#### 2. **REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION**

MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGMENT REGARDING COMMUNITY **AB684**/

**SB407** SERVICE WORK

> FAVOR, because the bill would save time for the Municipal Court and allow community service as a first option.

**AB669** ASSIGNMENT OF EARNINGS TO PAY MUNICIPAL COURT

**JUDGMENT** 

FAVOR, because the bill would help the Municipal Court with collections.

ACCESS TO UTILITY SECURITY PLANS **AB673** 

> FAVOR, because the bill would broaden the ability of cities to obtain receiverships for abatement of residential nuisances.

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY A PERSON REQUIRED TO REGISTER SB382

AS A SEX OFFENDER

FAVOR, because the bill would help reduce crime by making certain information of sex offenders available to the Police Department.

DISCLOSURE OF JUVENILE COURT RECORDS TO OTHER COURTS, **AB676** 

> LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, DISTRICT ATTORNEYS AND OTHER PROSECUTORS, AND AGENCIES PROVIDING SERVICES TO

A JUVENILE COURT AND PROVIDING A PENALTY

FAVOR, because the bill would be useful to the Police Department because it would allow quicker investigations and the collection of information. It would also give prosecutors and municipal courts easier and quicker access to records.

## AB702 PROHIBITING MUNICIPALITIES FROM RESTRICTING THE

OPPOSE, because the bill would prevent cities from enforcing any sex offender placement/resident ordinances and eliminate municipal autonomy on this matter, thus preventing the City from ensuring that offenders do not live near public places where children are.

AB690 HARASSMENT OF A PERSON WHO IS PART OF A NEIGHBORHOOD
