None of these jobs paid well however, and after many years of applying for decent factory work and getting turned down for safety reasons, I had decided that enough was enough.

Friends of mine that I had gone to school with at Wisconsin school for the visually handicapped in Janesville had started working at Beyond Vision and told me that it was a decent place to work, paid well, had steady hours, and offered opportunities for advancement. After some thought and some planning, I decided to leave the upper peninsula and move to West Allis so that I could get a job with Beyond Vision.

Since working here, I have been able to make a good enough income to get approved for a home loan. I was named "Employee of the Year" in 2019 and promoted to a lead position assembling deployment kits for the United States Army.

Some people take a decent paying steady job for granted, but I am definitely not one of those people. I am thankful for my company, which is why I am sending you this communique.

I am certainly not the only person who has benefitted greatly from employment at Beyond Vision. Our new location in West Allis will be a magnet for new West Allis residents who are motivated to contribute and maximize their potential as leaders.

I sincerely hope that you take my words into consideration.
