AB578 MANDATING LOCAL GOVERNMENTS USE CERTAIN GREEN

CLEANING SUPPLIES AND PAPER PRODUCTS

SB458 LOCAL REGULATION OF TICKET SCALPING

AB661 CHANGING CERTAIN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES UNDER

THE TAX INCREMENTAL FINANCING LAW

FAVOR, because the bill would eliminate a state imposed restriction on local government budget decision-making.

SB466 AUTHORIZING THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF

INSURANCE TO REGULATE MUNICIPAL SELF-INSURED HEALTH

PLANS

OPPOSE, because the bill would create unnecessary, burdensome, and unreasonable state regulation over local government self-insurance plan decision-making.

SB447 STATE CONTRACTUAL SERVICES AND FALSE CLAIMS

SUBMITTED TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, REQUIRING THE EXERCISE OF RULE-MAKING AUTHORITY, AND PROVIDING

PENALTIES

2. REVIEW OF REFERRED LEGISLATION

AB414 REQUIREMENTS FOR A CERTIFICATE OF FOOD PROTECTION

PRACTICES AND PROVIDING AN EXEMPTION FROM EMERGENCY

RULE PROCEDURES

FAVOR, because the bill revises state statutes in a favorable way in streamlining a food operator's recertification requirements.

SB426/ FEES FOR PUBLIC RECORDS MAINTAINED BY CONTRACTORS

AB638 No position.

AB630 ENFORCEMENT OF THE CITIZENSHIP QUALIFICATION FOR

VOTING IN ELECTIONS IN THIS STATE

AB609/ VACATION OF ARBITRATION AWARD

SB436 OPPOSE, because the bill would unfavorably narrow the standard for local

government on arbitration awards.

SB430 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING ON HEALTH CARE

FAVOR, because the bill would provide local government more flexibility in changing health insurance plans.

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AB559/ NOTICE OF FIREARM PROHIBITION WHEN SERVED WITH NOTICE SB381 OF AN INJUNCTION HEARING AND PROCESS FOR SURRENDERING

FIREARMS FOLLOWING THE GRANTING OF CERTAIN

INJUNCTIONS

FAVOR, because the bill would aid the Police Dept. in firearm protection during serving and processing.

AB518/ REPORTING LOST OR STOLEN FIREARMS

SB367 FAVOR, because the bill would provide the Police Dept. an additional tool in

tracking down lost or stolen firearms.

AB473/ FEES FROM RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS SEEKING

SB376 TO CARRY CONCEALED WEAPONS AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION

No position.

AB474/ CARRYING CONCEALED WEAPONS BY LAW ENFORCEMENT

SB377 OFFICERS AND BY RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

No position.

SB334 THROWING OR EXPELLING A BODILY SUBSTANCE AT A PUBLIC

SAFETY WORKER AND PROVIDING A PENALTY

FAVOR, because the bill would make police officers safer by prohibiting throwing or expelling bodily substances at them.

SB374 CDL LICENSING EXCEPTION FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

No position.

SB395 PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMS OF POLICE CANDIDATES

FAVOR, because the bill would require psychological evaluations for police making those hired better officers.

SB383 MUNICIPAL COURT ELECTIONS, JUDGES, AND PROCEDURE, AND

PROVIDING PENALTIES
