The City of West Allis issued a raze order for Pressed Steel Tank. The city has listed "136 code violations" claiming the building is and "eye sore", and "unfit for human habitation".

These violations did not seem to become and issue until Pressed Steel decided not to relocate. Pressed Steel Tank did consider other locations in the Milwaukee area, but found it was not an option economically, or in housing the equipment.

Why is the city so set on getting rid of a working business? Other more enlightened cities are giving grants and loans to attract well paying manufacturing jobs.

Pressed Steel has been an excellent part of the business community for over 100 yrs. The years of tax paying support are meaningless. Our Union scale family supporting jobs are no longer welcome, instead the city would like to demolish the buildings and put up a Jewel-Osco. There is a Pick-N-Save adjacent to this property.

There are many vacant store fronts in West Allis. Property across the street formally housed a Kohls Food store. Next to it an empty Builders Square. Down the road an empty Sams Club. All of which have been vacant for sometime.

Does the city realize the demolition of Pressed Steel could result in the destruction of approximately 125 JOBS? We choose to work here and feel it is a safe place to work and fit for "human habitation". Some workers are close to retirement, others are recent home buyers. A few are single parents with little or no other means of financial support.

Mayor Bell Cl: Stibal Schaer Will the city supply us with jobs with incomes and benefits we are accustomed too?

The city should be granting a low interest city loans to repair these relatively minor cosmetic repairs.

Work with us, not against us!

Bottom line. We are a group of hard working, family supporting, tax paying people that would like to keep our jobs.
