Upon any one speaker reaching the allotted five (5) minutes, the Clerk shall announce "Time," and the presiding officer shall ask the speaker to conclude

his/her remarks. Any speaker so informed who continues to address the Council shall be considered to have created a disturbance under Subsection 3.01(a) of the West Allis Revised Municipal Code. Upon conclusion of the one-half (1/2) hour total time (and after a speaker has concluded), the Clerk shall announce that the time for citizen statements has expired. This portion of the meeting shall then end unless an Alderperson moves to extend the time, the motion is seconded, and a majority of the Council present and voting votes to extend the time. An individual's time may not be extended
