2. <u>REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION</u>

AB384 NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES

FAVOR, because the bill would allow NEV to cross state highways, which the State DOT never allows.

AB402 NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES

OPPOSE, because the bill would require the City to send any NEV ordinance to all other cities first for approval.

- AB406/ CHALLENGING BALLOTS OF ELECTORS AT VOTING PLACES
- SB272 OPPOSE, because the bill would potentially limit a legitimate challenge from being made on broader bases rather than just because the challenger may not live in that same ward.
- AB466/ EXPANDING THE RESTAURANT EXCEPTION TO LIQUOR LICENSE OUOTAS

OPPOSE, because the bill would allow a tavern license holder that begins as a restaurant to later change from that focus to a bar only without the City being able to take the license back.

- OPPOSE, because the bill would limit the City's ability to use credit history in promotion or hiring processes even when such financial information is relevant to the job duties of certain positions.
