1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

AB417 PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS; RETAINAGE

OPPOSE, because the bill would reduce the City's ability to effectively manage

construction contracts.

AB164 DRIVER IMPROVEMENT SURCHARGE

FAVOR, because the bill would provide funding to the City to help law

enforcement prevent alcohol and drug related crimes.

AB419 UNPAID TOWING AND STORAGE CHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH

PARKING TICKETS

AB338 EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION; AGE

AB371 TEMPORARY ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE; CATERER

OPPOSE, because the bill provides no limitation on the ability of caterers to basically have "roving" taverns.

AB365 MUNICIPAL COURT; COLLECTION OF FORFEITURES AND

ASSESSMENTS

FAVOR, because the bill would allow for proration of collection costs for the municipal court.

SB180 PUBLIC UTILITY; SHARED REVENUE AND DISTRIBUTION
