Re: Notification of 2012 Approved ALS Billing Rates

Attached, please find a chart listing the approved countywide Advanced Life Support (ALS) billing rates for 2012. I am providing the list for your information only, and no action is required by your Council.

Advanced Life Support billing rates are determined by through work of the Emergency Medical Services committee of the Milwaukee County Association of Fire Chiefs (MCAFC) after consultation with our medical director, various local billing agents and Milwaukee County EMS staff. EMS committee recommendations were subsequently approved by the MCAFC.

After receiving MCAFC approval, the rates are submitted to the Milwaukee County Intergovernmental Cooperation Council (ICC). That group, comprised of all Milwaukee County Mayors and Village Presidents, approved the rates at their February 13th meeting.

Once approved by the ICC, rates are set for Milwaukee County, and all municipalities who provide ALS care and transport through participation in the Milwaukee County Paramedic contract must charge the approved rates. Each municipality however, is responsible for their own billing, and therefore collection methods or strategies may vary by community.

I've submitted a similar communication to the Board of Police and Fire Commission for their information as well. I've also notified our EMS billing agent, *LifeQuest*. *LifeQuest* President, Jerry Miller has confirmed that the rates will begin as directed, on March 1, 2012.

Hopefully, I've provided sufficient information to help you understand the rate setting and collection process. If you have further questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me, or my Assistant Chief of Emergency Medical Services, Steve Bane.

Advanced Life Support billing rates are determined by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Council (ICC) after a review of suggestions from the Milwaukee County Association of Fire Chiefs (MCAFC). MCAFC consults with the Milwaukee County EMS medical director, local billing agents and Milwaukee County EMS staff. These rates were approved by the ICC at their February 13, 2012 regular meeting.

The ICC sets rates for all municipalities who provide ALS care and transport through participation in the Milwaukee County Paramedic contract. All participants must charge the approved rates. Each municipality however, is responsible for their own billing, and therefore collection methods or strategies may vary by community.
