RE: Recommendation for East Side Police Satellite Facility

Dear Mayor Bell and Members of the Common Council:

In January, Mayor Bell established a Task Force to find a permanent location for a police satellite station. The committee was comprised of elected officials, police department employees, other city department heads, citizens and business owners from throughout the community. Three meetings were held during February and March.

At the first meeting, the committee reviewed background information and discussed the need for this facility. Based upon that information, copies of which are attached, the Task Force was unanimous in its judgment that an east side Police Satellite Facility is required. The Task Force, particularly its citizen members, were equally clear the facility should be "built right." Location was the subject of much of the work of the Task Force. The committee determined that in addition to meeting proven policing needs, a suitable facility on the east end or central city would add to the needed perception that all of West Allis is a safe place to live and work. The value of this perception, which we believe to be fact, cannot be underestimated. A sub-committee was established and directed to view specific properties in the area of the West Allis Towne Center and report back at the next meeting.

The sub-committee met and viewed four properties. Although these properties were approximately the right size, they were some distance from a main street. This would present major problems for police squads leaving to respond to emergency calls for service. Another problem the sub-committee noted was obtaining a permanent connection to the Police Department computer system. This information was presented to the Task Force.

Finally, the Task Force determined that in the event the Common Council chooses to address community policing needs on the east end and central city, a permanent facility should be located on West National Ave. between 66th and 76th Streets. A facility in this location would be ideal for the police officers that patrol the central and eastern part of the city. Several possible locations were discussed; some areas were immediately discounted because of future redevelopment plans. After a lengthy discussion, the Task Force focused its attention on a city-owned parking lot located on the south side of National Ave. just east of the Library. This was the only city owned land which could accommodate both a suitable building and necessary ancillary parking. No specific building size was recommended, although size estimates ranged from 1000 to 1500 square feet. A suitable building would include: three work stations, an interview room, a storage room, rest rooms and adequate space for booking prisoners. Discussion was had regarding a meeting room. It was felt that a small room, or a room as part of a multi-purpose, would be desirable. This should accommodate meetings of 15 - 20 people. Any larger meeting could be handled at the library, fire administration building or health department.

The committee was quite concerned about costs, especially since the city is more likely than not facing substantial reductions in state share revenue. It was felt by most that the satellite facility would in fact ameliorate some of the negatives associated with budget constraints. For instance, if the city is to do more with less, then it should consider steps, which would take the greatest advantage of current assets. A suitable satellite facility would enhance policing in the east end and central city, and would do so in a most economical way. The Chief of Police related that the establishment of a suitable satellite facility would not require additional staffing, but would allow for enhanced policing throughout the city, and specifically on the east end and central city.

At our last meeting, John Stibal reported the size of this property as approximately 31 feet wide by 116 feet deep. He provided a highly preliminary estimate of the cost of the facility to be in the range of \$100,000 and \$200,000. This would be dependent upon the size of the building and form of construction. It is our recommendation that a police satellite facility, which will meet not just the current, but the future needs of our community be built on this property. We certainly realize that there are unanswered questions regarding this proposed facility. These include the contents of the facility and how and when it will be built and paid for. To this end, we request that the Police and Fire Commission and Common Council approve this proposal in concept. We further request that the Council direct the appropriate city staff to prepare formal and precise plans and costs estimates for consideration by the Common Council.

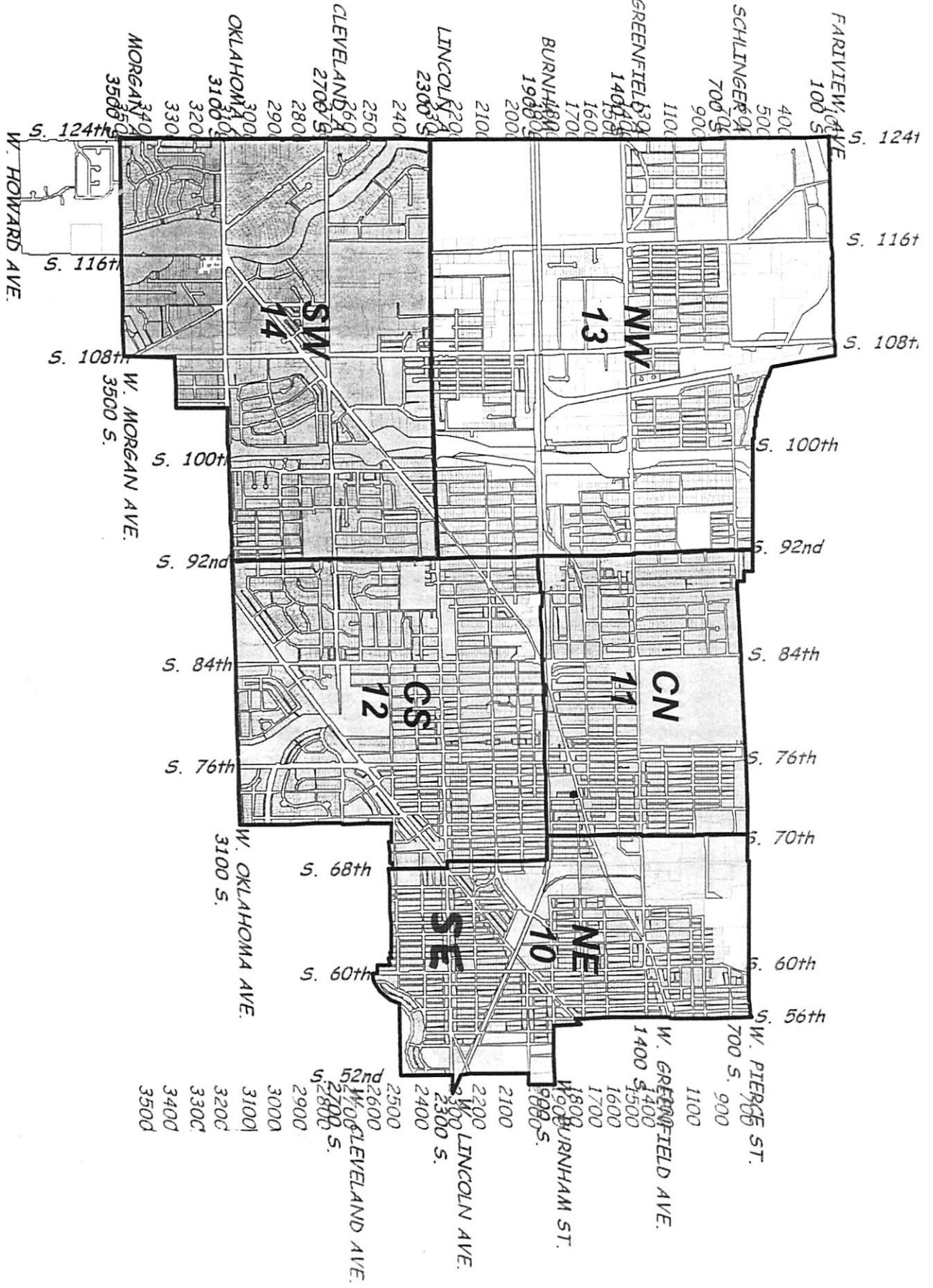
