Dear Mayor and Council members,

In fiscal year 2003, the U.S. Congress once again appropriated money for distribution through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) "Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program". Grants are currently being awarded to those fire departments that can demonstrate a need and are able to articulate their use of the funding with respect to fire fighter safety and departmental effectiveness.

With limited funding available, applications have been very competitive in nature. In addition, cities are again required to commit matching funds. For cities our size, a 70% - 30% matching of funds is required, in which we would be responsible for providing 30% of the total. This is similar to the \$101,580 grant we received in 2001 and the \$55,010 grant we received from the 2002 funds.

Even though we had received a grants in 2001 and 2002, and the likelihood of repeating was very small, we applied for funding in the area of enhancing our fire station safety equipment. We have been researching vehicle exhaust systems for some time, and have identified this as a weaker facet of our delivery of emergency care. Although we have used WE Energies funds for this equipment in previous station projects, the equipment qualifies for funds at Fire Station 2 and for the money spent previously to enhance the systems.

Assistant Chief Martin King was our contact person and was responsible for writing the grant application and providing justification. Our intent was:

- 1. to provide efficient exhaust removal systems,
- 2. improve fire station safety.

Recently, we were notified that our department has been selected to receive a grant through this program. FEMA has approved project costs in the amount of \$158,050. The federal portion of

this grant is \$110,635, and the City's responsibility will be \$47,415. I've attached the communications AC King received, informing us of the grant award.

I have received approval from the Board of Police and Fire Commissioners to seek your consent to provide the \$47,415 in order for us to accept the grant. Funds for the City's portion of the grant are already contained within the building portion of the fire station's budget contingency. The grant enhances project funds that are being spent on our remodeling and renovation project. Please see the attached information from FEMA as well as my PFC request.

If you have any questions or concerns about the FEMA Fire Act Grant program or our grant in particular, please feel free to contact me. I look forward to your Council's approval of our request, and to provide this equipment for our fire and EMS responders as soon as possible.

# Article I - Project Description
