### 1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

- AB173**      **JOINT COMMITTEE ON STATE MANDATES**  
FAVOR (with change specifying that minimal fiscal effect means over \$1,000 per local government), because the bill requires funding of mandates.
- AB194**      **RIGHT TO CONTEST PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT WHEN**  
**ASSESSOR DENIED ENTRY**  
Refer to Chuck Ruud.
- AB198**      **ALLOWING MUNICIPALITIES TO CREATE COMBINED**  
**PROTECTIVE SERVICES DEPARTMENTS**  
No position.
- AB212**      **TEMPORARILY EXCLUDING IMPROVEMENTS TO A PRINCIPAL**  
**DWELLING FROM THE ASSESSMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES**  
OPPOSE, because the bill removes from taxation property improvements made, thus lowering tax base growth.

- AB216**      **COLLECTION OF DATA CONCERNING MOTOR VEHICLE STOPS, LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING STANDARDS, AND GRANTING RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY**  
Refer to Dean Puschnig.
- AB221**      **ASSESSING AND COLLECTING PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES ON MOBILE HOMES**  
Refer to Chuck Ruud.
- AB236**      **EXEMPTING LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FROM THE MOTOR VEHICLE FUEL TAX**  
FAVOR, because the bill would save the City money by exempting gasoline and diesel fuel from state excise taxes.
- AB141**      **LOWERING LEGAL DRINKING AGE FOR CERTAIN PERSONS**  
Refer to Dean Puschnig.

**2.      REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION**

- AB161**      **ALLOWING MUNICIPALITIES TO SOLICIT PROCUREMENT BIDS BY ELECTRONIC AUCTION**  
No position.
- AB92**      **EVIDENCE OF BEING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF AN INTOXICANT**  
FAVOR, because the bill would make .08 BAC prima facie evidence that a person is under the influence of an intoxicant for all OWI offenses.

SB85**      **FIRE HOSE CROSSING IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION**  
FAVOR, because the bill would also add training scenes to emergencies where crossing fire hoses is prohibited, thus protecting fire fighters from injury as well as protecting the fire hose.

AB174**      **LIMITS ON DESIGNATION OF ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT ZONES**  
FAVOR, because the bill would allow creation of more, new enterprise zones.
- SB75**      **NOTARY PUBLIC FEES**  
FAVOR, because the bill would update the amounts notaries are allowed to charge for their services.
