Resolution Authorizing Entering into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement for Use and Distribution of Proceeds from Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources "Round One" Recycling Efficiency Incentive Grants.

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the City of West Allis enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with the City of Wauwatosa and the Villages of Butler, Lannon, Menomonee Falls, and Sussex to collaborate in efforts to improve recycling and waste reduction; and,

WHEREAS, such intergovernmental cooperation will allow said municipalities to become a full partner in the Southeast Wisconsin Waste Reduction Coalition and be eligible for a Recycling Efficiency Incentive Grant from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources; and,

WHEREAS, the receipt of the grant and participation in the program will benefit the citizens of the City of West Allis.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Comptroller be and are hereby authorized to enter into the Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, and deliver the aforesaid Agreement on behalf of the City of West Allis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the necessary funds have been provided to pay the liability that may be incurred by the City of West Allis under the aforesaid Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Attorney be and is hereby authorized to make such changes, modifications, additions and deletions to and from the various provisions of the aforesaid Agreement, including any and all attachments, exhibits, addendums and amendments as may be necessary and proper to correct inconsistencies, eliminate ambiguity and otherwise clarify and supplement said provisions to preserve and maintain the general intent thereof, and to prepare and deliver such other and further documents as may reasonably necessary to complete the transaction contemplated therein.

# Intergovernmental Agreement for Use and Distribution of Proceeds from Wisconsin DNR "Round One" Recycling Efficiency Incentive Grants

This agreement is made by and between the Cities of Wauwatosa and West Allis, and the Villages of Butler, Lannon, Menomonee Falls, and Sussex, each of which is a municipal corporation, and each of which is a Responsible Unit as defined in Section 287.01(9) of the Wisconsin Statutes, (collectively referred to as the "Responsible Units" or "RUs") for purposes of allocating responsibilities and costs in relation to application and administration of a "Round One" Recycling Efficiency Incentive Grant ("Grant") from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, pursuant to Section 287.235, Stats, and Wisconsin Administrative Code Section NR 549, during the year 2003.

WHEREAS the RUs desire to collaborate in an effort! to significantly improve recycling and waste reduction information/education efforts, and

WHEREAS the Southeast Wisconsin Waste Reduction Coalition ("SEWWRC"), has implemented programs combining the expertise and resources of local communities, state agencies, non-profit organizations, schools and businesses through regionally coordinated waste reduction and recycling programs, and

WHEREAS the RUs could achieve new efficiencies through SEWWRC by establishing themselves, as a group, as a new "Full Partner" in SEWWRC (the "Membership"), and thereby make collective use of SEWWRC's programming efforts, including the following:

- > improve participation in area recycling and yard material programs
- promote waste reduction to help lower solid waste costs
- > conduct outreach to schools and community groups
- > develop and distribute printed, electronic, and media materials
- > answer phone calls and respond to other contacts
- > update area websites and electronic information
- maintain and distribute up-to-date information regarding emerging solid waste issues and the efforts area communities are undertaking regarding Wisconsin's recycling laws and rules, and

WHEREAS the RUs desire to share and allocate costs of the Membership proportionately among themselves based upon the population and program participation level of each of the RUs, and

WHEREAS the RUs who are presently individual committee members, sponsors, and/or partners of SEWWRC do not intend to use this new Membership as a basis for reduction or elimination of their individual level of participation in SEWWRC, and

WHEREAS Section 66.0301(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes authorizes cooperation between municipalities and allows municipalities to contract with each other for the receipt or furnishing of services or the joint exercise of any power or duty required or authorized by law,

- 6. <u>Membership Coordination</u>. The RUs shall be jointly responsible for the coordination of the Membership, on the basis of equal voting rights for majority rule where each RU has one vote, and shall recommend such further agreements or contracts as may be necessary or advisable for the proper functioning of the Membership.
- 7. <u>Use, Operation and Maintenance.</u> The RUs shall from time to time enter into such agreements or contracts as may be necessary and required for the mutual use, operation and maintenance of the Membership in order to effectuate the purposes and objects of this Agreement.

