Resolution Authorizing City Attorney to File a Complaint with the Office of Commissioner of Railroads against Union Pacific Railroad Company for repair of railroad crossings located in S. 55 St. and S. 57 St.

This resolution relates to the following railroad crossings located in the City of West Allis:

- S. 55 St., U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177234U at Milepost 85.58 of the Milwaukee Subdivision at West Allis, WI
- · S. 57 St., U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177235B at Milepost 85.71 of the Milwaukee Subdivision at West Allis, WI

Whereas, pursuant to a report of the City Engineer and in accordance with Wis. Stat. §86.12(1), on August 1st, 2006, the Common Council of the City of West Allis passed a resolution (R-2006-0192) requiring the Union Pacific Railroad Company to repair the railroad crossings identified above located in the City of West Allis and further authorized the City Administrative Officer/Clerk/Treasurer to serve a copy of said resolution upon Union Pacific Railroad Company and all other state and federal officials as required by Wisconsin State Statutes; and,

Whereas, on or about August 29th, 2006, the City Administrative Officer, Clerk/Treasurer served a copy of the August 1st, 2006, resolution (R-2006-0192) by certified mail on the Union Pacific Railroad Company; and,

Whereas, more than thirty (30) days have elapsed since said notice and to date, the Union Pacific Railroad Company has failed to make any repairs whatsoever to said railroad crossings; and,

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of West Allis may file a complaint with the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads alleging the failure of Union Pacific Railroad Company to honor the terms of the resolution and request an investigation into this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. §86.12(2).

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of West Allis that the Office of the City Attorney is hereby authorized to file a complaint and handle all legal matters associated with the same, on behalf of the Common Council, with the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads in accordance with Wis. Stat. §86.12(2) for the investigation and ultimate improvement of the railroad crossings in S. 55 and S. 57 Streets as herein described.

Michael G. Lewis, being first duly sworn on oath, states the following:

- That I am the City Engineer for the City of West Allis and have held said position since June of 2000.
 - 2. That the following railroad crossings are located in the City of West Allis, Wisconsin:
 - S. 55 St., U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177234U at Milepost 85.58 of the Milwaukee Subdivision at West Allis, WI
 - S. 57 St., U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177235B at Milepost 85.71 of the Milwaukee Subdivision at West Allis, WI
 - 3. That said railroad crossings are the property of Union Pacific Railroad Company.
- 4. That said railroad crossings are in need of immediate repairs and replacements; that the current condition of the railroad crossings are hazardous and present a danger to the community at large, as well as vehicles traveling over and about said crossings; that photographs of the current condition of said railroad crossings taken by an employee of my department on August 22nd, 2006, are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A".
- 5. That said railroad crossings have been in a state of disrepair for over a two (2) year period; that the City's Engineering Department has made attempts to work with Union Pacific Railroad Company employees dating back to 2005 to repair said railroad crossings.
- 6. That to date, despite a verbal commitment in 2005 by Tom Hazeltine, Engineering Supervisor for Union Pacific Railroad Company, that the crossings would be repaired, Union Pacific Railroad Company has taken no action whatsoever to repair said crossings.

That as a result of the hazardous condition of the railroad crossings, on August 1st, 2006, the Common Council of the City of West Allis, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §86.12(1) passed a resolution authorizing myself to require the Union Pacific Railroad Company to install new prefabricated concrete crossings; that a copy of Resolution No. R-2006-0192 is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "B".

8. That in accordance with Wis. Stat. §86.12(1) the City Administrative Officer/Clerk/Treasurer for the City of West Allis served a copy of the above stated resolution (Exhibit "A"), by certified mail, upon the local agent of the Union Pacific Railroad Company; that a copy of said letter dated August 29th, 2006, serving the resolution, is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "C".

9. That more than thirty (30) days have elapsed since the service of said resolution on the Union Pacific Railroad Company; that to date, despite said resolution, no action whatsoever has been taken by the Union Pacific Railroad Company to fix and/or repair said railroad crossings.

10. That I make this Complaint pursuant to Common Council Resolution No. R-2007-0076 and Wis. Stat. §86.12(2) and request the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads to formally investigate this matter in controversy as provided in Chapter 195 of the Wisconsin Statutes and issue an Order to Union Pacific Railroad Company directing it to install new prefabricated concrete crossings at the locations described herein; that a copy of Resolution No. R-2007-0076 authorizing the City Attorney to handle this matter on behalf of the Common Council is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "D".













Resolution authorizing and directing the City Engineer to require the Union Pacific Railroad Company to install new prefabricated concrete crossings.

S. 55 Street, U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177234U at milepost 85.58 of the Milwaukee subdivision at West Allis, Wisconsin, and

S. 57 Street, U.S. DOT Crossing No. 177235B at milepost 85.71 of the Milwaukee subdivision at West Allis, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, The City Engineer's Office has complained to Union Pacific Railroad for approximately two years about the poor condition of the crossings and obtained a commitment from the railroad to make repairs in 2005; and

WHEREAS, The City Engineer's Office has been informed by Union Pacific Railroad that repairs will be delayed, possible until 2007; and

WHEREAS, The Common Council of the City of West Allis believes that the above captioned railroad crossings in S. 55 Street and S. 57 Street are in need of immediate repairs and should be replaced; and

WHEREAS. The Union Pacific Railroad Company is obligated by State Statute 86.10(1) to keep the surface of the crossing between the tracks and rails and extending 4 feet on either side of the outside rails, in good condition and repair for highway travel; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of West Allis may require Union Pacific Railroad Company to repair and improve the crossing by the authority of State Statutes 86.12(1).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Common Council of the City of West Allis that Union Pacific Railroad is hereby required to repair said railroad crossings and that the City Administrative Officer/Clerk/Treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to serve a copy of this resolution upon Union Pacific Railroad Company and all other appropriate State and Federal officials as required by State Statutes 86.12(1) for the improvement of the railroad crossings in S. 55 Street and S. 57 Street, as therein described.

Dear Mr. Wilwerding:

Enclosed please find Resolution No. R-2006-0192, adopted on August 1, 2006, directing Union Pacific Railroad to make repairs to the subject railroad crossings. We have been complaining to Union Pacific for two years about the poor condition of the crossings. The Engineering Department finally received a commitment from the railroad to make repairs in 2005. The Engineering Department has been informed by Union Pacific Railroad that repairs will be delayed, possible until 2007, which is unacceptable. Therefore the enclosed resolution was unanimously adopted on August 1, 2006.

The Engineering Department has reported that the crossing at S. 80th Street, No. 177236H, is still in poor condition. This was previously mentioned in a letter on August 19, 2004.


