information and reduce revenue through fewer charge-backs and less interest.

2. **REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION Con'td.**

**AB79 RELEASE OF PERSONS WHO COMMIT OWI OFFENSES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES**  
FAVOR, because the bill could possibly reduce offenses and repeat offenders due to the new procedures and higher penalties.

3. **OTHER**

- **State Budget Update.** Joint Finance Committee eliminated 45 non-fiscal policy items from Governor's proposed budget, including five (5) items of interest to municipalities. Four (4) other non-policy items of interest to municipalities remain in the budget bill.
- **Update on List of Legislative Ideas Submitted to our Three State Legislators.** Several calls from Rep. Staskunas' office on questions about our ideas and how the State drafters are preparing the proposed new bills.
- Preliminary notification of new bill from Alliance of Cities on behalf of the City of Milwaukee proposals to increase penalties for hit and run crashes.
