


Beverage licenses, pursuant to section 9.02(16) of the West Allis Revised Municipal Code and sections 125.17, 125.32(2), and 125.68(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes.


5. That on the application, in response to question number four, “Have you ever been TICKETED, ARRESTED, CONVICTED, or FINED for any violation(s) of Federal, State or City Laws (including felony, misdemeanor, civil and traffic offenses)?”, Albert Hernandez checked the box for “no” and did not list any offenses. See attached Exhibit 1.
6. That on the two previous applications that Albert Hernandez submitted for licenses, he checked the box for “no” on the same question. See attached Exhibit 2.
7. That a police background check of Albert Hernandez revealed on or about February 24, 1991; January 9, 1994; and June 1, 2012, Albert Hernandez did operate a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant, contrary to section 346.63(1)(A), Wis. Stats., and was subsequently convicted of said offenses.
8. That the conduct of Albert Hernandez described in paragraph 5-7 substantially relates to the alcohol beverage licensed activity contrary to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(5)(b), so as to disqualify Albert Hernandez from obtaining, keeping, or renewing a Class “I” Operator’s License.

WHEREFORE, Michael J. Czaplewski requests that Albert Hernandez be summoned to appear before the License and Health Committee of the West Allis Common Council to answer this complaint and, if the material allegations of the complaint are denied, that a hearing be held to determine whether the Operator's License issued to Albert Hernandez should be suspended, revoked or not renewed.
