REVIEW BY CITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF DEPARTMENT REQUESTS TO FILL POSITION VACANCIES

This form should be attached to your memorandum to me when requesting that a position vacancy be filled. Responses to the questions noted below are sufficient for review purposes.

Upon receipt of this form, I send it to the members of the Administration & Finance Committee/Common Council for approval. Upon approval, I will notify you in writing that the request has been approved and the vacancy can be filled. If there are questions, please call.

- 1. Position Title: Electrical Inspector II
- 2. Department/Division: Building Inspection & Neighborhood Services
- 3. Vacancy Date: December 6, 2013
- 4. Vacancy Reason: Current employee resigned
- 5. a. What are the specific work responsibilities of the position?

 To inspect all electrical installations for compliance with the State Electrical Code.
 - b. How many other such positions exist in this Department? One other Electrical Inspector.
- 6. What are the reasons why the position must be filled?

State and local codes require permits and inspection of electric work. Inspections provide for a high degree of safety in our built environment.

- 7. What will be the impacts on service functions if the position were not filled?
 - a. Service to the public. Records indicate the City issues approx. 1,750 electric permits per year and makes 3,900 inspections per year (5 year average 2008-2012). Electrical contractors require timely inspection of work they have paid permit fees for service. Timely inspections are for safety as job construction sites.
 - b. Service to staff. The amount of electrical inspection work (\pm 1,750 permits/year and \pm 3,900 inspections/year) cannot be accomplished by the one other Electrical Inspector.
- 8. What is the fiscal impact related to filling this vacancy?

The position probably will be filled at an Electrical Inspector I position and later upgraded to Electrical Inspector II. Salary Electrical Inspector I, \$59,155 to \$66,560, and Electrical Inspector II, \$60,902 to \$68,600 (for R Schedule 2013).

9. Remarks/Comments:

Two Electrical Inspector positions are necessary for the size and age of our community. Electrical Contractors demand timely inspection services. Other construction trades also rely on timely service to keep construction projects moving forward on time.
