As you know, on an annual basis each school crossings is evaluated to determine the safest route for elementary school children to walk to and from school. Some of the factors taken into consideration for the placement of a school crossing guard are listed below:

- Traffic patterns and visibility problems
- The presence of heavy trucking or mass transportation
- Traffic control devices, speed limits and difficulty in crossing the street
- The number of children using the crossings (according to guidelines established by the West Allis Safety Commission at least 30 children must utilize a crossing during any given crossing period)

Over the last several years, many school crossings throughout the city have been eliminated. Before any crossing was eliminated we discussed the situation with the alderman and school principals. The parents of the children who use the crossing were notified through school newsletters, informational flyers distributed by the crossing guards and if practical a phone call. Everything possible was done to find safe alternate ways to school for the children involved. In several situations this involved the parents driving their young children to school, until they felt their child was ready to walk by themselves.

In September, we eliminated 5 school crossings including the two crossing guards located at the off ramp and on ramp for I894 at W. Lincoln Ave. At your request, a crossing guard was placed back at the on ramp and a student count was conducted from October 7th through November 5th. During this time period there was an average of 6 children in the morning and 5 in the afternoon.

For your review, I have enclosed the student count from this location and the fall student count totals from locations throughout the city. You will notice that several of these locations do not meet the minimum requirements on the number of students as established by the Safety Commission. However, because of the other criteria involved we feel that crossing guards at these locations should be maintained.

Should you decide to reinstate the crossing guard at the on ramp for I894 at W. Lincoln Ave. please include the necessary funding (\$3,000) in our 2005 budget. If you have any questions, or need further clarification please call me at 302-8017 or Lieutenant Rob Navarrette at 302-8125.
