AB21/SB7 REVISIONS IN TERMINOLOGY THAT AFFECT MOBILE HOMES,

#### **AB55** QUALIFICATIONS OF NEWSPAPERS PERMITTED TO PUBLISH LEGAL NOTICES AND ALLOWING MAILING OF LEGAL NOTICES **INSTEAD OF PUBLISHING**

FAVOR, because the bill would provide municipalities with another less costly alternative for publication of required documents.

# SB29/AB76 INCREASING THE STATE IMPOSED RECYCLING FEE, ALSO KNOWN AS THE TIPPING FEE, ON THE DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE IN LANDFILLS
