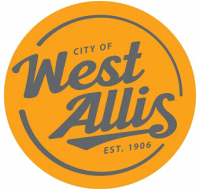

**CITY OF WEST ALLIS
RESOLUTION R-2025-3020**

**RESOLUTION RELATING TO REVISIONS TO POLICY 330 FOR RETIREE
HEALTH INSURANCE AND CLARIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY AND COST
SHARING PROVISIONS.**

WHEREAS, certain retiree health insurance provisions were inadvertently omitted during the reformatting and topic-based restructuring of the policy and procedures framework, and this amendment restores the original language, deletes antiquated provisions, and clarifies existing policy and practice without making substantive changes;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Common Council of the City Of West Allis, in the State of Wisconsin, as follows:

SECTION 1: **AMENDMENT** “P330 Insurance” of the City Of West Allis Policies & Procedures is hereby *amended* as follows:

A M E N D M E N T

P330 Insurance

1. Health Insurance for Active Employees under the Total Benefits Package (TBP). ~~Any employees who are not eligible for health insurance under Policy 1413 shall be eligible for health insurance under this policy according to the terms approved annually by the common council.~~
 - a. ~~Initial Eligibility. Generally, a new employee may select coverage to be effective upon the first day of the month following 30 days of service.~~ The following employee groups are eligible for health insurance benefits under this policy:
 - i. Non-represented employees hired on and after November 1, 2018.
 - ii. Non-represented employees hired prior to November 1, 2018, but who have subsequently elected to convert to the TBP.
 - iii. Any sworn members of the police and fire departments who within 30 days of appointment from a represented to a non-represented position have elected to convert to the TBP. In such cases, coverage shall be effective on the first day of the month following the date of appointment to the sworn non-represented position.

iv.

b. Enrollment/Change of Status.

- i. Enrollment. An employee who chooses to participate in the City's Health Insurance shall enroll upon their initial eligibility and/or during the City's annual Health/Dental/Section 125 Open Enrollment. Enrollment at any other time is permitted within 30 days of a change in City employment status or due to a hardship (i.e. loss of other coverage).
- ii. Change of Status. Any change in status (e.g., marriage, birth or adoption of a child, military reinstatement, dependent eligibility reinstatement, etc.) is effective upon the date of the qualifying event if notification and proper paperwork are received by the Human

within 30 days
of the event.

- c.
 - i. Monthly Premium Share.
 - (1) Full-time Employee (1.0 FTE), Alderperson, Mayor, and Municipal Judge. The City pays the monthly health insurance premium less an employee's monthly premium share as set forth by the Common Council or according to any applicable collective bargaining agreement.
 - (2) Part-time Employee (0.5 FTE or more). The City pays a prorated monthly health insurance premium based on FTE for a part-time employee and the employee pays the difference; in addition, a part-time employee is subject to paying a prorated amount of a full-time employee's monthly premium share.
 - ii. Benefits. The City shall provide benefits under this policy as specified in the Summary Plan Document(s).
 - iii. Termination of Coverage. Coverage ceases in accordance with the provisions contained in the Summary Plan Document(s). When applicable, continuation coverage (COBRA) will be offered.
 - iv. One Plan Per Family Rule. An employee or retiree who is married to another employee shall enroll in one plan.
 - v. Surviving Spouse of a Deceased Active Employee.
 - (1) The City will provide health insurance coverage to the surviving spouse and eligible dependents of an active City employee who dies while in the service of the City, provided the employee has completed 10 full-time years of service dependent upon date of hire, under the following provisions
 - (A) For the surviving spouse and eligible dependents of a deceased active employee who has not attained retirement age per the State of Wisconsin's (WI) Department of Employee Trust Fund's (ETF) – Wisconsin Retirement System's

(WRS) Death Benefits regulations, the City will pay 50% of the monthly premium until the surviving spouse is employed by another employer providing health insurance coverage or remarries.

- (B) In the event the surviving spouse is employed by another employer providing health insurance coverage, the City's health insurance obligation will permanently cease and continuation coverage (COBRA) will be offered.
 - (C) If participation in COBRA coverage is elected within the required federal/State election period and becomes effective the first of the month following the employee's death, the City will pay 50% of the monthly COBRA premium for the surviving spouse and/or eligible dependent(s) for the first six (6) months of their COBRA coverage or until their COBRA coverage is cancelled, whichever date/event occurs first.
 - (D) If election to participate in COBRA coverage is not made within the required federal/State election period, but the City makes benefits available, coverage shall become effective the first of the month following the employee's death and the surviving spouse and/or eligible dependent(s) are subject to paying the full monthly premium per COBRA regulations.
- (2) In the event a surviving spouse remarries, the City's health insurance obligation will permanently cease and continuation coverage (COBRA) will be offered; the surviving spouse and/or eligible dependent(s) are subject to paying the full monthly premium per COBRA regulations.
 - (3) If the deceased employee was of retirement

age per WI ETF-WRS's Death Benefits regulations and considered eligible to receive a WRS retirement annuity per ETF's requirements, the surviving spouse and eligible dependents would qualify for retiree health insurance benefits.

- vi. Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). Group health insurance coverage will be maintained for an employee while he/she is on FMLA leave in accordance with applicable law.
- vii. Military Leave Benefit Continuation. Health insurance benefits shall be implemented in compliance with the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) and any other applicable federal, state, or local laws. In addition to such, the City will provide continuation of health insurance benefits for an employee who is called up to active military service, his/her spouse, and any eligible dependents, beyond the 45 days, as if he/she were an active employee; for such continuation of health insurance benefits, the employee, spouse, and/or dependents will be required to pay the applicable monthly premium share in accordance with City policies and procedures. Extended health insurance coverage shall continue during the entire period of active military service call up and shall cease upon the employee's failure to return to employment following release from active duty. Coordination of benefits shall occur with any military health insurance coverage, and any military or other federal health insurance benefits or services shall be primary.
- viii. Exceptions. Department Heads, with the approval of the Assistant City ~~Director~~ Administrator, Finance Director, and City Administrator, may make exceptions to the provisions contained herein for significant recruitment/hiring reasons.
- ix. Subrogation. In the event the City makes any payment of medical expenses pursuant to the terms of any health insurance program, the City shall be subrogated to all the employee's/insured's rights of recovery therefore against any third party or his/her insurer for such payment.

2. Health Insurance for Retirees

- a. Employee Eligibility. Persons who retire from City employment and are ~~not eligible for health insurance under Policy 1413~~ covered at the time of retirement under this policy are eligible for retiree health insurance under the terms established annually by the common council, ~~except for any of the following persons~~ except for the following:
- i. Persons who are eligible for Medicare.
 - ii. Persons with fewer than fifteen (15) years of service.
 - iii. Persons who have already received retiree health insurance for the maximum duration of twelve (12) years, unless the person retired as a sworn member of the police or fire department, in which case fifteen (15) years.:
 - ~~(1) 12 years if the person did not retire as a sworn member of the police or fire departments.~~
 - ~~(2) 15 years if the person retired as a sworn member of the police or fire department.~~
 - iv. Persons who did not elect to enroll in retiree health insurance at the time of retirement.
 - v. Persons who cancel, waive, or otherwise cause their retiree health insurance to end.
- b. Spouse and Dependent Eligibility. A person who is eligible for retiree health insurance under this policy may cover a spouse and dependents, provided the spouse and dependents are enrolled at the time of the person's initial retirement elections.
- i. Covered spouses and dependents are subject to the same eligibility restrictions as the retiree, including the maximum coverage duration applicable to the retiree, termination of coverage when they themselves become Medicare-eligible, and termination of coverage if cancelled, waived, or otherwise caused to end.
 - ii. A person may not at any time add a spouse or dependents to the plan after the initial retirement elections, and any spouse or dependent whose coverage is waived by the retiree at any time may not be re-enrolled.
- c. Cost. A retired employee who takes retiree health insurance shall pay a 50% share of the retiree premium, unless they converted to the TBP after date of hire. Those who converted to the TBP after the date of hire shall pay at the following applicable rate ~~below~~:
- i. The same monthly premium share as active employees if all the following ~~applies~~ are true:
 - (1) The retired employee had a balance of 680 hours or more in their ESLB on the date of retirement.
 - (2) The person is not eligible for Medicare.
 - (3) The retired employee has not been ~~retired~~ covered on the retiree health plan for longer than 36 months ~~or less~~.
 - ii. 20% of the retiree premium, if the person ~~is eligible for post-Medicare~~

insurance was hired as a non-represented employee prior to March 1, 2008, or they were hired as a represented employee prior to March 1, 2016.

iii. 35% of the retiree premium, if the person ~~is not eligible for post-Medicare insurance~~ was hired as a non-represented employee on or after March 1, 2008, or they were hired as a represented employee on or after March 1, 2016.

iv. 100% of the retiree premium, if eligible for Medicare.

