## REVIEW BY CITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF DEPARTMENT REQUESTS TO FILL POSITION VACANCIES

This form should be attached to your memorandum to me when a position vacancy is requested to be filled. Responses to the questions noted below are sufficient for review purposes. (Information to answer question no. 8 is available from me.)

Upon receipt of this form, I immediately send it to the members of the Administration & Finance Committee. They have five (5) working days to contact me with any objections, concerns, or questions. Upon expiration of the five days, I will notify you in writing that the request has been approved and the vacancy can be filled. If there are questions, please call.

1. Position Title: Plumbing Inspector II

2. Department/Division: Building Inspections & Neighborhood Services

3. Vacancy Date: November 30, 2011

4. Vacancy Reason: Retirement

- 5. a. What are the specific work responsibilities of the position?

  To enforce and inspect for compliance of State and Local plumbing codes.
  - b. How many other such positions exist in this Department? There are no other plumbing inspectors in the Department.
- 6. What are the reasons why the position must be filled? State and local codes require permits and inspection of plumbing work. Inspection provides for a healthy and sanitary living environment.
- 7. What will be the impacts on service functions if the position were not filled?
  - a. Service to the Public. Records indicate the City issues approximately 800-900 plumbing permits per year which require inspection. Inspections require timely and sometimes immediate inspections within hours (i.e., open trenches). Also, plumbing permits need to be approved and issued daily. Property owner construction projects could be delayed. Plumbing Contractors would be without proper services.
  - b. Service to the Staff. The plumbing inspector averages over 2,100 inspections per year. The plumbing division is assisted by one clerical (+/- 50% time). A plumbing inspector is a required position. Staff could not manage Plumbing Inspector duties.
- 8. What is the fiscal impact related to filling this vacancy?

The Plumbing Inspector II salary range is \$57,428 to \$64,667 per year.

9. Remarks/Comments:

Currently, the budget allows for a part-time Plumbing Inspector who fills in during vacation and other periods. Additionally, Bob Johnson, Building Inspector II, who has plumbing journeyman certification, also fills in in a case of emergency and/or as necessary.
