Explanation by Michael Lewis, Director of Public Works/City Engineer.

Appearances:

Jenny Jezo, 11710 W. Hayes Ave., represented her mother, objected to the project. She provided a history of the subdivision, the school, and parking. She said that she is represented by Attorney Finerty, and said the project offers no benefits to the residents. She commented on events held by the school that create high traffic, and addressed the State Fair use of the school property compounding the nuisance issue for the residents. She said that the City allows the street to be used as a thoroughfare, and that the street was not engineered or intended for commercial use. She said that the City and the WAPD continue to allow trucking and speeding on the street and loitering, littering and vandalizing by the students. She addressed her concerns with regard to safety for the residents. She asked further questions regarding a feasibility study, benefits, road design and bond rating. She requested a Town Hall meeting.

Ida Bolton, 2316 S. 85 St., said that school buses use the street, and the street was not made for this type of traffic. She asked about the time frame and using Central High School's parking

lot.

Nancy Bryce, 11712 W. Cleveland Ave., agreed with everything Jenny Jezo said. She said that when she bought the property, she did not know the street would be a main road. She said that she cannot use her driveway between 3:00 and 3:30, and that her house vibrates from the street being used as a thoroughfare. She stated that the road is used by the entire school district, and asked why the residents bear the brunt of the cost. She said the cost for the street improvement should be dispersed throughout the entire city based on who benefits from the improvement.

Les Takkinen, 2611 S. 117 St., Pastor from Grace Bible Church, said he is not opposed to the project, and that the Public Works Department has done well in trying to maintain the street. He understands the need for the repair, and asked that those involved do the best job possible in assessing and repair so that the street lasts a long time.