### 8. Effective Date and Term of Agreement.

- (a) This Agreement becomes effective on that date by which all RUs have adopted this agreement. It terminates as of midnight on December 31, 2003 unless otherwise extended or terminated by the Membership.
- (b) Notwithstanding paragraph 8(a) above, an RU may terminate its participation in the agreement upon 30 days notice through approval of, and upon the date established by its governing body. Any RU terminating its participation under this paragraph shall not be entitled to reimbursement of any payments made by that RU under this agreement. Termination of its participation under this paragraph will not relieve any RU of its obligation to pay any payments invoiced prior to the date the RU's termination becomes effective.
- 9. <u>Non-receipt of Grant Funds.</u> If no grant funding is received by the RUs pursuant to the provisions of Section 287.235, Stats, and Wisconsin Administrative Code Section NR 549, this agreement shall terminate, and the RUs shall have no obligation to fund or participate in the Membership, and the Membership shall not be established with SEWWRC.
- 10. Ownership. It is understood that the RUs have joint ownership of any shared equipment and all rights, permits and licenses obtained in conjunction with the Membership and upon any termination of this Agreement by one or more of the RUs, but not all RUs, any and all right, title and interests in said equipment, permits, licenses or other property rights shall be automatically transferred to the non-terminating RUs. There will be no refund of any costs to any RU terminating the Agreement prior to expiration of the Membership. If all RUs terminate this Agreement, the equipment shall be disposed of in a manner to be negotiated by the RUs.
- 11. Evidence of Authorization by Governing Body. Each RU entering into this Agreement and participating in the Membership shall provide, in addition to proof of authorization to affix the signature or signatures below, an authorizing resolution, from its governing body of elected officials having the power to authorize such resolution, which resolution shall specifically authorize a representative of that RU to apply for financial assistance pursuant to the provisions of Section 287.235, Stats, and Wisconsin Administrative Code Section NR 549.

Funding Evaluation and Distribution: \$1,900,000 is anticipated to be available for distribution in calendar year 2003. Availability of funds in future grant years will be dependent on legislative appropriations.

### IT IS THEREFORE AGREED THAT:

- 1. <u>The Membership.</u> The RUs shall utilize the proceeds of the Grant to establish themselves, as a group, as a new "Full Partner" in SEWWRC prior to March 31, 2003, extending through December 31, 2003, pursuant to the rules and regulations of SEWWRC.
- 2. <u>Non-termination of individual Memberships.</u> Those RUs who are presently individual committee members, sponsors and/or partners of SEWWRC shall not utilize this new Membership as a basis for reduction or elimination of their existing and ongoing individual participation in SEWWRC in 2003; although subsequent rounds of REI grants may be used to cover such participation if available and this Agreement is amended to extend the Membership through such times—including Round 2 of REI grants whose application is anticipated in October, 2003.
- 3. **Proportionate Payments.** Each RU will pay, from the proceeds of the Grant, its Proportionate Share of the cost of the Membership, payable directly to SEWWRC, within 30 days of receipt of the Grant proceeds. For purposes of this Agreement, the Proportionate Share of any individual RU shall be a percentage calculated by dividing the population of the individual RU by the total population of all RUs participating in this Agreement. Each RU's proportionate payment is noted in their corresponding attached "Municipal Partnership Form" section on Basic Partnership, and collectively in Appendix One the "Combined Municipal Partnership Form" section on Basic Partnership.
- 4. <u>Additional Costs.</u> Any additional costs and/or payment arrangements which the MEMBERSHIP may consider obligating itself to shall be completely and totally optional on the part of each of the participating RU's. Payment for such optional arrangements shall be based upon a proportionate share calculation of only those RU's wishing to participate in such an arrangement.

No RU shall be obligated to make and/or cost share any additional payment to the MEMBERSHIP. Any and all additional arrangements which the MEMBERSHIP may make shall, if required, be funded exclusively by those RU's electing to partake in such arrangements.

Each RU's additional and optional costs are noted in their corresponding attached "Municipal Partnership Form" section on Menu of Services, and collectively in Appendix One the "Combined Municipal Partnership Form" section on Menu of Services. These additional and optional costs are payable by each RU within 30 days of the SEWWRC invoice to the RU for the corresponding service.

5. <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. Any and all liabilities, claims, violations, fines, penalties, forfeitures and suits, and all reasonable costs and expenses related thereto, including the cost of defense, settlement and reasonable attorney fees, which in any manner result from this Agreement or the operation of the Membership ("Liabilities") shall be borne by the RUs according to the Proportionate Share for each RU; except to the extent that any such Liabilities may in any manner result from or arise out of the sole act(s) or omission(s) of any such RU, its officers, agents, employees or authorized users of the Membership, whether by negligence or otherwise, in which case such RU agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other RUs from and against any and all such Liabilities.

- 6. <u>Membership Coordination</u>. The RUs shall be jointly responsible for the coordination of the Membership, on the basis of equal voting rights for majority rule where each RU has one vote, and shall recommend such further agreements or contracts as may be necessary or advisable for the proper functioning of the Membership.