3. Dental Insurance

a. Initial Eligibility and Effective Date of Coverage. Employees become eligible for Dental Insurance on the first day of the month following completion of 61 months of service.

b. Enrollment/Change of Status.

i. Enrollment. An employee who chooses to participate in the City's Dental Insurance shall enroll upon their initial eligibility and/or during the City's annual Health/Dental/Flex Open Enrollment. Enrollment at any other time is permitted within 30 days of a change in City employment status or due to a hardship (i.e. loss of other coverage).

ii. Change of Status. Any change in status (e.g., marriage, birth or adoption of a child, military reinstatement, dependent eligibility reinstatement, etc.) is effective upon the date of the qualifying event if notification and proper paperwork are received by the Human Resources Department within 30 days of the event.

c. Monthly Premium Share. The City pays the monthly premium share on behalf of a full-time employee (1.0 FTE), an Alderperson, Mayor, and the Municipal Judge; a part-time employee is prorated based on FTE.

d. Benefits. The City shall provide benefits as specified in the Summary Plan Document(s).

e. Termination of Coverage. Coverage ceases in accordance with the provisions contained in the Summary Plan Document(s). When applicable, continuation coverage (COBRA) will be offered.

f. Retirement. Dental Insurance coverage is not available upon retirement; however, dental COBRA coverage will be offered if applicable.

4. Vision Insurance. Group vision insurance may be made available to employees. If offered, employees may select a plan from those made available. If offered and elected, employees shall pay one hundred percent (100%) of the premium.

5. Long-Term Disability Insurance. Regular full-time and regular part-time employees holding a budgeted position of 0.5 FTE or greater, will be eligible for long-term disability insurance. The terms of long-term disability insurance offered by the City shall be established annually by administrative rule.

6. Life Insurance. Eligibility and Enrollment. Employee eligibility and enrollment shall be in accordance with the Department of Employee Trust Funds' (ETF) WI Public Employers Group Life Insurance Program.

a. Basic Coverage in the amount of an employee's prior year's annual earnings

adjusted to the next highest one thousand dollars. The Basic Coverage is paid in full by the City.

- b. Supplemental Coverage equal to 1 times an employee's Basic Coverage. Supplemental Coverage is an optional election paid in full by the employee through an after-tax payroll deduction.
- c. Additional Coverage equal to 1, 2 or 3 times an employee's Basic Coverage. Additional Coverage is an optional election paid in full by the employee through an after-tax payroll deduction.
- d. Spouse/Domestic Partner and/or Dependent Coverage is an optional election paid in full by the employee through an after-tax payroll deduction.
- e. Additional benefits are available (such as Accidental Death/Dismemberment/ Loss of Use Coverage, Living Benefits in cases of terminal illness, waiver of premiums during periods of total disability, and retired employees coverage) as provided by ETF's WI Public Employers Group Life Insurance Program

COMPLAINT

Plaintiff, by its undersigned attorneys, Foley & Lardner LLP, as and for its
Complaint against the defendant, City of West Allis ("City"), hereby alleges and shows to the
Court as follows:

NATURE OF ACTION AND PARTIES

1. This is an action brought pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 74.37 to recover a refund of future 2025 real property taxes that will be imposed because of the excessive assessment of the real property described below.
2. Plaintiff owns the parcel of real property identified by the City as 444-9992-000, located at 1000 S. 108th Street, West Allis, Wisconsin 53948 (the "Subject Property").
3. The defendant City is a body corporate and politic, duly organized as a municipal corporation under Wisconsin law.

CLAIM FOR RELIEF

4. For the 2025 tax year, the City assessed the Subject Property at \$7,161,100 (“the 2025 assessment”).

5. The 2025 assessment was excessive and exceeded the fair market value of the Subject Property.

6. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 70.47(8m), the City Assessor requested a waiver of the board of review hearing. The waiver request was approved by the Board of Review.

7. Under Wisconsin law, the waiver of board of review hearing satisfies the taxpayer’s obligation to file a claim with the municipality prior to filing an excessive assessment lawsuit in circuit court. A taxpayer thus must initiate the lawsuit prior to the issuance of the relevant tax bill.

8. The excessive assessment of the Subject Property has resulted in the imposition of excessive taxes in the amount to be determined after the issuance of the 2025 tax bill.

9. Plaintiff is timely filing this *de novo* refund action pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 74.37(3)(d). Plaintiff is entitled to a refund of the excessive 2025 property taxes that will be imposed for the Subject Property based on the 2025 assessment, plus statutory interest.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this Court enter Judgment in its favor and against the City awarding Plaintiff:

- A. A refund of a portion of its 2025 property taxes as is supported by the evidence, together with statutory interest;
- B. Its costs, disbursements and attorneys' fees of this action; and
- C. Such other and further relief as this Court deems just and equitable.

A crack measuring approximately 14 feet developed along the 16-inch main line, which subsequently burst and created a substantial hole in the roadway. As a result, the roadway buckled, cracked, and collapsed, which also caused a nearby gas line to rupture.

The failure of the main line caused significant flooding in the roadway. The water then backed up into my residence through toilets, shower drains, and a floor drain located in my fully finished basement. Flooding continued and it resulted in approximately four inches of standing water and sewage throughout the entire basement in the matter of minutes. During the cleanup process, where I had friends and family working, we finished the cleanup of the water and then moments later, it started to flood again. I walked outside and talked to the workers, and they stated they were sorry, but the trucks were not able to get the water out fast enough and the water came back in through our line.

During the response, I spoke extensively with City workers and representatives from WE Energies. It was explained to me that the water main failure was caused by corrosion and the age of the pipe. Although these pipes were originally represented as having a lifespan of over 100 years, this particular pipe was installed around 1968. I was further informed that the pipe originated from China during a time when such pipes were not manufactured to last. Due to its condition, the pipe could not withstand the water pressure and ruptured, blowing a hole along its side. I later learned that this specific main line is supplied directly by the municipal water tower. The rupture caused the complete emptying of the water tower, contributing to the severity and speed of the flooding.

To Whom It May Concern,

I, John of the family Sloan of full life, hereby make the following **NOTICE OF CONDITION PRECEDENT**, that my Human and fourth, fifth, and eighth Constitutional Rights have been molested/violated, on or about 03-29-2024 Time 1:54 A.M Location: corner of S. 84th st. / W. Mitchell St. P.O. Cooper of the West Allis Police Department of Wisconsin pulled me over and immediately got out of his patrol vehicle and asked me to get out of the car. I asked him *"if he had an Articulate Reasonable Suspicion of me committing a crime"* - He stated *"no, the owner of this vehicle's license is suspended"*. I then told him *"that is not a crime, it is a traffic infraction and that I am not getting out of the car"* at this point I asked P.O. Cooper to call his Supervisor. P.O. Cooper asked me to turn off the car, unknowingly, turning off the car's engine automatically unlocked the car doors. P.O. Copper proceeded to pull open the driver side door and demanded me out of the vehicle, I attempted to close the door when P.O. Cooper blocked the door with the left side of his body. P.O. Lazaris informed me to *"get out of the car or we will tase you"*, I remained still with my hands on the steering wheel. P.O. Lazaris proceeded to tase me while P.O. Cooper pepper sprayed me. I then pulled the electric prongs out of me while P.O. Cooper continuously pepper sprayed me. Somehow, I am out of the car and body slammed on my back being handcuffed. While on the ground handcuffed P.O. Lazaris used direct contact with the taser on the left side of my stomach. He began hollering *"stop resisting"*, the voltage was so much I began to see light.

