The 2025 Adult Summer Reading Program had slightly fewer registered readers this year, but the number of readers who logged roughly matched those from last year and the percentage of readers who logged was up, 69 percent compared with 63 percent. The number of readers who completed the program, reading at least 10 books between June and early September, was almost exactly the same as last year.

This year we ordered packets of mini colored pencils with the library logo and paired them with mini coloring pages to tie into the theme "Color Our World." We gave these away to anyone reading five books. Plus, a few readers received two tickets to the Milwaukee Art Museum in the envelopes with their coloring pages. When readers completed the program, they picked a book to keep.

The program and prizes were much like last year's. Readers could use tickets earned for a chance at grand prizes called The Outdoor Cook, with a cookbook and decorative platters; The Hiker, with a guidebook to Wisconsin state parks and a head lamp; and The Crafter, with origami paper and books with step-by-step instructions. The popularity of the grand prizes was spread pretty evenly among the prize options this year.
