

#### 1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

SB520 REQUIRING MUNICIPALITIES TO PAY HEALTH INSURANCE

PREMIUMS FOR SURVIVORS OF A FIRE FIGHTER WHO DIES IN

LINE OF DUTY

OPPOSE, because the bill is another unfunded State mandate eliminating local

control.

SB532 CREATING NEW SHARED REVENUE FORMULA FOR

DISTRIBUTING NEW DOLLARS ADDED TO THE PROGRAM IN THE

**FUTURE** 

FAVOR, because the bill encourages regional cooperation in economic

development.

AB712/ TAX INCENTIVES FOR MANUFACTURING AND USING ELECTRIC

SB521 VEHICLES

OPPOSE, because the bill would further reduce the property tax base shifting a

greater share to the other remaining taxpayers.

AB755 ENERGY EFFICIENCY GRANTS AND LOANS

SB548/ PLACEMENT OF CONVICTED SEX OFFENDERS IN COMMUNITIES

AB732 AGE AT WHICH A PERSON WHO IS ALLEGED TO HAVE VIOLATED

JURISDICTION RATHER THAN JUVENILE COURT JURISDICTION,

AB703 CORRECTING ERRORS IN EQUALIZED VALUE

FAVOR, because the bill would allow the DOR to make equalized value

corrections in the year they occur.

AB706/ WORKERS COMPENSATION LAW CHANGES

SB469 AUTHORITY OF THE PSC OVER CERTAIN

TELECOMMUNICATIONS UTILITIES, TELECOMMUNICATIONS
