Re: Recommendation for Changes in Basic Life Support Fees

Recently, a committee of the Milwaukee County Association of Fire Chiefs (MCAFC) reviewed countywide ambulance fees to assure that rates are in line with current economic issues, Medicare reimbursements, and to measure consistency across the county. Besides the committee activity, I asked LifeQuest, Inc., our Basic Life Support billing agent, to determine whether we could improve revenue by changing ambulance fees.

Basic Life Support (BLS) fees are determined by the local municipality, while Advanced Life Support (ALS, "Paramedic") rates are determined by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Council (ICC, comprised of mayors and village presidents). My committee's ALS recommendations will be presented to the ICC after they are approved by the MCAFC in November.

For your review, I've attached LifeQuest's response to my inquiry and a chart from the MCAFC committee meeting that compares current BLS rates. If we implement the rate changes as suggested, LifeQuest has anticipated that the City could receive approximately \$80,000 in additional revenue based upon our transport and treatment history.

I've also attached language changes for Chapter 5 of the City's Revised Municipal Code that will be required to implement the rate changes.

I am suggesting that you approve all LifeQuest recommendations except:

- 1. the charge for transports should be \$14.00 per loaded mile instead of the recommended \$13.00 resident/13.50 nonresident, and
- 2. the "BLS On Scene Care" recommendation for residents of West Allis should be ignored.

The last ambulance fee change in our city was implemented in 2005.

I've discussed these rate changes with Gary Schmid, City Comptroller and Paul Ziehler, City Administrative Officer to assure that my recommendations are consistent with City policy and with financial accuracy as predicted by LifeQuest. Both have suggested that I pass these recommendations to your body for implementation.

While I am aware that rate increases are never entirely popular with your constituents, I also realize that user fees in the form of ambulance billing have been an acceptable method of recovering municipal costs. I will be available to address any of your concerns. Please feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.

Suggested edits to City of West Allis Municipal Code, Chapter 5, "Fire Department Regulations":

5.03 FIRE CHIEF

- (7) Ambulance Fee.¹
- (a) Whenever an the ambulance (basic life support) ambulance of the City of West Allis shall convey a person, a fee shall be charged for such service to the person, his/her insurance company, or his/her estate.
- (b) The fee for the <u>Basic Life Support (BLS)</u> ambulance service shall be <u>fivefour</u> hundred twenty-five dollars (\$500.00425.00) per person per conveyance <u>for a resident of</u> the City, and six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per person per conveyance for a nonresident. In addition, <u>transported personsnonresidents</u> shall be charged (1) <u>fourteenseven</u> dollars and <u>fifty cents</u> (\$14.007.50) per mile for transports, (2) <u>seventythirty</u> dollars (\$70.0030.00) for oxygen use, (3) <u>one hundredseventy-five</u> dollars (\$100.0075.00) for specialized procedures such as spinal immobilization after motor vehicle accidents, and (4) one hundred <u>fifty</u> dollars (\$150.00100.00) for on scene <u>basic life supprt care.</u>—<u>BLS Nonresident.</u>²
- (c) The Fire Chief or his designee shall be responsible for obtaining the name, address, identification number and health insurance data of the person conveyed, as possible. The Manager of Finance shall be responsible for the billing and collection of the fee from the person conveyed.
