SB224 PROCESS FOR DISCONTINUING STREETS

1. **REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION Cont'd.**

SB221 **CAMPAIGN FINANCING, DESIGNATIONS FOR THE WIS. ELECTION CAMPAIGN FUND BY INDIVIDUALS FILING STATE INCOME TAX RETURNS, CREATING A NONREFUNDABLE INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE PUBLIC INTEGRITY ENDOWMENT, CANDIDATE TIME ON PUBLIC BROADCASTING TELEVISION STATIONS AND PUBLIC ACCESS CHANNELS, STAFFING OF THE GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY BOARD; PROVIDING EXEMPTIONS FROM EMERGENCY RULE PROCEDURES; GRANTING RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES**

SB208 **REGULATION OF PERSONS WHO SELL DOGS OR OPERATE ANIMAL SHELTERS OR ANIMAL CONTROL FACILITIES, GRANTING RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY**

2. **REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION**

AB75 **BUDGET BILL**
OPPOSE and therefore request change on the following:

- a.) Joint & Several Liability threshold (20%) should be kept at 51%.
- b.) Require liability insurance for all drivers.
- c.) Request change in ERP limit floor of "0%" to allow for carryover of unused CPI amount.
- d.) Retirement Homes for the Aged – Oppose the 160% average value exemption; reduce down to something more reasonable (100%).
- e.) Police & Fire (Emergency Services) Maintenance of Effort Spending Limit should be defined and limited to General Fund expenditures only.
- f.) Oppose the provision in Motion 743-31 that would allow free beer and wine to be provided at a non-profit fundraising event.


AB243 **COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING DEADLINE EXTENSION
FAVOR.**

SB182 **STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR INTENTIONAL TORTS**
OPPOSE, because the bill would extend the time frame for intentional torts from two years to three years, which is extremely too long.

SB196 **TIME WITHIN WHICH A COMPLAINT MAY BE FILED OR A CIVIL
ACTION MAY BE BROUGHT ALLEGING A VIOLATION OF THE
FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE LAW AND THE PROCEDURES
GOVERNING AN APPEAL**
OPPOSE, because the bill would extend the State FMLA time off, which would cost the City additional money, time off, and lost productivity for its employees.
