1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

SB520 REQUIRING MUNICIPALITIES TO PAY HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS FOR SURVIVORS OF A FIRE FIGHTER WHO DIES IN LINE OF DUTY
OPPOSE, because the bill is another unfunded State mandate eliminating local control.

SB532 CREATING NEW SHARED REVENUE FORMULA FOR DISTRIBUTING NEW DOLLARS ADDED TO THE PROGRAM IN THE FUTURE
FAVOR, because the bill encourages regional cooperation in economic development.

SB521 TAX INCENTIVES FOR MANUFACTURING AND USING ELECTRIC VEHICLES**
OPPOSE, because the bill would further reduce the property tax base shifting a greater share to the other remaining taxpayers.

SB483 PROHIBITING HEALTH PLANS FROM DENYING COVERAGE TO PERSONS INJURED AS A RESULT OF ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION
OPPOSE, because the bill would be another unfunded State mandate eliminating local control.


AB703 CORRECTING ERRORS IN EQUALIZED VALUE
FAVOR, because the bill would allow the DOR to make equalized value corrections in the year they occur.

SB522 WORKERS COMPENSATION LAW CHANGES**

SB469 AUTHORITY OF THE PSC OVER CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS UTILITIES, TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS CHARGES, UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND CONTRIBUTIONS BASED ON INTERCONNECTED VOICE OVER INTERNET PROTOCOL SERVICE, TANDEM SWITCHING PROVIDER ELECTRONIC CALL RECORDS, GRANTING RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION
FAVOR, because the bill would make changes that ensure universal access and call record availability (amend to include that all telecom companies must give up their phone lists to cities for public safety/reverse 911 use).
