OPPOSE, because the bill would force the City to consider an applicant that may

not be appropriate for hiring in the public sector.

2. <u>REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION</u>

AB724/ CREATING AN AMBULANCE OPERATOR CERTIFICATION

SB518 PROGRAM

OPPOSE, because the bill is unnecessary regulation by the State of an ambulance training and safety program that the City is already thoroughly doing. The bill also provides no funding to cover the City costs and is therefore another unfunded State mandate.

SB537 TEMPORARY CLASS B PICNIC WINE LICENSES

OPPOSE, because the bill would increase the number of such licenses and therefore encourages more drinking. In addition, the very small \$10 fee is inadequate in covering the new administrative costs the City would incur.

AB732 AGE AT WHICH A PERSON WHO IS ALLEGED TO HAVE VIOLATED A CRIMINAL LAW, A CIVIL LAW, OR A MUNICPAL ORDINANCE IS SUBJECT TO CIRCUIT COURT OR MUNICIPAL COURT JURISDICTION RATHER THAN JUVENILE COURT JURISDICTION, ETC.

OPPOSE, because the bill would force the municipal court to become a collection agency for the State and create more work for the administrative staff.

SB523 UNFAIR LABOR PRACTICES IN VIOLATION OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING RIGHTS

AB612 ACCESS TO AUDIO RECORDINGS OF 911 CALLS

OPPOSE, because the bill would be another unfunded State mandate, thus eliminating local decision making in this regard; the bill is also poorly written and not clearly thought out.