After the pain started to subside enough I turned my head to tell the P.O. Lazaris *"I'm down on the ground in handcuffs, stop electrocuting me"*. P.O. Lazaris proceed to tase me three more times than he got up. I was then helped up and told to get in the patrol vehicle, to which I responded *"I'm not getting in, I didn't commit a crime. Take these handcuffs off of me."* P.O.

Lazaris said "you getting in" while he grabbed my head and banged it on the patrol vehicle. I then said "okay, you busted my head, Am I bleeding"? An officer said "no". At this point I said "okay I'm going to get in the SUV", while in the patrol vehicle there was an unlawful seizure of my vehicle- which is a violation of my Fourth and Fifth Amendment rights.


The Supervisor of Officers Cooper and Lazaris instructed them to release me as I was free to go. Two officers who were not involved in the incident helped me to the ambulance stating "We didn't touch you, and we don't know what's going on. We were on perimeter duty and didn't see anything". The ambulance took me to the West Allis Hospital from where I was released.

I encountered a similar situation with some of the same officers from the West Allis Police Department a few months ago. I refused to get out of the vehicle and asked the officer to call his supervisor. I was roughed up and the vehicle I was in was unlawfully seized.

There being nothing further I hereby declare (verify, state, and confirm) under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing are true and correct.

Plaintiff John Sloan has filed an action in this court and has filed a motion for leave to proceed without prepayment of the filing fee pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915. ECF No. 2. Upon review of plaintiff's motion, I find that requiring plaintiff to pay this fee would impose a significant financial hardship on him.

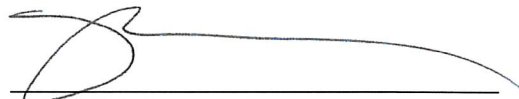

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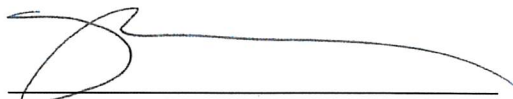

I, John of the family Sloan of full life, hereby make the following NOTICE OF CONDITION PRECEDENT, that my Human and fourth, fifth, and eighth Constitutional Rights have been molested/violated, on or about 03-29-2024 Time 1:54 A.M Location: corner of S. 84th st. / W. Mitchell St. P.O. Cooper of the West Allis Police Department of Wisconsin pulled me over and immediately got out of his patrol vehicle and asked me to get out of the car. I asked him "if he had an Articulate Reasonable Suspicion of me committing a crime" - He stated "no, the owner of this vehicle's license is suspended". I then told him "that is not a crime, it is a traffic infraction and that I am not getting out of the car" at this point I asked P.O. Cooper to call his Supervisor. P.O. Cooper asked me to turn off the car, unknowingly, turning off the car's engine automatically unlocked the car doors. P.O. Copper proceeded to pull open the driver side door and demanded me out of the vehicle, I attempted to close the door when P.O. Cooper blocked the door with the left side of his body. P.O. Lazaris informed me to "get out of the car or we will tase you", I remained still with my hands on the steering wheel. P.O. Lazaris proceeded to tase me while P.O. Cooper pepper sprayed me. I then pulled the electric prongs out of me while P.O. Cooper continuously pepper sprayed me. Somehow, I am out of the car and body slammed on my back being handcuffed. While on the ground handcuffed P.O. Lazaris used direct contact with the taser on the left side of my stomach. He began hollering "stop resisting", the voltage was so much I began to see light.

After the pain started to subside enough I turned my head to tell the P.O. Lazaris "I'm down on the ground in handcuffs, stop electrocuting me". P.O. 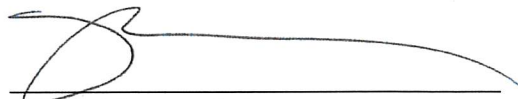

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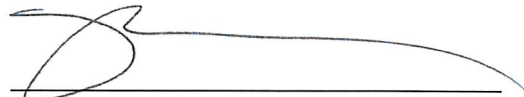

To Whom It May Concern,

I, John of the family Sloan of full life, hereby make the following **NOTICE OF CONDITION PRECEDENT**, that my Human and fourth, fifth, and eighth Constitutional Rights have been molested/violated, on or about 03-29-2024 Time 1:54 A.M Location: corner of S. 84th st. / W. Mitchell St. P.O. Cooper of the West Allis Police Department of Wisconsin pulled me over and immediately got out of his patrol vehicle and asked me to get out of the car. I asked him *"if he had an Articulate Reasonable Suspicion of me committing a crime"* - He stated *"no, the owner of this vehicle's license is suspended"*. I then told him *"that is not a crime, it is a traffic infraction and that I am not getting out of the car"* at this point I asked P.O. Cooper to call his Supervisor. P.O. Cooper asked me to turn off the car, unknowingly, turning off the car's engine automatically unlocked the car doors. P.O. Copper proceeded to pull open the driver side door and demanded me out of the vehicle, I attempted to close the door when P.O. Cooper blocked the door with the left side of his body. P.O. Lazaris informed me to *"get out of the car or we will tase you"*, I remained still with my hands on the steering wheel. P.O. Lazaris proceeded to tase me while P.O. Cooper pepper sprayed me. I then pulled the electric prongs out of me while P.O. Cooper continuously pepper sprayed me. Somehow, I am out of the car and body slammed on my back being handcuffed. While on the ground handcuffed P.O. Lazaris used direct contact with the taser on the left side of my stomach. He began hollering *"stop resisting"*, the voltage was so much I began to see light.

After the pain started to subside enough I turned my head to tell the P.O. Lazaris *"I'm down on the ground in handcuffs, stop electrocuting me"*. P.O. Lazaris proceed to tase me three more times than he got up. I was then helped up and told to get in the patrol vehicle, to which I responded *"I'm not getting in, I didn't commit a crime. Take these handcuffs off of me."* P.O.

Lazaris said "you getting in" while he grabbed my head and banged it on the patrol vehicle. I then said "okay, you busted my head, Am I bleeding"? An officer said "no". At this point I said "okay I'm going to get in the SUV", while in the patrol vehicle there was an unlawful seizure of my vehicle- which is a violation of my Fourth and Fifth Amendment rights.


The Supervisor of Officers Cooper and Lazaris instructed them to release me as I was free to go. Two officers who were not involved in the incident helped me to the ambulance stating "We didn't touch you, and we don't know what's going on, We were on perimeter duty and didn't see anything". The ambulance took me to the West Allis Hospital from where I was released.

I encountered a similar situation with some of the same officers from the West Allis Police Department a few months ago. I refused to get out of the vehicle and asked the officer to call his supervisor. I was roughed up and the vehicle I was in was unlawfully seized.

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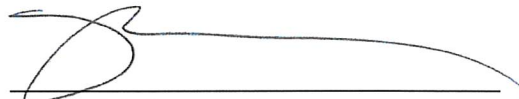

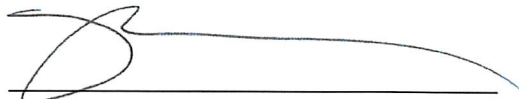

To Whom It May Concern,

I, John of the family Sloan of full life, hereby make the following **NOTICE OF CONDITION PRECEDENT**, that my Human and fourth, fifth, and eighth Constitutional Rights have been molested/violated, on or about 03-29-2024 Time 1:54 A.M Location: corner of S. 84th st. / W. Mitchell St. P.O. Cooper of the West Allis Police Department of Wisconsin pulled me over and immediately got out of his patrol vehicle and asked me to get out of the car. I asked him *"if he had an Articulate Reasonable Suspicion of me committing a crime"* - He stated *"no, the owner of this vehicle's license is suspended"*. I then told him *"that is not a crime, it is a traffic infraction and that I am not getting out of the car"* at this point I asked P.O. Cooper to call his Supervisor. P.O. Cooper asked me to turn off the car, unknowingly, turning off the car's engine automatically unlocked the car doors. P.O. Copper proceeded to pull open the driver side door and demanded me out of the vehicle, I attempted to close the door when P.O. Cooper blocked the door with the left side of his body. P.O. Lazaris informed me to *"get out of the car or we will tase you"*, I remained still with my hands on the steering wheel. P.O. Lazaris proceeded to tase me while P.O. Cooper pepper sprayed me. I then pulled the electric prongs out of me while P.O. Cooper continuously pepper sprayed me. Somehow, I am out of the car and body slammed on my back being handcuffed. While on the ground handcuffed P.O. Lazaris used direct contact with the taser on the left side of my stomach. He began hollering *"stop resisting"*, the voltage was so much I began to see light.

