The following is a synopsis of reported incidents involving licensed businesses, including reported tavern violations and calls for police service for the month of March 2009.

Police report incidents involving licensed businesses:

Tavern reports:

Case 09-001959, 03/07/09 at 0219hrs, 1900 S 60 St., Mario's Bar

While on routine patrol an officer observed a vehicle pull up in front of Mario's Bar and an altercation ensued between a female driving the vehicle and another female standing in front of the vehicle. Through investigation it was learned the driver of the vehicle who was 20 years old was in Mario's and had an altercation with the boyfriend of the other female involved. The twenty year old stated that she is a regular at the tavern and was not asked for identification. A check of her showed no other identification on her person. She was written a citation for Underage person entering a licensed establishment. Mario Morgese the owner and agent of the bar was issued a citation for permitting underage person to remain on licensed premises.

Case 09-003096, 03/12/09 at 1053hrs, 6201 W Mitchell St., HD Hideout

Officers responded to a call of a fight involving three females at HD Hideout. The complainant was a bartender at the tavern. Two females were arrested for Disorderly Conduct for attacking another female patron. One of the parties was also cited for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Case 09-002155, 03/14/09 at 0236hrs, 8900 W Greenfield Ave., Larry Michael's Tavern

Officers responded to a call of fight in the parking lot at Larry Michael's Tavern. The altercation started over an accident, which led to an arrest for Operating While Intoxicated. At one point during the altercation, a patron of the tavern assaulted the party eventually arrested for OWI. The bartender and bouncer of the tavern came out to the lot and broke up the fight.

Tobacco and Alcohol Compliance checks:

On 03/14/09 an Officer of the West Allis Police Department conducted a Tobacco Compliance check at 13 businesses throughout the city of West Allis. All 13 of the businesses were in compliance.
