1. <u>REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION</u>

AB601 <u>REVOKING, MODIFYING OR IMPOSING CONDITIONS ON</u> <u>CERTAIN APPROVALS</u> Refer to Scott Post.

AB620 <u>REQUIRING NOTICE TO PERSONS AFFECTED BY ZONING</u> <u>ACTIONS</u> OPPOSE, because the bill is not needed in that the City already notifies those affected of the proposed change and, further, that the bill would create unnecessary paperwork.

AB645 <u>REPEALING SMART GROWTH</u> Refer to John Stibal.

2. <u>REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION</u>

AB558/ LIMITING THE REASONS FOR WHICH A MUNICIPALITY MAY SB283 WITHHOLD A PERMIT

OPPOSE, because the bill interferes with local control.

SB258 <u>PUBLIC LIBRARY LOANING TO MINORS OF "R" RATED MOVIES</u>

OPPOSE, because the bill is unnecessary in that local libraries are already able to develop such policies as they locally determine to be what they want; further, the bill creates some constitutional law issues that could potentially cause significant legal costs.

AB561 <u>CARRYING OF CONCEALED WEAPONS BY OUT-OF-STATE AND</u> <u>RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS</u>

OPPOSE, because the bill requires additional training which would be very time consuming and costly; further, the bill would open up the City to potential large liability and legal costs for some retired officers' actions.

AB573 NARROWING OF BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION TAX EXEMPTION

FAVOR, because the bill would narrow the scope of eligibility for benevolent associations' tax exemptions related to residential housing, thus limiting the further loss of tax base to the City.

AB580 <u>EXPANDING THE PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR PROPERTY</u> <u>HELD IN TRUST FOR THE PUBLIC INTERESTS</u>

OPPOSE, because the bill would expand the tax exemptions of certain property, thus reducing the City's tax base.

AB590/
SB267PAYMENT OF ANNUITIES UNDER THE WIS. RETIREMENT SYSTEM
OPPOSE, because the bill would increase benefits and thus would increase
pension contribution costs for the City.

AB593 VARIOUS MODIFICATIONS TO HOUSING LOAN PROGRAMS AND LOAN GUARANTEE PROGRAMS, INCREASING THE BONDING AUTHORITY OF WHEDA, AND REMOVING LIMITATIONS ON WHEDA'S AUTHORITY TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY

FAVOR, because the bill would make the housing loan programs easier to use.

AB597 REMEDIES IN CERTAIN ACTIONS CONCERNING BUILDING CODE OR ZONING ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS OPPOSE, because the bill would make it difficult for the City to raze structures that need to be removed; further, the bill would increase City legal costs; finally, it interferes with local control.

2. <u>REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION Cont'd.</u>

AB598 DEATH BENEFITS PROVIDED UNDER THE WIS. RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION No position.

AB602 <u>EXEMPTING AN ASSESSOR AND AN ASSESSOR'S STAFF FROM</u> <u>LIABILITY FOR TRESPASSING</u>

FAVOR, because the bill would allow the Assessor's Office to perform its duties on property without worrying about trespassing, thus allowing for fair and equitable assessments overall.

SB254 RETIREMENT BENEFITS PROVIDED TO EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PERSONNEL UNDER THE WIS. RETIREMENT SYSTEM OPPOSE, because the bill would increase benefits and thus would increase

OPPOSE, because the bill would increase benefits and thus would increase pension contribution costs to the City.

SB272 ORGANIZATION AND FUNDING OF PUBLIC LIBRARIES AND PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEMS AND GRANTING RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY

FAVOR, because the bill would allow for the improvement of several aspects of library operations.

SB273 VARIOUS CHANGES TO THE STATUTES GOVERNING PUBLIC LIBRARIES

FAVOR, because the bill would allow for the improvement of several aspects of library operations.