After the pain started to subside enough I turned my head to tell the P.O. Lazaris *"I'm down on the ground in handcuffs, stop electrocuting me"*. P.O. Lazaris proceed to tase me three more times than he got up. I was then helped up and told to get in the patrol vehicle, to which I responded *"I'm not getting in, I didn't commit a crime. Take these handcuffs off of me."* P.O.

Lazaris said "you getting in" while he grabbed my head and banged it on the patrol vehicle. I then said "okay, you busted my head, Am I bleeding"? An officer said "no". At this point I said "okay I'm going to get in the SUV", while in the patrol vehicle there was an unlawful seizure of my vehicle- which is a violation of my Fourth and Fifth Amendment rights.


The Supervisor of Officers Cooper and Lazaris instructed them to release me as I was free to go. Two officers who were not involved in the incident helped me to the ambulance stating "We didn't touch you, and we don't know what's going on. We were on perimeter duty and didn't see anything". The ambulance took me to the West Allis Hospital from where I was released.

I encountered a similar situation with some of the same officers from the West Allis Police Department a few months ago. I refused to get out of the vehicle and asked the officer to call his supervisor. I was roughed up and the vehicle I was in was unlawfully seized.

There being nothing further I hereby declare (verify, state, and confirm) under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing are true and correct.

Plaintiff John Sloan has filed an action in this court and has filed a motion for leave to proceed without prepayment of the filing fee pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915. ECF No. 2. AGREEMENT FOR PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES

This Agreement to make payments in lieu of taxes is made this ____ day of _____, 2025 (the “PILOT Agreement”) by and among the City of West Allis, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin, with principal offices at 7525 West Greenfield Avenue, West Allis, Wisconsin (the “City”), West Allis Memorial Hospital, Inc., a non-stock corporation with principal offices located at 8901 West Lincoln Avenue, West Allis, Wisconsin (“Memorial”), and Aurora Health Care, Inc., a nonstock domestic corporation with principal offices at 750 West Virginia Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin (“Aurora”).

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the City leases to Aurora land more particularly described in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the lease originally commenced with an agreement between the City and Memorial dated May 29, 1963, and was later amended by documents dated April 18, 1997, January 5, 2001, October 31, 2006, and March 3, 2016 to which amendments Aurora joined in execution thereof (collectively, the “Lease”); and

WHEREAS, the Lease contains provisions requiring payments in lieu of taxes to be made to the City and providing methods by which tax-exempt property shall be valued; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into that Stipulation Agreement between City of West Allis and Aurora Health Care, Inc. as to Valuations Applicable to Payments in Lieu of Taxes for Years 2020-2025 dated May 25, 2022 (the “Stipulation Agreement”) whereby the parties agreed to modify the terms of the Lease with respect to the assessed values used to determine payments in lieu of taxes for calendar years 2020 through 2025 inclusive; and

WHEREAS, the parties seek to replace the method by which the payment in lieu of taxes is calculated with a simplified method that promotes consistency and predictability in that payment amount while also reducing or eliminating the parties expenses associated with any dispute over the property payment amount;

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the City and Aurora agree to the following:

1. Suspension of PILOT Calculation Method. During the term of this PILOT Agreement, the Lease is hereby amended such that any provisions in the Lease that establish an amount payable in-lieu-of-taxes or a method to determine a payment-in-lieu-of-taxes after the date of this PILOT Agreement applicable to the time periods set forth in Section 2 below are suspended until January 1, 2031, at which point the provisions of the Lease with respect to payment-in-lieu-of-taxes accruing after such date shall thereafter be revived unless the parties agree otherwise. Any payments made prior to this date under those provisions are not affected by this provision. In addition to the foregoing, the parties hereby agree that this PILOT Agreement shall replace and supersede any conflicting provisions of the Stipulation Agreement with respect to the payment in lieu of taxes and calculations related

thereto for calendar year 2025. Except as set forth in this Section with respect to the Lease and the Stipulation Agreement, no other provisions of previous agreements between the parties other than any obligations to make a PILOT payment to the City are modified by this PILOT Agreement.

2. Payment-in-lieu-of-taxes. Each year during the term of this PILOT Agreement, Aurora shall make a payment-in-lieu-of-taxes to the City equal to the amounts stated below, representing an annual increase of 2.5% over the previous year's payment. Such payments shall be due and payable on the same deadlines established in state and local law for payment of general real estate taxes.

- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2025 and due January 31, 2026, the amount shall be \$461,161.00.
- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2026 and due January 31, 2027, the amount shall be \$472,690.00.
- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2027 and due January 31, 2028, the amount shall be \$484,507.00.
- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2028 and due January 31, 2029, the amount shall be \$496,620.0
- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2029 and due January 31, 2030, the amount shall be \$509,035.00.
- For the payment applicable to calendar year 2030 and due January 31, 2031, the amount shall be \$521,760.00.

3. Term. This PILOT Agreement shall be in effect only for the dates upon which payments have been identified above.

4. Miscellaneous. This payment is not designated to pay for a covered service as that term is used in Wis. Stat. § 66.0602(2m)(b)3.

SERVICE CONTRACT

This contract is made and entered into as of _____, 2025, by and between the West Allis Convention and Visitors Bureau, a nonprofit organization created pursuant to West Allis Municipal Code § 2.521 (the "CVB"), and the City of West Allis, a municipal corporation (the "City"), to provide City services to the CVB so it may achieve its objectives.

WHEREAS, since no tourism entity existed in West Allis on January 1, 2015, the CVB was created as a nonprofit organization under Wis. Stat. § 66.0615(1)(f)1. to provide the tourism promotion and tourism development services as well as destination marketing staff and services for the tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, the CVB is charged by ordinance with providing marketing efforts/services, including advertising, media buys, website management, creation of and distribution of printed or electronic promotional tourist materials, or efforts to recruit conventions, sporting events, or other groups; and

WHEREAS, the CVB is further charged with providing tourism promotion through marketing of projects and implementation of programs to promote the City, tourist informational services, and tourism development; and

WHEREAS, the CVB desires to accomplish its directives by contracting with the City and utilizing City resources, and the City is willing to provide such resources to the CVB;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the following mutual covenants and conditions, the parties agree as follows:

1. Term. This Contract shall commence upon the date listed below and shall be renewed annually unless terminated by one party providing notice to the other at least 90 days prior to the renewal date.
2. Services Provided. The City agrees to provide for the CVB certain destination marketing staff and services for the tourism industry in West Allis. The City further agrees to provide administrative services to the CVB for its marketing efforts, including services such as accounting, legal, human resources, and other supportive services.
3. Payment for Services.
 - a. For administrative services, the CVB shall pay to the City 49% of all revenues it receives.
 - b. For destination marketing staff and services for the tourism industry in West Allis, the CVB shall pay to the City, from the remaining 51% of its revenues, the commensurate cost of City staff fulfilling the service. The City shall determine the percentage of time City staff works as destination

marketing staff for the CVB; then the CVB shall annually compensate the City for the cost of such staff at a prorated amount based upon the cost of wage and fringe benefits for City staff who perform such services.

- 4. Farmers Market. As a primary destination in West Allis for special events that attract tourists, the CVB may utilize funding to create tangible municipal development at the West Allis Farmers Market.
- 5. Invalidity. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held or declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable under any law applicable thereto, such provision shall be deemed deleted from this Agreement or amended to legally effectuate the intent of the parties without impairing or prejudicing the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions hereof.

