1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

AB21/SB7

REVISIONS IN TERMINOLOGY THAT AFFECT MOBILE HOMES, MANUFACTURED HOMES, ETC., AND CHANGES THAT APPLY TO MONTHLY FEES COLLECTED BY CERTAIN LOCAL

GOVERNMENTAL UNITS

AB25

APPLIES TRAFFIC LAWS AND OTHER RULES OF THE ROAD TO PRIVATE ROADS WITHIN MOBILE HOME PARKS

OPPOSE, because the bill is unnecessary since towns can already incorporate as municipalities under current State law.

ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS

OPPOSE, because the bill would take the Police & Fire Commission's disciplinary authority out of its hands and give it to an outside arbitrator.

FAVOR, because the bill would provide municipalities with another less costly alternative for publication of required documents.
