The following is a summary of reported incidents involving licensed businesses, including reported tavern violations and calls for police service during the month of March.

## Incident reports:

Case #16-9429, 03/14/2016, 0057 hrs: 8812 W Greenfield Av – Stallis Palace

On 03/14/2016, an Officer was flagged down by a citizen reporting an intoxicated female leaving the Stallis Palace Tavern in a Honda Civic. She was located and found to be intoxicated. She was uncooperative and refused to perform field sobriety tests, as well as, she refused to provide an evidentiary breath sample for the intoximeter. The female was arrested for 1<sup>st</sup> Offense Operating while Intoxicated. The witness had been working at Stallis Palace and stated based on his experience; he knew the female was not safe to drive a car based on how drunk she was.

Case #16-10271, 03/20/2016, 0153 hrs: 5906 W. Burnham St. – Drunken Duck

On 03/20/2016, Officers were flagged down in the 5900 blk of W. Burnham for a bar fight. Investigation revealed a fight between multiple parties began inside the Drunken Duck. The fight continued in the middle of the street in front of the bar. A female was struck in the head with a tire iron one time. She was taken to Froedtert and sustained a contusion and a laceration to the top of her head, which required stitches. Numerous citations were issued.

## Tobacco and Alcohol Compliance checks:

• Case #16-10937

An Officer conducted a tobacco compliance check at twelve randomly selected West Allis businesses that have a license to sell tobacco products. The check was completed through the use of a seventeen year old female, who attempted to purchase tobacco products without identification. The tobacco products included bot h cigarettes and e-cigarette products. All businesses asked the juvenile for identification and refused to sell.
