		The following discussion took place.
		Ald. Lajsic stated that a petition from the neighbors was submitted in favor of the expansion and transitional use.
		Ald. Kopplin opposed the resolution. He does not support the encroachment into a residential neighborhood especially since this position has been defended in Court and the Court has upheld the City's position on that principle.
		Ald. Vitale supported the resolution, and said that the neighbors are in favor of the expansion of the parking lot. He supports the growth of the business.
		Ald. Lajsic said that a past decision on this issue was not unanimous, and stated it was the right of the previous owner to raze the house. Following the sale of the business, he stated the neighbors have come to the understanding that expanded parking would be an advantage to the neighborhood. The proposal is an asset to the neighborhood and will alleviate congestion. The lot will offer a landscaped view.
		Ald. Weigel indicated the proposal will have a net gain of three to five parking spaces. The proposal may not have a major impact on off-street parking.
		Ald. Reinke mentioned that the owners and managers of the restaurant are nice and caring people. However, this is the third time the request has come before the Council, and a lawsuit takes up the attorney's time and taxpayers' money in court. She indicated that nothing has changed with the restaurant except the hours of operation. Ald. Reinke mentioned that the support in the neighborhood in not consistent. She mentioned there is available parking in another lot across the street, and handicapped parking could be accommodated on-site.
		Ald. Narlock said that the proposal would have safety benefits related to parking and commented on the support from the neighborhood.
		Ald. Barczak made a comparison with the rezoning ordinance that was passed regarding car washes and the support and opposition that ordinance received. He said that there is overwhelming support of the current proposal. The neighbors are happy with the business, the appearance of the business, the planned landscaping, and the way it is run. Ald. Barczak also mentioned that the leased parking spaces across the street will remain providing for additional off-street parking.