VJS asks Kueny as the Initial Decision Maker to determine that the soils constitute a changed condition, entitling VJS to recover its costs identified in COR-57 and to additional time to perform as shown in the Construction Schedule updated on May 14, 2025.

VJS Construction Services, Inc. (VJS) is in receipt of GeoTest's Geotechnical Engineering Report for Building 1 Remaining Area D locations dated July 18, 2025 (the Report). This letter serves as formal notice regarding concealed or unknown conditions affecting the City of West Allis Public Works project. In accordance with Specification 00 72 00 – AIA A201 General Conditions, Section 3.7.4 (Concealed or Unknown Conditions), Section 15.1.3 (Notice of Claims), Section 15.1.4 (Continuing Contract Performance), and Section 15.1.3 (Claims for Additional Cost), VJS formally submits this notice of such conditions. The application of this notice will be determined based on the pending findings and resolutions of such conditions.

Geotest's Report, consisted of drilling Borings B-23 through B-35, laboratory tests on selected retrieved soil samples, and a description of soil conditions. It is in Geotest's opinion that the soils conditions across the site are similar soil conditions to those at Boring B-10. It is believed that some borings exhibit conditions similar Boring B-10, however, the soils in Boring B-10 are not similar across the entire site.

Below are soil/soil related properties that need to be reviewed:

1.0 Organic Soils

Organic soil was encountered in Borings B-10, B-12, B-15, B-26, B-27, and B-28. The organic soil was encountered at depths between 3 to 8 feet but commonly found at an approximate depth of 3 feet. The organic soil ranged from approximately 2 to 4 feet thick, but the layer was approximately 2 feet thick in most cases. The organic soils typically have higher associated moisture contents ranging from 33.4 to 60 percent. Organic soils are known to be highly compressible under sustained loading conditions and have long-term settlement associated risks due to the decomposition of organic material. These conditions of organic soils, which were not found in the original borings from Geotest's initial preliminary geotechnical report, make these soil conditions vastly different across the site.

Lastly, “organic matter” was listed as encountered in Borings B-24 and B-34. Loss on Ignition (LOI) test appeared to be performed in the lean clay fill for Boring B-24 which indicated an organic content of 8 percent. The organic content should be taken into consideration for design of the project; however, it is believed this impact is minimal due to the layer only being approximately 2 feet thick and consisting of lean clay soil and not of organic soil. Additionally, only trace organics were found in Boring B-34 which does not seem indicative of having a strong presence of organic matter in the existing fill. Boring B-35 indicated an organic content of 2.6 percent, which is relatively low.

2.0 N-value and Compressive Strength (Q_p)

It should be noted that N-values and compressive strength of the soils from the Geotest latest Geotechnical Consulting Report only recorded the lowest values shown from the borings. N-values can range vastly throughout a single boring. For example, Boring B-27 exhibits a N-value of 1 blow per foot (bpf) at approximately 6-7.5 feet; however, the soil becomes denser at a depth of 8.5 feet with an N-value of 9 bpf. Recording the lowest value does not assess the entirety of the soil boring. Additionally, the lowest average N-value in the original borings (Borings B-1 through B-9) was 6.2 bpf compared to the additional borings (Borings B-10 through B-35) whose lowest average N-value was 3.75 bpf.

Similar to N-values, compressive strength tests also show variation throughout the borings. The consistency of clays appeared to be focused on the compressive strength values obtained from pocket penetrometers. The lowest pocket penetrometer values appear to be similar across the borings; however, it should also be noted that pocket penetrometers are not entirely accurate. The OSHA Technical Manual states that pocket penetrometers have error rates in the range of 20 to 40 percent. For a more accurate representation of clay soil consistency, unconfined compression tests could be performed from retrieved Shelby tube samples.

The original delegated design is justified based on the documents prior to bid. The additional borings (Borings B-10 through B-35) exhibit lower N-values, higher moisture contents, and higher organics (LOI) contents that were not present in the original drilled borings (Borings B-1 through B-9) and therefore should be treated as an unforeseen change in site conditions. In areas of softer soil and organic soils not present in the original borings, these have higher risks for settlement, and we recommend the remedial measures at foundation locations in the area of these borings. See below summary for boring locations where soil strengths/consistencies were lower than the borings used in the original design.

WHEREAS, WisDOT acknowledges and agrees that adaptive signals and other various traffic calming measures will help ensure the safety, accessibility and mobility for the traveling public in the PROJECT area.

WHEREAS, WisDOT will reimburse up to \$730,320 to the City of West Allis (CITY) to purchase and install equipment to mitigate traffic impacts of the PROJECT as outlined in the attached Agreement and as follows:

1. Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beason at 75th & Greenfield Ave
2. “No Traffic” signal equipment at 12 city signalized intersections to provide adaptive signal control and detection at key locations along the Greenfield Ave (WIS 59) corridor from S. 81st St. to S. 60th St. This new technology can optimize signal operation in real time using artificial intelligence.
3. Traffic calming measures such as temporary speed tables or other traffic control devices to be installed on residential streets experiencing increase traffic during construction

WHEREAS, the CITY will own, maintain, and operate the traffic mitigation equipment and be reimbursed by WisDOT for actual costs incurred and attributable to equipment and work performed as described in the AGREEMENT.

NOW THEREFORE, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Common Council of the City of West Allis that City staff are hereby authorized and directed to enter into the AGREEMENT with WisDOT for this project.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN

I-94 East-West Freeway Project

This agreement is made and entered into between the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DEPARTMENT) and the City of West Allis Department of Public Works (CITY) provides for services as described herein. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation and City of West Allis Department of Public Works are partnering during the I-94 East West Freeway Project (PROJECT) to ensure safer and more efficient travel in the City of West Allis.

The DEPARTMENT advises implementation of a comprehensive and cost-effective transportation management plan that will help ensure the safety, accessibility and mobility for the traveling public in the PROJECT area. The PROJECT area is defined as interstate IH 94 from 70th St on the west to 16th St on the east within the 3.26-mile project corridor. Included in the PROJECT area are local alternate route streets within two miles of the interstate roadways.

To mitigate traffic impacts caused by the PROJECT, the DEPARTMENT will provide **\$740,320**. to the CITY. In turn, the CITY will provide planning, coordination and staffing services (as outlined in Attachments A & B) in an effort to mitigate traffic impacts in the PROJECT area and stay informed of PROJECT roadway closures and construction progress for a 15-month period commencing on October 1, 2025 and ending on December 31, 2026.

The monies provided by this agreement will allow for dedicated staff to assist in:

- Pedestrian crossings utilizing rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFB)
- Signal timing and equipment enhancements
- Traffic calming measures

Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons

The CITY will purchase and install RRFB at the intersection of 75th and Greenfield Ave to replace the existing traffic signal at this location. That portion of the funds provided under this agreement which may be used for RRFB shall not exceed the amount of \$25,000.

Signal Timing and Equipment Enhancements

The CITY will provide and install adaptive signal control technology (ASCT) and vehicle detectors at key locations along Greenfield Ave (WIS 59) as outlined in Attachment A to be used in conjunction with signal timing improvements along Greenfield Ave.

The CITY will update traffic signal timings at intersections impacted by the PROJECT.

That portion of the funds provided under this agreement which may be used for signal timing improvements shall not exceed the amount of \$702,400.

Traffic Calming Measures

The CITY will implement traffic calming measures through the installation of temporary speed tables and temporary speed boards at key locations in the PROJECT area where requested. The determination of placement of the traffic calming devices shall be approved by the CITY and DEPARTMENT prior to installation.

That portion of the funds provided under this agreement which may be used for traffic calming improvements shall not exceed the amount of \$12,920.

Project Change Approval Process

For all signal hardware and traffic calming devices the CITY and DEPARTMENT shall agree upon the location(s) and specifications of proposed work. The CITY shall provide a benefit/cost analysis to the DEPARTMENT for work exceeding \$25,000. The DEPARTMENT will review the proposal and provide approval/disapproval for the work. For work changes under \$25,000, the DEPARTMENT requires approval prior to the CITY beginning the work. The CITY may perform work under this contract without prior agreement from the DEPARTMENT in the event of an emergency or unsafe condition.

