In accordance with Section 66.0309(10) of the Wisconsin Statutes, the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission is hereby providing to you a certified copy of the SEWRPC Amendment to the Natural Areas and Critical Species Habitat Protection and Management Plan for the Southeastern Wisconsin Region. A copy of Commission Resolution No. 2010-19 adopting this plan as a guide for the physical development of the Region is bound in the front of this report. The report documents an amendment to an important element of the evolving comprehensive plan for the physical development of the Region—a plan for the long-term protection of natural areas, critical species habitats, and significant geological sites for the seven-county Southeastern Wisconsin Region.
