

opportunity to produce witnesses, cross-examine witnesses, and be represented by counsel (the "Hearing"). The complainant was represented by Attorney Anthony Garcia and the Licensee was represented by Attorney Jeff Murrell.

4. That Jennifer Pierce appeared at the Hearing, as agent for the Licensee.
5. That the Public Safety Committee heard testimony from Officer Burckel during the Hearing.
6. That Jennifer Pierce was called as a witness to testify at the Hearing but, based upon the advice of counsel, chose not to answer any questions regarding the merits of the allegations in the complaint by invoking her rights under the Fifth Amendment to the United States Constitution.
7. That the Public Safety Committee received documents into evidence during the Hearing that support all allegations in the complaint, except the following:
 - a. Count 6, Par. 12, Subpar. L
 - b. Count 7, Par. 13, Subpar. C.
 - c. Count 8, Pars. 14, Subpars. F, H, I, J, and L
8. That, the Public Safety Committee determined that the following allegations in the complaint are untrue, and dismisses those counts without cost to the accused:
 - a. Count 6, Par. 12, Subpar. L
 - b. Count 7, Par. 13, Subpar. C.
 - c. Count 8, Pars. 14, Subpars. F, H, I, J, and L
9. The Public Safety Committee finds the dismissed counts to not be malicious or without probable cause, and does not order costs shall to paid by the complainant.

10. That the Public Safety Committee determined the remaining allegations in the complaint are true and that those allegations substantially relate to the licensed activity, including:
- a. Allowing drug trafficking on premises contrary to Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)(6)
 - b. Allowing another person to use a retail alcohol license contrary to Wis. Stat. §§ 125.32(2m) and 125.04(1).
 - c. Three instances of closing hour violations contrary to Wis. Stat. § 125.32(3)(a).
 - d. Eleven instances of excessive noise contrary to West Allis Municipal Code § 7.23 adopted under Wis. Stat. § 125.10.
 - e. Fifteen instances of serving an intoxicated person contrary to Wis. Stat. § 125.07(2)(a).
 - f. Fifteen instances of maintaining a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper House contrary to Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)(2).


CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

1. That the Licensee was properly served at least 3 days before the time at which the licensee was commanded to appear and service was accomplished in the manner provided under Wis. Stat. Ch. § 801 for service in civil actions in circuit court.
2. That the committee draws an adverse inference regarding the decision by Jennifer Pierce not to testify during the Hearing after she was called as a witness.
3. That at the Hearing, the violations which were found to be true constitute a sufficient basis to revoke all three of the 2025-2026 licenses issued to the Licensee collectively referred to as license number ALC-23-22, including the: Class “B” Fermented Malt Beverage License under Wis. Stat. §125.26, “Class B” Intoxicating Liquor License under Wis. Stat. §125.51(3), and Public Entertainment License under West Allis Municipal Code § 9.76.

RECOMMENDATION:

Therefore, the Public Safety Committee recommends to the Common Council of the City of West Allis that ALC-23-22 issued to Blaque Bar & Bites Corporation be revoked.