Basis of Payment

The CITY shall charge actual costs incurred and attributable to the work performed and described above under this agreement to the DEPARTMENT. The DEPARTMENT will provide to the CITY reimbursable funding for these functions in the amount of **\$740,320**. Total reimbursement to the CITY for traffic mitigation measures under this agreement will not exceed **\$740,320**. Billings, or a billing, shall be directed monthly by the CITY as expenses are incurred to the attention of Stephanie Leraneth, Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Southeast Region, 141 NW Barstow Street P.O. Box 798, Waukesha WI, 53187-0798 and will include a statement of expenses supported by a description of items and services provided and expended. The DEPARTMENT shall pay the bill promptly upon receipt thereof.

Letter of Agreement Regarding I-94 E-W Traffic Signal Operation and Maintenance Between the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and The City of West Allis

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), an agency of the State of Wisconsin, and the City of West Allis, a municipal body corporate, enter into this Letter of Agreement (LOA) for purposes of installing and managing adaptive traffic signal technology associated with the reconstruction of the I-94 E-W Project in Milwaukee County.

WisDOT is reconstructing I-94 E-W from 70th St to 16th St, the STH 175 system interchange, and various underpasses as part of the I-94 E-W Project (the Project) and desires to partner with the City of West Allis (the City) to provide traffic congestion mitigation during construction. As part of that mitigation WisDOT desires to provide funds to the City to improve the operation of Greenfield Ave and National Ave. The improvements include traffic signal equipment replacement, traffic signal communication hardware, and vehicle detection equipment.

WisDOT and the City acknowledge and agree that the improvements to the intersections along Greenfield Ave (STH 59) are critical to managing traffic during the Project construction and that failure to update traffic signal timings and maintain the traffic signal equipment to the terms set forth herein could result in traffic management issues up to and including additional traffic congestion within and around the Project including within the City of West Allis.

Pursuant to the above-referenced common objectives, WisDOT and the City agree to the following:

- The City of West Allis will own, maintain, and operate the traffic signals and intersections listed on Attachment A
- The City of West Allis agrees to complete improvements of the traffic signal and intersection upgrades by February 1, 2026.
- The City of West Allis acknowledges that WisDOT is not obligated to provide funds for additional equipment purchases, operations, or maintenance, during the I-94 E-W Project
- The City of West Allis will perform regular operations, emergency and preventative maintenance on the equipment funded by WisDOT, installed and owned by the City.
- The City of West Allis commits to implementing updated traffic signal timing plans during the many stages and traffic switches of the I-94 E-W Project.
- WisDOT commits to provide the City of West Allis of upcoming I-94 E-W stage changes and traffic switches at least 2 weeks prior to the event.

