Re: 4th Quarter Funding for Educational Access

The School District is continuing to increase its levels of programming on Channel 13. Presently there are 12 video club advisors working with aproximately 100 students ranging in age from 9 to 19. Since September the clubs have produced 25 programs, such as quiz shows based on academic studies, concerts, sporting events and classroom projects. The students are scripting, videotaping and editing the programs.

The School District's Information Office is also producing programs on special education projects, staff-development, in-service sessions and the district's budget challenges. They are currently working on a program about the No Child Left Behind Act. Channel 13 Sports has produced 12 high school football, volleyball and basketball games for both Central and Hale.

The video clubs are receiving training from the Information Office's video production assistant. A district wide video team is being formed and should commence work by the end of January.

The future goals of Channel 13 are to enhance and update their broadcast equipment to accommodate the increased demand and usage by the distict video team and school video clubs.

After reviewing the School District activities relating to the educational access channel, I recommend that the fourth quarter funding for educational access television operations be granted.
