On 11/2/20 at 1709hrs I responded Crooked Crow, 1309 S. 60 St, for a white female causing a disturbance and threatening to shoot up the bar. Upon arrival I made contact with the female, identified as Caitlynn B. Montijo, f/w, [REDACTED] who continued to yell and swear inside the bar. The complainant, Taylor P. Rusniak, m/w, [REDACTED] said Caitlynn refused to leave when asked and threatened to shoot up the bar. Taylor wanted Caitlynn arrested for disorderly conduct. Caitlynn was arrested/cited for DC. Her court date is 12/14/20.

On 11/07/20 at approx. 0115hrs. while on patrol I observed a disturbance outside of Stallywood, 6827 W. During my contact with Lindsey she resisted arrest and was placed into handcuffs. Lindsey was arrested for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting but ultimately she was conveyed back to her residence and turned over to her mother. Officer Komorowski Reports...

While at the substation I was approached by Tony Damato who was complaining about a black Dodge truck parked in the Stallywood parking lot. Tony believed this was related to a civil issue with a prior girlfriend, and somehow he owned the truck. Tony demanded that we tow the vehicle from the lot because he believed it was his. Tony appeared highly intoxicated and when I told him the vehicle would not be towed he said he would take things into his own hands. A short time later the manager from Stallywood, Tina M. Hamelin, came to the substation to report Tony was causing a disturbance in the bar. I went to the bar, but Tony was gone. I ran the registration of the truck Tony was spoke of previously which did not list to him. I went to Tony's residence and spoke with him there. Tony was uncooperative and continued to act highly intoxicated. Tony was advised he was no longer welcome at Stallywood, and a flag was entered indicating he was banned from the business. Outside of Tony's home was his silver Dodge 3500 which he said previously had the plate belonging to the other Dodge truck. Tony's Dodge had no license plates on it because the plates had been seized by WAPD because they were reported stolen.