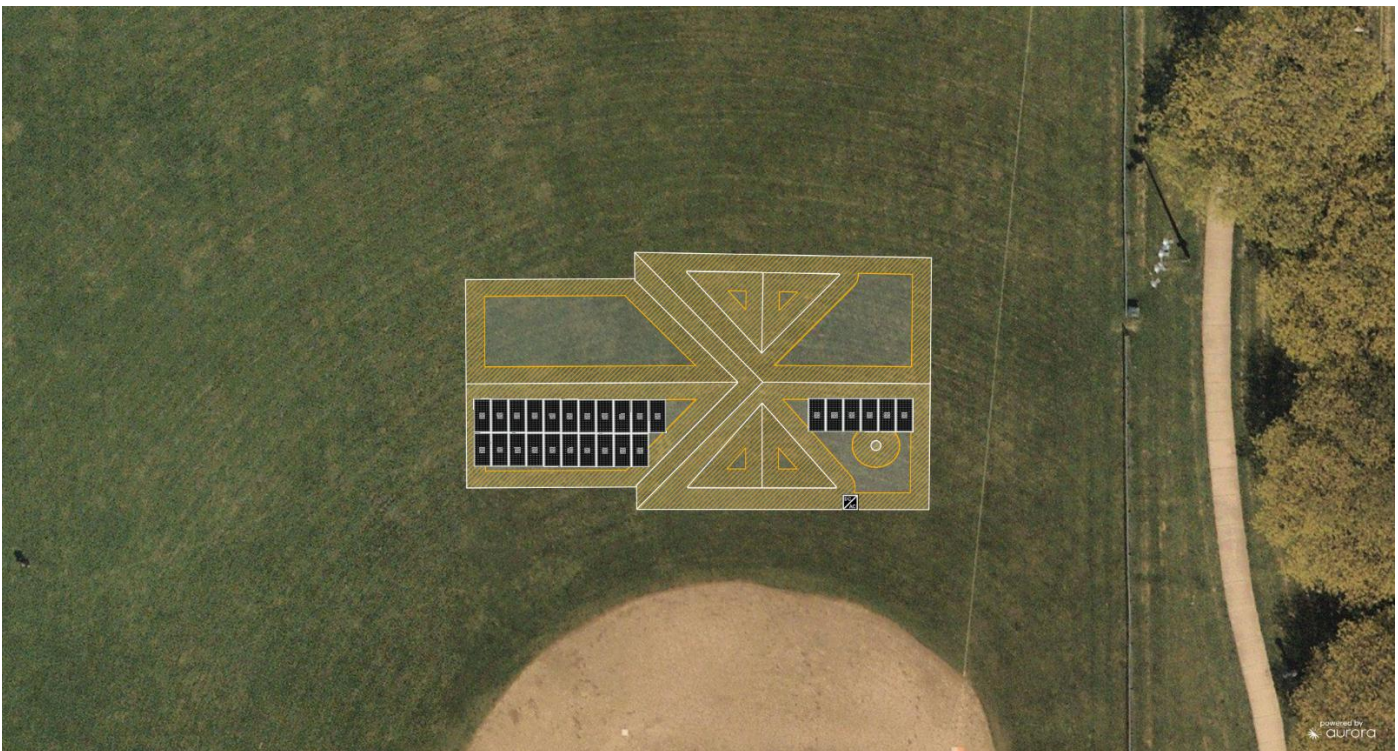

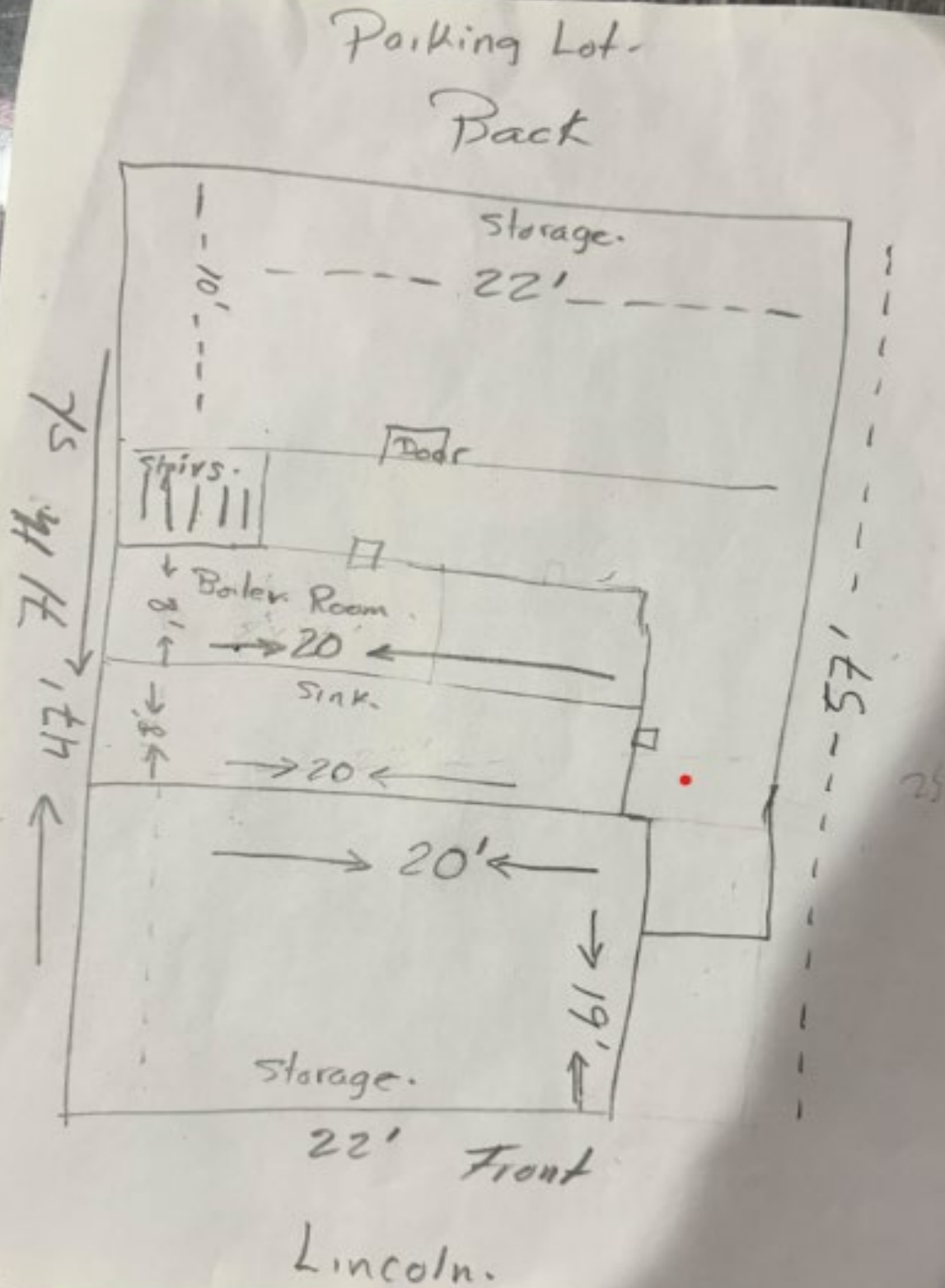

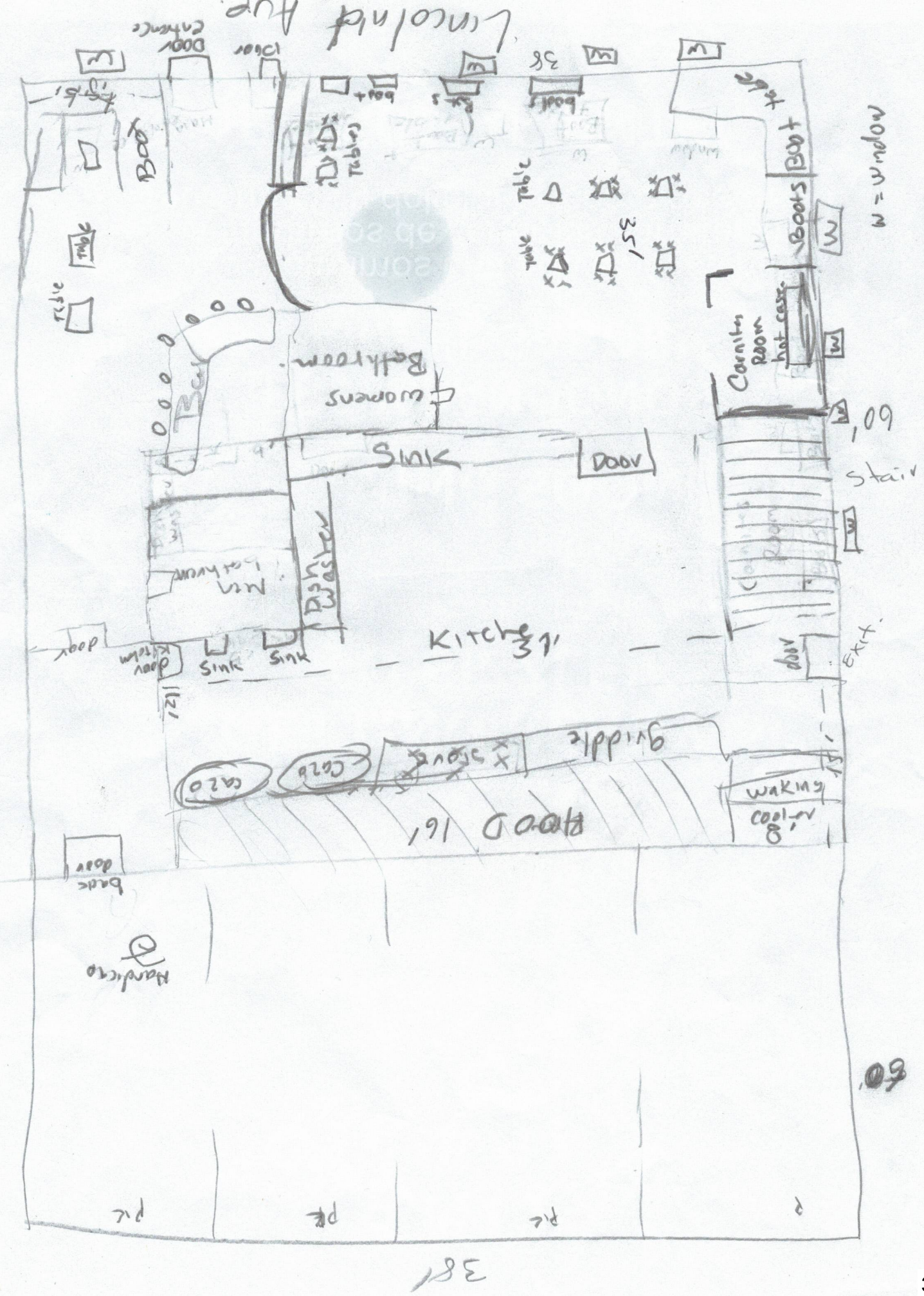

**ORDINANCE TO INCORPORATE STANDARD NOISE LEVEL LIMITS INTO
ALCOHOL LICENSING LAWS**

AMENDING SECTION 9.60

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. 125.10(1) allows any municipality to prescribe additional regulations for the sale of alcohol beverages, not in conflict with Wis. Stat. Ch. 125;

NOW THEREFORE, the common council of the City of West Allis do ordain as follows

SECTION 1: **AMENDMENT** “9.60 Alcohol Beverage” of the City Of West Allis Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

A M E N D M E N T

9.60 Alcohol Beverage

1. License Required. [Wis. Stat. 125.04\(1\)](#) is adopted.
2. Exceptions. [Wis. Stat. 125.06](#) is adopted.
3. Application Process. The application process under [Wis. Stat. Ch. 125](#) is adopted, except as modified below:
 - a. License Fee. An applicant shall pay the applicable license fee listed in the [Fee Schedule](#) prior to date on which the license is to be issued. If a license is not granted, any paid license fee shall be refunded.
 - b. New License Applications. At the time of filing a new application for a Class "A" license under [Wis. Stat. 125.25\(1\)](#), a "Class A" license under [Wis. Stat. 125.51\(2\)](#), a Class "B" license under [Wis. Stat. 125.26\(1\)](#), a "Class B" license under [Wis. Stat. 125.51\(3\)](#), or a "Class C" license under [Wis. Stat. 125.51\(3m\)](#), the applicant shall submit:
 - i. A nonrefundable inspection fee in the amount stated on the [Fee Schedule](#)
 - ii. A detailed floor plan for each floor of the premises, which shall include the following as applicable:
 - (1) Area in square feet and dimensions of the premises
 - (2) All entrances and exits to the premises together with a description of how patrons will enter the premises, the proposed location of the waiting line, and the location where security searches or identification verification will occur
 - (3) Locations of all seating areas, bars, and food preparation areas

