
A new part-time employee was hired by the School District. He is Dylan Wilbur, a 2006 graduate of Central High, and he was also very active in the video clubs at the elementary and high school level. He will be working on producing programs with a district wide focus, as well as working with students and staff in the individual schools to help them produce programming.

The School District utilized their own district funds to purchase a new video bulletin board system, because there are only enough funds through the access grant to cover the salaries of two part-time employees.

Channel 13 staff videotaped the graduations ceremonies for Hale and Central High Schools, and will show them throughout the summer. Their staff is still working on a documentary examining the District's values as they relate to the education of students. This is their biggest project to date and represents over 200 hours of staff time. It will be shown to the teaching staff on August 30th and then shown on Channel 13.

It is staff's recommendation to continue the funding for the educational access operations.
