would be the normal procedure.
- The City's Water Division crew was not given an opportunity to locate and repair the leak, and by the time the City was called and a crew arrived, the damage to the basement floor had already been done.

Michael Pertmer, Director of Public Works for the City of West Allis, has also reviewed this claim and fully concurs with Mr. Block's opinion stated above. Regarding the specific damages requested by the claimant, Mr. Pertmer notes the following:

- Upon the City crew arriving on the scene, an employee of Ihn Plumbing Co. had already broken up the basement floor apparently anticipating that the water leak was on the tavern's side of the shut-off and therefore would be the responsibility of the tavern to repair. In short, had the owner and/or plumber followed typical procedures and notified the City of the problem so that we could have made a determination as to responsibility, the floor would not have been torn up and needed repair.
- The claimant is also asking for \$162.62 to repair its ice-making machine that had to be repaired because the water was turned off. However, the City notified the owner that the water to the building would be turned off when we made our repairs. This should have given the owner more than ample time to exercise the proper shut down procedure for the ice-making machine. Had that been followed, it does not make sense how turning the water off would necessitate repairs once the water was turned back on.

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed this claim and concurs with the opinions of Mr. Block and Mr. Pertmer stated above. Furthermore, the normal procedure for the City is to deny all water main break claims unless the City had prior knowledge of the defect and did not take proper action to remedy it or took action that failed to correct the situation. As stated above, this is not the factual situation in this claim. The claimant should really be pursuing Ihn Plumbing Co. for not following proper procedure of notifying the City prior to excavating the basement area. Based upon the above, it is the recommendation of the City Attorney's Office to deny this claim pursuant to the provisions of Wisconsin Municipal Claims Statute 893.80.

Dear Mr. Pertmer:

I recently conferred with Alderman Jim Sengstock relative to the situation which occurred at my business located at 9141 West National Avenue, known as Jim's Oval Bar. He told me to send you a letter setting forth the facts as they occurred.

On or about December 28<sup>th</sup> or 29<sup>th</sup> I noticed that there was water coming out of the pipe near the water meter in the basement. There was about an inch of water in the basement. I called in Ihn Plumbing Company who came out on the same date. They ripped up the floor near the water meter, and concluded that there was not a breakage in any of the pipes, and that more than likely there was a break somewhere outside. A call was placed to the City of West Allis as to the fact that there might be a leak outside. City of West Allis personnel came to check the situation out, and concluded that indeed there was an outside leak. A water main had broken, and quite conceivably it had been broken for a number of days. The water seeped in under the floor of my building, and as a result the water was bubbling up by the pipe. A representative from the City of West Allis did come and wanted to check the problem out, concluding that there was a leak, and in support of Ihn Plumbing Company's opinion, felt that the leak was outside. City of West Allis Public Works personnel did repair the broken water main.

As a consequence of the broken water main the basement floor had to be patched, the cost of which was \$395. I have enclosed a copy of the statement from Ihn Plumbing Company. Additionally, because the water had to be shut down, my ice machine had to be repaired. Enclosed is a copy of the statement from A-1 Services, Inc. setting forth that the water had to be turned off, and this caused the ice machine to shut down on high pressure because the machine is water cooled. I had to pay \$162.62 for the repair.

I am respectfully requesting that I be reimbursed for both expenditures. I am going to send a copy of this letter to Alderman Tom Lajsic and Alderwoman Linda Dobrowski. I am also sending a copy of this letter to Alderman Dick Narlock, who I understand is the Chairman of the Public Works Committee.

Action Note:

Alderperson Sengstock initiated the discussion stating it was his understanding that somebody from the Water Division had told this property owner to contact a plumber. The property owner had an inch of water in his basement and believed that the problem was his. Because of this belief he contacted a plumber who started to make what he believed were repairs to the system, which in part resulted in the plumber breaking up the basement floor. Once the plumber had started his work he found that he could not stop the water from coming in. Eventually the plumber called the Water Division where it was discovered the cause of the problem was due to a water main break.

Alderperson Sengstock stated that because of these extenuating circumstances he recommended that the city reimburse the owner 50% of the total costs for repairs listed in the owner's claim.

Director of Public Works Mike Pertmer asked to comment and stated that the Water Division never told anybody to call a plumber and, in fact, was not even notified of the problem at this property until after the plumber had initiated an attempted repair and had dug up the basement floor. Mr. Pertmer stated that he could not understand why the plumber would take this action when to make such a repair the water would have had to be turned off at the curb stop prior to the repair and the West Allis Water Division is the only one that is allowed to turn water off and on at these curb stops. This requirement is by Public Service Commission rule and any licensed plumber in West Allis should be well aware of that rule.

He went on to state that when the Water Division's personnel arrived at the scene they quickly determined that the break was in fact on the city's side of the stop and therefore was the responsibility of the City to repair. All property owners that would be affected by the repair were notified that the Division would be shutting down the water main to make the repair. Since this notice was given, Mr. Pertmer saw no reason that the City was in any way responsible for the repair of the ice machine, which apparently was not shut down prior to the water being shut off.

Alderperson Sengstock stated that he continued to believe that there were extenuating circumstances and because of these circumstances made a motion recommending that the property owner be reimbursed for 50% of the claim submitted. Alderperson Dobrowski seconded the motion and the Committee unanimously recommended the item be referred to the Administration and Finance Committee.

Jim Henry communication regarding property damage allegedly sustained at 9141 W. National Ave. on December 28, 2006.

Alderperson Sengstock initiated the discussion stating it was his understanding that somebody from the Water Division had told this property owner to contact a plumber. The property owner had an inch of water in his basement and believed that the problem was his. Because of this belief he contacted a plumber who started to make what he believed were repairs to the system, which in part resulted in the plumber breaking up the basement floor. Once the plumber had started his work he found that he could not stop the water from coming in. Eventually the plumber called the Water Division where it was discovered the cause of the problem was due to a water main break.

Alderperson Sengstock stated that because of these extenuating circumstances he recommended that the city reimburse the owner 50% of the total costs for repairs listed in the owner's claim.

Director of Public Works Mike Pertmer asked to comment and stated that the Water Division never told anybody to call a plumber and, in fact, was not even notified of the problem at this property until after the plumber had initiated an attempted repair and had dug up the basement floor. Mr. Pertmer stated that he could not understand why the plumber would take this action when to make such a repair the water would have had to be turned off at the curb stop prior to the repair and the West Allis Water Division is the only one that is allowed to turn water off and on at these curb stops. This requirement is by Public Service Commission rule and any licensed plumber in West Allis should be well aware of that rule.

He went on to state that when the Water Division's personnel arrived at the scene they quickly determined that the break was in fact on the city's side of the stop and therefore was the responsibility of the City to repair. All property owners that would be affected by the repair were notified that the Division would be shutting down the water main to make the repair. Since this notice was given, Mr. Pertmer saw no reason that the City was in any way responsible for the repair of the ice machine, which apparently was not shut down prior to the water being shut off.

Alderperson Sengstock stated that he continued to believe that there were extenuating circumstances and because of these circumstances made a motion recommending that the property owner be reimbursed for 50% of the claim submitted. Alderperson Dobrowski seconded the motion and the Committee unanimously recommended the item be referred to the Administration and Finance Committee.