- (4) Locations and dimensions of any alcohol beverage storage and display areas
 - (5) Locations and dimensions of any outdoor areas available at the premises for the sale, service, or consumption of alcohol beverages
 - (6) Location and dimensions of any outside area that where customers, employees, or persons associated with the premises may smoke
 - (7) The location of exterior and interior trash receptacles
 - (8) Any other reasonable and pertinent information the Public Safety Committee may require either for all applicants or in a particular case
- iii. A completed plan of operation for the business, which shall include as applicable:
 - (1) The hours of operation for the premises
 - (2) The legal capacity of the premises
 - (3) Methods for maintaining the appearance and operation of the premises with respect to noise and litter
 - (4) Any other business that will be conducted in connection with the premises.
 - (5) Any other licenses and permits sought for the premises.
 - (6) The number of security personnel expected to be on the premises, their responsibilities, and the equipment they will use in carrying out their duties.
 - (7) Any other reasonable information the Public Safety Committee may require either for all applicants or in a particular case.
- c. Time of Filing and Issuance. Pursuant to [Wis. Stat. 125.04\(3\)\(f\)2.](#), an application for a license to sell alcohol beverages and a request for a fixed full-service retail outlet shall be filed with the city clerk at least 15 days prior to the granting of the license or approval, except an application for a license issued under [Wis. Stat. 125.26\(6\)](#) or [125.51\(10\)](#) or a request for approval of an unlimited transfer full-service retail outlet shall be filed at least 5 business days prior to the granting of the license or approval.
- d. Restrictions on Issuance. No license may be issued to any person in violation of the provisions below. Any license issued in violation of a provision below is void.
 - i. Liquor Sales at Fuel Stations. No "Class A" license may be granted for any premises where gasoline or diesel fuel is sold at retail in connection with the premises, except that this restriction does not apply if any of the following applies:
 - (1) The "Class A" license contains the condition that retail sales of intoxicating liquor are limited to cider
 - (2) The premises for which the "Class A" license is issued is

connected to premises where gasoline or diesel fuel is sold at retail by a secondary doorway that serves as a safety exit and is not the primary entrance to the "Class A" premises.

ii. Overlapping Premises. No retail alcohol license may be issued to any person if the premises overlaps with another retail alcohol license.

iii. Premises Includes Right-of-Way. No retail alcohol license may be issued to any person if the permanent premises overlaps with a right-of-way. A temporary extension of premises may extend into the right-of-way if approved under this section.

e. Extension of Premises Application

i. Temporary Extension

(1) A licensee may apply for a temporary extension of premises by submitting a request to the city clerk in a form approved by the clerk and paying the fee listed on the [Fee Schedule](#).

(2) Each licensee shall provide a description of the temporary premises and any other information required by the city clerk. The seasonal term shall commence on the Friday preceding Memorial Day and expire on the Tuesday after Labor Day. The common council shall establish the term for any non-seasonal extension of premises.

(3) The common council shall determine whether to grant a request for temporary extension of premises under the same standards as a new license application. A temporary extension of premises creates a property interest only for the dates and times approved by the common council. Upon expiration of a temporary extension of premises, the temporary premises ceases to exist. Approval of a temporary extension of premises does not create a right to future approval.

ii. Permanent Extension. A licensee requesting a permanent extension shall pay the fee listed in the [Fee Schedule](#) at the time of the request. The council shall determine whether to grant the request for permanent extension of premises under the same standards as a new license application.

4. Regulations. The regulations in [Wis. Stat. Ch. 125](#) are adopted, except as modified below:

a. "Class B" Authorizations. Pursuant to [Wis. Stat. 125.51\(3\)\(b\)](#), a retail "Class B" license authorizes the sale of intoxicating liquor to be consumed by the glass on the premises where sold or off the premises if the licensee seals the container of intoxicating liquor with a tamper-evident seal before the intoxicating liquor is removed from the premises. The "Class B" license also authorizes the sale of intoxicating liquor in the original package or container, in any quantity, to be consumed off the premises where sold.

b. Outdoor Premises

i. Containers. No licensee may allow glass beverage containers in an outdoor premises.

- ii. Noise Limit. ~~No outdoor premises may be the source of sound that measures over 100 decibels (A-weighted) within 100 feet from the outdoor premises.~~ Licensees shall comply with WAMC 7.23 unless ~~T~~ the common council ~~may~~ sets different noise limits for a particular outdoor premises ~~if~~ and the affected licensee agrees to those alternate noise limits. If custom noise limits are set by the common council, licensees shall comply with those noise limits.
 - iii. Bordering. The border of any outdoor premises shall be physically marked with fencing, vegetation, barriers, or other objects or markings accurately indicating the limits of the outdoor premises.
 - iv. Lighting. Any lighting for an outdoor premises may not project directly to an area beyond the indoor and outdoor premises.
 - v. Closing Hours. No outdoor premises may remain open between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10 a.m. from Sunday through Thursday. No outdoor premises may remain open between the hours of 10 p.m. and 10 a.m. on Fridays and Saturdays. The common council may set different closing hours for a particular outdoor premises if the licensee agrees to those alternate closing hours.
- c. Conditions Specific to Licensee. The common council may impose the following conditions upon a particular new retail alcohol license at the time the license is granted or impose the following conditions upon a particular existing retail alcohol licensee only with the licensee's consent. No licensee may violate any condition specifically imposed upon that retail alcohol license.
 - i. The licensee shall conduct a principal business on the premises particularly described by the common council. Examples include those types of businesses described in [Wis. Stat. 125.32\(3m\)](#).
 - ii. The licensee shall maintain the property and premises so it is consistent with the landscaping and architectural design plans approved by the common council.
 - iii. The licensee shall video record all activities taking place on the premises, except within bathrooms and areas inaccessible to customers, and retain a copy of that video for at least 7 days. The video resolution must have at least 640 pixels horizontally and 480 pixels vertically. The licensee shall provide a copy of any video recording in the licensee's possession within 48 hours after receiving a request for video from a law enforcement officer.
 - iv. The licensee shall maintain certain security measures particularly described by the common council. Examples include lighting requirements, staffing minimums, and photographic identification scanners.
 - v. The licensee may not promote or conduct certain activities particularly described by the common council. Examples include live music and drink specials.

- d. Hours of Sale Limited. Between 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., no person may do any of the following:
 - i. Sell alcohol beverages on a Class "A" or "Class A" premises.
 - ii. Sell alcohol beverages on a Class "B" or "Class B" premises in an original unopened package, container, or bottle.
 - iii. Sell alcohol beverages on a Class "B" or "Class B" premises for consumption off the premises.
 - e. Presence After Hours. No licensee may allow any person to enter or remain on a premises licensed for retail alcohol sales during hours when the premises are not open for business, unless that person is the licensee, employees of the licensee, salespersons for the licensee, or service personnel for the licensee if those persons are performing job-related activities.
 - f. Underage Persons on Premises
 - i. No licensee may allow underage person to enter or remain on Class "B" or "Class B" premises under [Wis. Stat. 125.07\(3\)\(a\)10](#), unless the licensee has notified the police chief at least 7 days in advance of the times underage persons will be allowed on the premises.
 - ii. A licensee may allow an underage person to enter or remain on a temporary Class "B" premises under [Wis. Stat. 125.26\(6\)](#).
 - iii. A licensee may allow an underage person to enter or remain on a temporary "Class B" premises under [Wis. Stat. 125.51\(10\)](#) only for the purpose of acting as a designated driver and only if the licensee requires the underage person to display a means of identification, such as a wrist band, to identify underage persons as designated drivers.
 - g. Full-Service Retail Outlets. Unless specifically excepted, all regulations applicable to Class "B" premises shall be applicable to all full-service retail outlets that are approved to sell fermented malt beverages, all regulations applicable to "Class B" premises shall be applicable to all full-service retail outlets that are approved to sell intoxicating liquor, and all regulations applicable to "Class C" premises shall be applicable to all full-service retail outlets that are approved to sell wine.
5. Discipline Process. [Wis. Stat. 125.12](#) is adopted. In addition and to the extent allowed by law, the disciplinary events in [WAMC 9.51\(1\)\(a\)-\(e\)](#) are adopted under [Wis. Stat. 125.10](#) and shall be grounds for revocation, suspension, or nonrenewal of a license under [Wis. Stat. 125.12\(2\)\(ag\)1](#).

SECTION 2: **EFFECTIVE DATE** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the required approval and publication according to law.
