Another reason is the residence of the area cannot even park near their house, either because there is a pool league going on, or his workers are told to park down the block and not take up his customers parking alongside the bar.


You know very well how difficult it is in the winter time when a heavy snow falls and a rescue vehicle needs to make access to one of the handicapped
