RE: West Allis Skate Park Update

Dear Mayor Devine and Members of the Common Council:

Project Update:

On 6/19 Vincent Onel of Spohn Ranch Skateparks visited the City of West Allis. Several sites were visited including Radtke Park, Veterans Park and Liberty Heights Park. While all sites were good candidates for the skatepark location, after Vincent's discussion with his design team, it was confirmed that Radtke Park was the best candidate.

Positives:

- Good Visibility – The site is highly visible and can be easily patrolled by parents and law enforcement. The vision for this park is to create a sculptural and aesthetically-intriguing space. By locating it in a prominent thoroughfare like this, the entire community can appreciate and embrace it.

- Active Space – We would be taking a space that is currently under-utilized and transforming it into a vibrant space for youth.

- Accessibility - The site is very central in West Allis. It is very accessible via car, bus, bike and foot.

- Sound Impact – The park is located a good distance from residential homes, minimizing any issues with excessive noise.

- Potential – The site has some existing topography that we can use to our advantage. The park also already has a nice character with trees and landscaping that will contribute to the uniqueness and aesthetic appeal of the skatepark.

- Space – Since we aren't encroaching on other recreational facilities, we have plenty of space to work with. While a few trees may need to be moved, the majority of them will stay put.



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Potential Negatives:

- Parking – Since Radtke Park doesn't have an existing parking lot, this was an initial concern. With further analysis however, we are confident that surrounding areas will provide enough parking for the skatepark. Adding some parking spots along National was also discussed.

- Restrooms – While on-site restrooms are ideal, countless skateparks around the country function without restrooms so we don't view this as a deal-breaker for the site. The surrounding areas provide a good number of options for restrooms. Port-a-potties were also discussed.

Spohn Ranch has lined up a surveyor and geotechnical engineering firm that will provide additional information relating to the site. This work will commence shortly.
