Resolution relative to approving the application and the borrowing of up to \$188,018 from the Trust Funds of the State of Wisconsin at an interest rate of 4.5 percent for a term of 10 years for the purpose of financing sanitary sewer projects.

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Sec. 24.66 of the Wisconsin Statutes, all municipalities may borrow money for such purposes in the manner prescribed, and,

WHEREAS, by the provisions of Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statues, the Board of Commissioner of Public Lands of Wisconsin is authorized to make loans from the State Trust Funds to municipalities for such purposes. (Municipality as defined by Sec. 24.60(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes means a town, village, city, county, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation district, town sanitary district created under Sec 60.71 or 60.72, metropolitan sewerage districted created under Sec. 200.05 or 200.23, joint sewerage system under Sec. 281.43 (4), school district or technical college district.)

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of West Allis, in the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, borrow from the Trust Funds of the State of Wisconsin the sum of One Hundred Eighty Eight Thousand Eighteen and 00/100 Dollars (\$188,018.00) for the purpose of financing sanitary sewer projects and for no other purpose.

The loan is to be payable within 10 years from the 15th day of March preceding the date the loan is made. The loan will be repaid in annual installments with interest at the rate of 4.50 percent per annum from the date of making the loan to the 15th day of March next and thereafter annually as provided by law.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that there shall be raised and there is levied upon all taxable property, within the City of West Allis, in the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin a direct annual tax for the purpose of paying interest and principal on the loan as they become due.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that no money obtained by the City of West Allis by such loan from the state be applied or paid out for any purpose except financing sanitary sewer projects without the consent of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that in case the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands of Wisconsin agrees to make the loan, that the mayor and clerk of the City of West Allis, in the County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, are authorized and empowered, in the name of the city to execute and

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deliver to the Commission, certificates of indebtedness, in such form as required by the Commission, for any sum of money that may be loaned to the city pursuant to this resolution. The mayor and clerk of the city will perform all necessary actions to fully carry out the provision of Chapter 24, Wisconsin Statutes, and these resolutions.

RESOLVED FUTHER, that this preamble and these resolutions and the aye and no vote by which they were adopted, be recorded and that the clerk of this city forward this certified record, along with the application for the loan, to the Board of Commissioner of Public Lands of Wisconsin.

Thank you for your request for a loan application from the State Trust Fund. The current interest rates for Trust Fund loans are:

Dear Municipal Clerk:

Section 70.57 of the Wisconsin Statutes requires the Department of Revenue (DOR) to notify each county and taxation district of its Equalized Value on August 15. In compliance with the statutes, the following material is enclosed for your review:

- *1. <u>County Equalization Report</u> Provides the 2009-Equalized Value for each taxation district in the county, indicating changes from 2008.
- 2. <u>Assessment/Sales Ratio Analysis</u> Shows the 2008 average assessment to sales ratio for residential and commercial property with usable market value sales in your taxation district.
- *3. <u>Condensed Sales Summary Report</u> Provides a detailed listing of 2008 arm's length sales of properties that are 38 acres or greater in size. Each sale is summarized indicating the average price paid per acre.

The following reports are available at the indicated DOR websites.

- *4 <u>County Apportionment Report</u> Lists each taxation district's 2009 Equalized Value, less Tax Incremental Finance District Increment Value, and its percent of the total County value, which indicates each district's portion of the County levy. This report is on our website at: http://www.revenue.wi.gov/equ/09coapprt.html.
- *5 <u>Statement of Changes in Equalized Values (Report 2)</u> Shows the economic change, new construction, and other changes made to your district for this year. It is found on our website at: http://www.revenue.wi.gov/equ/report2.html.
- 6. Net New Construction 2009 This report shows the dollar amount of Net New Construction that will be used in calculating municipal and county levy limits. It is found at our website at: http://www.revenue.wi.gov/equ/nnc.html.
 - *According to Wisconsin law, the Equalized Value of Agricultural lands reflect the <u>Use Value</u> of the land, not the Market Value, and the Undeveloped and Agricultural Forest lands are reported at 50% of Market Value.

Sales information is used to estimate changes in the market value of real estate from one year to the next. Should you be interested in obtaining a detailed listing of the sales included in the Assessment/Sales Ratio Analysis (item #2), please contact our office.

The Assessor's Final Report information is an integral part of the Equalized value because it identifies physical changes to the district's tax base such as new construction, demolitions, exemptions, classification shifts, and personal property. Reports are due from the assessor on the second Monday in June; estimated reports are acceptable if assessments aren't finalized. The status of this district's Assessor's Final Report as Equalized values were developed in June, 2009:

A Final submission of the Assessor's Final Report was used to determine the value of changes to the tax base.

If you have any other questions concerning the Equalized Values or the material enclosed, please contact our office for further clarification. If you would like to meet with a representative of this office, a meeting can be scheduled at a mutually agreeable time. Per Section 70.64 of the Wisconsin Statutes, if municipal officials conclude the Equalized Value is unequal or discriminatory, a written appeal may be filed with the Wisconsin Tax Appeals Commission on or before October 15, 2009. Seymour Pl., commented on the petition regarding deer problems and associated concerns relative to disease, landscaping, deer overpopulation, increased number of coyotes, vehicle accidents, safety issues, and DNR management and techniques. She requested a city ordinance be enacted to ban feeding the deer.

Edward Walkowiak, 2523 S. Seymour Pl., commented on the overpopulation of deer. He described his experiences with the deer and the increased number of coyotes. He said that the deer eat and destroy his property and asked for help from the city.

Kurt Traeder, 2512 S. Seymour Pl., commented on the Beautification awards that the City issues. He said the problem with the deer population has increased within the past two to five years. He addressed the cost involved with his yard and droppings throughout the property. He indicated that the deer no longer fear humans. He stated that he does not hate the deer and enjoys the wildlife, but the herd needs to be controlled because of its overpopulation. He requested assistance in order to get relief.

Dianna Dellinger, 2783 S. Seymour Pl., commented on the number of deer, safety concerns, and the cost involved with landscape damage and spray.

David Sahar, 11919 W. Verona Ct., said that this problem is a newer problem because of the recent overpopulation of deer. He addressed the destruction, expense and vehicle accidents associated with the deer.
