Now comes the Plaintiff, Isaiah McVey, by his attorneys, the Law Offices of Benske, Gatzke McFadden & Rose, by Attorney John D. Gatzke, and alleges and complains as follows:

- 1. That the Plaintiff, Isaiah McVey ("McVey"), is an adult resident of the State of Wisconsin, currently residing at 6616 West Montana Avenue in the City and County of Milwaukee.
- 2. That the Defendant, City of West Allis, is a Wisconsin body politic, with its principal offices located at 7525 West Greenfield Avenue in the City of West Allis and County of Milwaukee.
- 3. That, with respect to Defendant City of West Allis, all required conditions precedent have been complied with prior to the filing of this action, namely that Notice of Injury pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 893.80(1d)(a) and (1p), and Notice of Claim pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 893.80(1d)(b) were properly and

- timely served upon the City of West Allis. The City of West Allis disallowed the claim on January 1, 2024, although it is unclear as to what date the Notice of Disallowance was served on the Plaintiff, if at all.
- 4. That Defendant, ABC Insurance Company, is a fictitious entity as that term is defined in Section 807.12, Wis. Stats., and upon information and belief was at all times pertinent hereto, an insurance company licensed to issue liability insurance policies in the State of Wisconsin; at all of the times pertinent hereto said defendant had in full force and effect a policy or policies of liability insurance coverage issued to the Defendant, the City of West Allis.
- 5. That, on August 18, 2023, police officers employed by the City of West Allis conducted a traffic stop of the Plaintiff.
- 6. That, upon information and belief, the Defendant did not have probable cause nor reasonable suspicion to conduct said traffic stop.
- 7. That, during the process of the traffic stop, one City of West Allis police officer pulled his squad car around and struck the Plaintiff's vehicle with it. Shortly thereafter, a separate City of West Allis police officer struck the rear of the Plaintiff's vehicle with a separate squad car.
- 8. That, after striking the Plaintiff's vehicle, and without probable cause nor reasonable suspicion to do so, City of West Allis police officer forcibly removed the Plaintiff from his vehicle, causing further damage to the Plaintiff's vehicle and also causing personal injury to the Plaintiff.
- 9. That the City of West Allis is liable for the conduct, acts and omissions of its employees under the theory of respondent superior.

- 10. That, the City of West Allis police officers conducting the traffic stop causing Plaintiff's injuries breached certain ministerial duties during the traffic stop. and were also otherwise negligent in causing the Plaintiff's injuries and damages.
- 11. That, as a result of the Defendants' negligence and breach of ministerial duties owed to the Plaintiff and to the general public, Plaintiff sustained personal injuries and property damage.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff demands judgment against defendants as follows:

- a. For recovery of all medical expenses incurred to date and for a determination and award of all future medical costs related to the matter herein.
- b. For recovery of all loss due to earnings incapacity incurred to date and for a determination and award of all future loss due to earnings incapacity related to the matter herein.
- c. For an award of compensation for all pain and suffering, disability, humiliation and embarrassment, and loss of enjoyment of life incurred to date and for an award of compensation for future pain and suffering, disability, humiliation and embarrassment, and loss of enjoyment of life related to the matter herein.
- d. For recovery of all property damages or losses incurred to date.
- e. For all such other relief as determined by the Court to be appropriate.
- For judgment determining the subrogation rights, if any, of the Involuntary Plaintiffs and medical care providers.
- g. For recovery of all costs and disbursements of this action as provided by law.
